



YOUR COUNTY COMISSIONER

SAVE MONEY ON YOUR REAL ESTATE TAXES:

Last year my fellow county commissioners and I voted to approve an additional savings you can apply for regarding your real estate taxes. The requirements to save additional money are as follows: 1. Your condo must be your "homestead." It must be registered with the county as your homestead. 2. You must be 65 years of age and older. 3. Your combined income must be \$28,800 or less. However, you do not have to include your income from social security toward the \$28,800. For more information, you can contact my office at 954-357-7002 or the Property Appraiser's Office at 954-357-6830.

FOR NEW WYNMOOR RESIDENTS:

Elections for local, county, state and federal office will be held next year. If you have not registered to vote, we are happy to get you the proper paperwork. Please call my county commission office at 954-357-7002.

A NEW SCAM BEING AIMED AT WYNMOOR RESIDENTS:

You get a phone call and the person on the phone claims to be from the IRS. You are told that the IRS has not received your tax return and unless you send money in the next two days, you will be arrested. Or, you receive a phone call from someone claiming to be from your local bank. You are told that someone is using your credit card without authority and the person is asking you personal questions to get confidential information from you. Or, you get a letter or email from someone promising you money if you assist them. All of these scams are interested in only one thing and that is getting your money or credit card information. REMEMBER, the IRS or your bank will not call you and ask you to send money or ask you for information.

NEW TOWING LAWS ARE NOW IN EFFECT

I am happy to inform you that I introduced new laws that involve the towing of vehicles. When a car is towed without the consent of the owner, the towing company now has to take pictures of all four sides of the car before the car is towed. Many times people would claim that their car suffered damage in the towing company's lot or after the car is towed. The towing company is required to save the pictures for more than one year. Also, if your car is towed and the towing company refuses to take your credit card or claims their credit card machine is broken, you are entitled to get your car out of the towing lot for free.



results.

Public Radio, 93.1 FM, is my station of choice. I tuned in after leaving his office. It was like an epiphany, an omen... "and now we will continue with our Dr. Seuss discussion." The host was interviewing Raymond Hamel who apparently critiqued much of Seuss' works. To my amazement they were discussing *GREEN EGGS AND HAM*.

Good grief! This had to be an epiphany I thought.

Hamel described the plot. Sam I Am, the main character, tries to get his friend to try green eggs and ham.

I thought to myself, I'm that guy, that's me! The only difference, and it's really not that different, I won't eat them regardless of the color.

Hamel continued:

Sam's friend insisted:

"I will not eat them in the rain

I do not like them on a train

I do not like them in a box

I will not eat them with a fox,,."

It wasn't *GONE WITH THE WIND*, but it was something I could relate to. I lost the radio reception at a critical time. How did the story end?

I did the next best thing and called my grandson Noah. "Sure Pop Pop, I read it, Sam gets his friend to try it and he likes it very much, do you want me to read it to you?"

"Not now Noah...love you...bye."

I kept my appointment with Friedrich.

Wednesdays followed Wednesdays... session followed session. Searching for the root cause. Back, back, back... analysis... nightmares... elliptical objects rolling toward me... yellow chicken embryos... all consuming... yellow eggs... green eggs...

"You mentioned age seventeen...what happened at age seventeen?" Friedrich looked up from his writing pad. "What happened!"?

I even invited her to dinner at my house in order for her to meet my parents. Unfortunately my grandmother was there also. The next day my grandmother said the following to me, "This girl is going to be lots of trouble for you! Do yourself a favor and get rid of her. She's 'not our kind' and I hope you realize what I mean!" My grandmother never liked me or anything about me so I ignored her.

So Sharon (not her real name) and I continued to carry on our love affair and went steady for almost 4 years until this happened: Sharon along with her friends went to Coney Island one summer day. This guy, Vito Panzarelli (not his real name) started to talk to her. Apparently he went home and told his father he met a girl who he has to marry. "Dad please pull all the strings possible to make this happen for me." Apparently Mr. Panzarelli didn't have to pull too many strings. Almost one year later to the day out on Long Island at the Panzarelli home with almost 300 guests in attendance and with about 30 FBI agents outside the grounds taking pictures of all the arriving guests, the love of my life married Vito Panzarelli. Unlike my articles that you can find only in the Wynmoor "Insider" newspaper the wedding of the now Sharon Panzarelli was front page news in the "New York Daily Mirror", "The New York Post" and the "The New York Daily News". To this very day I strongly suspect that my grandmother and the Senior Mr. Panzarelli somehow or other joined forces to make sure that I finally got the point that neither one of them

believed, for me anyway that "THIS GIRL IS NOT OUR (MY) KIND!" I never saw Sharon again!!

So yes the 50's were a wonderful time in which to grow up but like any other time in one's life the reality is that unfortunately it could deliver its fair share of misery also!

My Afghan Friend

Afghanistan has been in the news for the past decade but before that was unknown to most Americans. But not to me. When I was about ten years old, my family had lived in a semi-detached home in Brooklyn, New York. The house was one in a row of about twenty similar homes all heated at that time with a coal-fired furnace. This required feeding coal several times per day as well as removal of the ashes and bringing them curbside for removal each morning. To perform this laborious task the homeowners hired a 'janitor" who would regularly perform this service for most of the homes on the block. He would go from house to house each day to laboriously fuel the heating systems and keep the homes warm.

Our janitor was a man of about sixty years of age. He had come from Afghanistan and his English language was minimal. He was called Mr. Shah. Mr. Shah had no family with him. He lived in the basement of one of the homes he serviced and was a quiet dependable worker. He seemed to have no friends and there was no social contact between him and his employers except when he was paid his small monthly salary.

One day Mr. Shah approached me to ask me whether I could write a letter for him to his family or friends in Afghanistan. I agreed and accompanied him to his basement residence. I quickly learned that he was illiterate and this was not unusual for Afghans. His full name was said Mohammed Zaman Shah and that he did have family somewhere in Afghanistan. He never did say why he lived here alone several thousand miles from his kinfolk. Nor did he say who would translate his letter back in Afghanistan. I dutifully wrote out his dictated words and he thanked me for my efforts. I told Mr. Shah that I was a stamp collector and would he give me the stamps from the letters he received from home. This he regularly did when I would write for him. He would also occasionally give me a small gift such as a ball or a pair of gloves for Christmas. I would reciprocate by helping him make some purchases when he had to go to a department store.

Our friendship continued for many years. With the arrival of oil burning furnaces in our community, Mr. Shah's services were no longer needed. Nevertheless he did not leave the community and continued to live in his basement abode with the kindness of his landlord owner. Not too long afterward he became ill with heart failure and had to be hospitalized. I

My Grandmother's Cow

For two days Chernigov was a virtual battlefield where the aggressors were unapposed. They found only victims. For no single Jew chose to return the blows. Blood was spilled everywhere. Whole families suffered pain and brutality. Two children were slain and their bodies dismembered. The sole Jewish doctor could only handle the very serious wounds and fractures. But beyond all the physical pain and the destruction of property, was the ignominy of this episode of sheer hatred of Jews. The bearer of a terrible falsehood had transformed a peaceful community into a near holocaust and a near wasteland. And when the brazen falsehood was disproven some time later, and the village had started to rebuild itself from the ashes, there was noone to shout, "it must never happen again". No soul would say "enough". Did I say no one? Well almost no one. Save my mother's sister Malca. At a very young age Malca fell under the spell of Theodore Herzl and his prophesies

of a return to Zion. She was a member of a Socialist-Zionist youth group, and was working on a Jewish collective farm near Odessa, when the Jews of Chernigov were attacked. When a letter reached, her describing the terrible events, she speedily returned to her village to offer succor to her stricken family. Finding distrust and disorganization everywhere, she summoned a few of her friends, with similar ideals, and held a spirited meeting with leaders of the Jewish community. On one point they all agreed, that antisemitism would accompany Jews everywhere in the Gentile world. Only in Palestine would the Jewish people know pride, and be free from the contempt of the Gentile.

And so, it was decided to send an advance group of 'halutzim' (pioneers) to the Holy Land. The community provided the 'chaverim' (friends) with whatever farm implements they could spare. Spades, pitchforks, warm clothing, and seeds. Within a fortnight six young people left Chernigov to forge their future in the soil of the Galilee. But before they departed, my grandmother delivered her prize cow to the leader. Her beautiful Sonya, with an unborn calf, would now undertake an 'aliya' (home-coming) with the small group. And so today, we know why Israel is called the 'land of milk and honey'. Without a doubt, Minnie's cow contributed the milk. As for the honey? Well, that's a bee-utiful story which would later unfold.

Signs Of Unsafe Driving In Older Adults

(NAPS)—The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) estimates that there are more than 38 million drivers age 65 and older. Age is not the only factor that can impact driving abilities, but it is an important one. There is evidence that most people experience age-related declines in physical and mental abilities. These changes—which can affect everything from vision to how quickly you can make decisions—influence how well you can drive. They can also be difficult to address for yourself or with older people you know, since driving often represents freedom, independence and control.

But transitioning from driving doesn't mean you have to lose these things. Your health care providers or Area Agency on Aging (www.eldercare.gov) can point you toward a range of transportation alternatives in the community. The first step toward finding those tools is recognizing when you might need them.



Are medicines affecting your driving? Some medications can make people feel drowsy and less alert or can limit the ability to pay attention. Some prescriptions even warn against driving. Review medications with your primary care provider or a pharmacist to see whether certain medicines might impact driving.

Signs that an Older Adult's Driving Skills Need Testing

So how do you know whether you or an older adult you know is developing difficulties as a driver? These issues can be warning signs that suggest that an older driver may need to be tested or evaluated:

- Getting lost in familiar areas
 - Ignoring traffic signs and signals
- Becoming easily agitated or angered
- Falling asleep or being unable to concentrate when driving
- Reacting too slowly to dangerous situations
- Forgetting or ignoring driving basics (like yielding to the right of way)

Don't Be Fooled. Medicare Will Not Call You to Verify or Update Information







Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) would like to alert Medicare beneficiaries, their family members and caretakers of a new scam based on the announcement that new Medicare cards and numbers will be issued soon. Scam artists are calling people posing as Medicare or other government employees telling them that new cards are being issued and that in order for them to continue receiving benefits, the agency must "verify" or "update" identifying information. This includes requesting their Medicare number and birth date and in some cases even financial accounts. Don't be fooled. This is a scam to steal your personal information, money and possibly your identity. Here is some information you need to know:

- Social Security number absent Medicare cards will be issued to new and existing beneficiaries from April 2018 to December 2019.
- Medicare will not phone you asking you for personal information. This includes your Medicare number. Nor will Medicare email or visit your home unannounced to "verify" or "update" information it already has.
- If you receive a suspicious phone call, simply say, "I don't give out personal information over the phone," and hang up.
- Report your experience at 1-877-272-8720 or go to www.stopmedicarefraud.org.

Probate And How To Avoid It

Probate is a formal court proceeding to distribute assets when a person dies. Probate can occur with or without a Last Will and Testament.

Probate is necessary in Florida when a person dies owning any type of property (real estate, stocks, bank accounts, etc.) in his or her name alone without any named beneficiaries. For example, if a husband and wife have a joint bank account and one of them passes away, there will be no probate necessary because the survivor still owns the account. However, if the survivor then passes away and has not named a beneficiary on the account, that asset would have to be probated. A bank will allow you to designate beneficiaries with a form called "payable on death," "transfer on death," or "in trust for." Similarly, if a person has a brokerage account either in joint names or with a named beneficiary, that account will not have

to be probated but will go automatically to the beneficiary upon the death of the account holder. This is true with life insurance policies, annuities, retirement accounts, etc. Therefore, it is possible to avoid probate on most assets by simply designating beneficiaries.

However, real estate is different. It is not advisable (for legal and tax reasons) to add children's names to a Deed. If a home is owned jointly by a husband and wife and they both die, their heirs will need to go through the probate process. While the property is tied up in Probate, expenses must continue to be paid. This includes taxes, maintenance, utilities, etc.

Probate in Florida generally lasts about a year. The Probate courts in South Florida generally take longer than the rest of the state. It involves filing the original Will (if there is one) and preparing initial pleadings requesting that the Court appoint the Personal Representative designated in the Will in a court Order called "Letters of Administration." If there is no Will, the closest blood relative can ask to be appointed Personal Representative. Once the Letters of Administration are issued, it is required that there be a



publication in the newspaper, primarily so that any creditors can put in a claim against the Estate. This would include credit card debt, unpaid hospital and doctor bills, unpaid funeral expenses, etc. Florida law requires that no assets can be distributed for the first ninety days from the date of first publication. If the only asset that is being probated is the home of the deceased, the Court can be petitioned to declare the property homestead, thereby exempting it from claims of creditors.

Florida Law entitles an attorney to charge up to 3% of the gross value of the assets that are being probated. A lawyer can charge less than the 3% but not more if the fee is based on a percentage. Lawyers can also charge an hourly rate if the client (the Personal Representative of the Estate) agrees to substitute the hourly rate for the percentage.

However, it is definitely preferable to agree to a specific percentage, which may be negotiated below the 3%; otherwise, there is an unlimited ceiling for an hourly rate. The Personal Representative is also entitled to a similar fee.

The entire probate process can be avoided by creating a Revocable Living Trust and transferring via a Deed any real estate owned in Florida (or other states) to the owner as Trustee of the Trust. If all other assets have payable on death beneficiaries, the Will can be filed but not probated.

HISTORY CORNER

The Revolutionay War/The Far Side of Glory



Killed in action. The gut wrenching news that a son or daughter has died in action defending the country is devastating. There is no relief for the pain. At the funeral, a flag is given to the family as a symbolic gesture of gratitude for the ultimate sacrifice given in defense of the country. The only refuge for survivors is the knowledge that their loved one died heroically, facing the enemy, to defend our way of life.

What if there is no burial, no flag, no fighting the enemy, but just decay and death? Laying in your own filth, packed like sardines in the hole of a prison ship, cold and starving, your body gives out to hunger, dysentery and disease. When your time comes, you are carted away with hundreds of other corpses of patriots and buried in a mass grave.

So went our revolution against England. Over 6000 soldiers died facing the enemy on the battle field. The worse tragedy is that over 15,000 lost their lives as prisoners of war on prison ships and other makeshift prisons on land. In both situations, the vast majority of prisoners died. The POWs were not given proper food, clothing, medical attention or sanitary living conditions. They were tortured and habitually abused by guards. The most notorious prison ship, HMS Jersey, was anchored with a dozen other prison ships in New York harbor. It had a reputation for cruelty and brutality towards Americans. Daily, a dozen men or more died on HMS Jersey and were dragged up on deck and taken to unmarked graves. This treatment of prisoners was a strategy of the British high command to break the American spirit. Petitions to the English King and Parliament

went unheeded.

In spite of this treatment, we won our independence from England. The loss was stunning because the British were the greatest military power in the world at that time. They had the most fire power, the best military minds, the biggest navy, and the most experienced army in the world. The world knew it, they knew it, and we knew it. The English considered themselves more sophisticated than us, more civil, more refined, more intelligent, and more advanced. We believed it also. What stunned us was how such a sophisticated culture could be so cruel as to starve so many to death who were under their care.

We believe as a nation that civility goes beyond good manners, formal etiquette, proper pronunciation, or being well bred. Perhaps this English superior attitude contributed to their defeat. At the heart of civility is respect for the other person. Americans rebelled against arrogance and tyranny, and many paid the ultimate price to declare that all people are created equal and all people deserve respect.

Those 15,000 prisoners who had their lives taken from them by cruel and heartless tyrants never saw the glory of their sacrifice. However, they died for a cause greater than all of us. They sacrificed their lives for their self-respect and the privilege to live life as they saw fit. The sacrifice for freedom is great and most of the time it is not recognized.






The locals are very friendly and welcoming. For those of you who have never visited this friendly island, maybe putting it on your bucket list is something to consider.

Taking a Bite Out of Food Oversight Just Bites us Back

Little to nothing in the Affordable Care Act or the Republican replacement effort gets at the issue of reducing health care costs by stopping the true cause of runaway spending: the enormous increase in the prevalence of chronic diseases. Chronic disease is increasing seven times faster than our population: In 1974, Type 2 diabetes affected 2.2 million Americans. Today? 29 million! Hip and knee replacements have increased annually from 64,000 to over 1 million. You get the picture.

Why has this happened? Our

genes haven't changed. Our habits and culture have. We need a massive effort to save America ... and we think a culture change and a new set of rules instituted by the government (if your representatives have the cojones) are needed.


Regulations Work; Lack of Regulations Causes Big Problems

Research looking at the safety and effectiveness of government food regulations has shown that responsible rules and regulations can pay big dividends -- not only when it comes to saving lives and preventing the suffering of millions of YOU, but also by saving big bucks and making our health care system run more smoothly and efficiently. Let's start with a look at how food policies could, and do, affect those suffering from heart disease.

In a recent study from the University of Liverpool School of Public Health, researchers estimated that in the United States a 10 percent tax on sugar-sweetened beverages could prevent 31,000 deaths from cardiovascular disease every year. Clearly, if government policy and regulations helped reduce consumption of sugary beverages, the benefits would be huge. But there's no reason to stop with policies that impact sugary drinks ...

The researchers also found that instituting a 10 percent subsidy for fruit and vegetables nationally could potentially result in 150,500 fewer CVD deaths in the U.S. by 2030. A 30 percent fruit and vegetable subsidy targeting only food stamp recipients was estimated to avert 35,100 CVD deaths and erase economic disparities in health outcomes; a mass media campaign to change dietary habits might avert 25,800 CVD deaths. Instituting all of the above could improve the health of the nation and the wealth of the country.

Plus, as we have reported before, the scheduled 2018 ban on trans



fats could immediately produce more that \$60 billion in annual health care savings!

The Bill for NOT Acting

Nearly 800,000 Americans die annually from cardiovascular diseases. An appalling \$1 BILLION dollars a day is spent on medical costs and lost productivity related to heart disease and stroke. By 2030, annual direct medical costs associated with CVD will hit more than \$818 billion; lost productivity costs could exceed \$275 billion. We can and must improve on those numbers, since most cardiovascular disease is preventable!

What to Do

Personally and as a country we need to stand up to the multibillion-dollar marketing campaigns of businesses that care only about their profits and get the word out about the biased studies that the beverage and food industry spew out annually.

The country needs to launch public-health information campaigns to let us know this is a war for America's survival, and promote laws that reign in excesses. Parents and all individuals must simply say "no" to stuff that is poisoning their health and the health of their children. We suggest a three-prong effort:

- 1. Write your local and national representatives asking that they stand up for your right to have healthy, unadulterated food; enact regulations that ban food advertising to kids; support the trans fat ban; and consider creating incentives to buy healthier foods.
- 2. Change YOUR purchasing habits. Nothing talks directly to companies like a loss of business. Don't buy sugary beverages or highly processed foods.
- 3. Educate your kids about making healthy, tasty food choices. If you can help them love foods that love them back, you'll be promoting a healthier, happier future for them and that can help keep cardiovascular disease from bankrupting the country.



Insights Into Anger
One emotion that most people don't enjoy is the state of anger. Often this

feeling puts us on edge and we feel ready to explode. It can get displaced and projected on people who aren't even the source of the anger. We then lash out at the person who is closest to us instead.

Lyman Abbott said, "Do not teach your children never to be angry; teach them how to be angry." This quote points to the importance of recognizing, clarifying and having a fruitful way to deal with difficult emotions. We can't magically get rid of anger, agitation and frustration, but we can find ways to gain understanding and engage in healthier responses. Suppression is not the answer.

Stepping back to see the nature of the interaction is a way to gain insight. For instance, a friend of mine was furious that her boyfriend "controlled" her by always picking the movies and restaurants for their weekends. When I asked her if she contributed her own suggestions, she realized that her tendency is to tell him that she doesn't care where they go. At the same time, she felt that if he cared, he would insist on finding out her "true preferences." Do you want the other person to draw out your interests and feel slighted if that doesn't happen? Wanting the other person to be a mind-reader can often be a source of why we feel hurt or angry with those close to us.

I love this quote by Julianne Nielson, "Anger that is getting in the way of happiness needs decluttering. Begin by refusing to blame others for your moods." But, wait a minute! Shouldn't we blame others if they are being thoughtless, mean-spirited or spiteful? Being around someone who is aggressive towards you or full of negative emotions is not healthy. It is important to leave the situation if it's harmful or to speak up and see if it can be transformed. However, it is useful to see why certain people are in our lives and if there a reason we invited them in and/or continue to stay in this pattern.

Other situations that spark angry reactions may involve a total stranger that we encounter while driving, waiting on a supermarket line or when we're out in a public setting. It can be someone taking up two parking spaces or speaking with disrespect to their grandmother. If you speak up in these situations to someone you don't know, it may trigger the other person's defensiveness or anger. How do you stay calm and use these situations for self-knowledge?

Lashing out will solve nothing. Try to remember that you don't know the circumstances of the person or what the reasons are for his or her behavior. A woven story may be internally repeated that is believed and seems to justify the behavior. Take a moment to think of some things you've done that you aren't proud of and use that to be in his or her shoes. Pause and see if saying something will be received well or backfire. If you aren't in a reactive state, your words may be helpful, but only if the other person can hear them too.

Mark Twain said, "Anger can do more harm to the vessel in which it's stored than to anything on which it's poured." Our negative emotions are wonderful tools to help us grow, decipher what disturbs us, learn compassion and reach a deeper peace.

Look Beyond U.S. Borders for Investment Opportunities

Are you traveling abroad this summer? If so, you won't be alone. Increasingly, Americans seem to have gotten the "travel bug." In fact, over one-third of the population now holds valid passports, according to the U.S. Department of State. 

INSPIRATION STATION

Dear Reader,

How is your summer going? How are you feeling? Are you enjoying a gentler pace of life filled with summer delights? I hope so! My summer was going splendidly! I was enjoying our older children home from college and no homework requirements for our younger children. We were up early with our little one and staying up late with our older children. We were taking day excursions biking and kayaking as a family. My husband and I took a romantic trip where we snorkeled, collected shells and indulged in spa treatments. Days later, my mother came for a visit and we shopped and baked and then seemingly out of nowhere, I felt depleted!

I woke up one morning feeling utterly exhausted as if I had run a marathon! Actually worse! I have run a marathon before and felt sheer exhilaration at the finish line so this was different! It was as if someone had taken out my battery pack! I was foggy in my head and heavy in my bones. What had happened? We had enjoyed one activity after another. I love everyone I was connecting with... so why was I so drained? Instead of trying to figure it out as I have in the past, I simply surrendered to it! I admitted I was tired, something in the past I also did not do. I just announced I was going to bed early. Part of me wanted to stay up to enjoy the evening festivities we had planned but my body was speaking to me and I decided to listen and honor my body's wish for rest. My old patterns would find me pushing through exhaustion as if it's a cloud to just get passed but my new commitment to self-care called for me to surrender and check out of the world and into myself.

The next morning I felt so much happier. My heart was full and my thoughts were clear. By going to bed early and getting several hours of extra sleep, I had renewed myself. It occurred to me that even though each activity in the weeks leading up to my energetic crash were pleasant or awesome, the pace of my life was going faster than my body was comfortable with. While I am blessed with great health and stamina, I have noticed that I feel better when I give myself time to recharge on a daily basis. I had stayed true to my Transcendental Meditation practice, which calls for twice daily 20 minute meditations, once in the morning and again in the afternoon. But I had not

been to any yoga classes (my preferred exercise for the past two decades) and I had been eating out of pure pleasure and convenience so my body was not getting refueled in the way that allows me to feel my best. I had also gone an extended period of time with less sleep. During sleep, our bodies heal themselves by moving into an anabolic state where hormonal shifts occur that allow us to renew and replenish on a cellular level. Even skimping out of an hour of sleep can make you feel groggy so skipping hours of sleep over a prolonged period can really take a toll on your overall vitality and mood!





residential, commercial, and tangible personal properties are valued correctly and to assist our residents in receiving tax saving exemptions. This makes certain that property owners pay only their fair share of property taxes – no more, no less.

The Florida Legislature's 60-day legislative session concluded last month. There are several bills that may provide property tax savings to you.

During the 2016 General Election, Florida voters passed two constitutional amendments related to property taxes. Any amendment to the constitution requires a bill be approved by the legislature that provides the implementation requirements and parameters. House Bill 455 relates to providing an exemption for our first responders who have become totally and permanently disabled in the line of duty. The second constitutional amendment expanded the exemption for renewable energy devices and was implemented by Senate Bill 90. Below is a brief summary of both House Bill 455 and Senate Bill 90:

House Bill 455

Any homesteaded property owner who is totally and permanently disabled as a result of injuries sustained in the line of duty while serving as a first responder with a Florida agency, or their unremarried surviving spouse, is eligible for a full exemption on the ad valorem portion of their property taxes.

What's Required?

1. Letter from Social Security Administration stating the applicant is totally and permanently disabled; and one physician certification attesting to the applicant's total and permanent disability which renders the applicant unable to engage in any substantial gainful occupation which will continue for life.

If an applicant is not eligible for such Social Security Administration status, the applicant must provide a letter from the Social Security Administration stating they are ineligible for such status; and two physician certifications, from unrelated physicians, attesting to the applicant's total and permanent disability which renders the applicant unable to engage in any substantial gainful occupation which will continue for life.

2. A certificate from the organization that employed the first responder at the time the injury or injuries occurred. The employer certificate shall be supplemented with documentation of the incident or event which caused the injury, such as an accident or incident report.

WHEN DOES IT START: Beginning with the 2017 tax year. The law does not provide for retroactive application of the exemption to any tax year prior to 2017.

FILING DEADLINE: Filing will begin on August 1, 2017 for the 2017 tax year. Late filing deadline is September 18, 2017.

Senate Bill 90

In August 2016, voters approved a constitutional amendment to expand the exemption for renewable energy devices to all property, not just residential property. The amendment expanded the definition of renewable energy source devices to also include: wiring, structural supports, and other components used as integral parts of a system and power conditioning and storage devices that store or use solar or geothermal energy. The bill expanded the exemption to include all real property and applies without regard to the installation date. The bill also created a statute to exempt energy source devices from tangible personal property. This legislation is effective, July 1, 2017.

vote of the House and Senate placed two constitutional amendments on the

2018 ballot that will greatly impact the residents of Broward. In order for a constitutional amendment to pass, it requires at least 60 percent of the electors' approval.

Increased Homestead Property Tax Exemption

The first proposed constitutional amendment would increase your Homestead Exemption up to an additional \$25,000 for properties valued greater the \$100,000. This could provide \$300 to \$400 savings for Homesteaded homeowners. The amendment is as follows:

Constitutional Amendment Article VII, Section 6 Article XII, Section 37

Increased Homestead Property Tax Exemption - Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to increase the Homestead Exemption by exempting the assessed valuation of homestead property greater than \$100,000 and up to \$125,000 for all levies other than school district levies. The amendment shall take effect January 1, 2019.

Limitations on Property Tax Assessments

The second constitutional amendment would keep the ten percent cap permanently on all non-homesteaded property. This ten percent cap on non-Homesteaded property limits increases the assessed value to 10% per year regardless of increases to the just value of the property. The amendment is as follows:

Constitutional Amendment Article XII, Section 27

Limitations on Property Tax Assessments - Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to permanently retain provisions currently in effect, which limit property tax assessment increases on specified non-homestead real property, except for school district taxes, to 10 percent each year. If approved, the amendment removes the scheduled repeal of such provisions in 2019 and shall take effect January 1, 2019.





It is now August, and to date, we have eleven (11) Hurricane Network Operators.



The Discover Magic course is an educational program specifically designed to teach these skills and more, says Kratish, "It's best described as a life skills course camouflaged to look like magic lessons. Kids become so focused on learning the magic tricks that they don't realize they're acquiring skills whose benefits they'll reap for a lifetime."

"This would be a great incentive to get those grandkids to visit. With a location, so close to Wynmoor, the kids could attend magic class in the morning and be done in time to spend the afternoon with their grandparents and demonstrate what they've learned while they're still excited about it!"

Every Discover Magic class teaches one of the "Traits of a True Magician," and features individualized instruction, custom created props, Top Secret file folders for every child and even a special online "video vault," with bonus material the kids can unlock with a secret code after each class. The tricks taught are age appropriate and are specially designed to encourage and reinforce the life skill being focused on during that lesson.

To show off their new skills, on the final class of each session, students perform a magic show for family and friends, and are awarded a certificate of advancement and ceremonial magic wand. Graduates of the first course receive a purple wand. As with the colored belts of karate, green, orange and black wands are awarded for subsequent courses.

Kratish says he is excited to bring the Discover Magic program to Coconut Creek and to teach important life skills to his students while introducing them to the fun and mystery of prestidigitation.

Registrations are now being accepted for the fall Discover Magic Purple Wand course. Classes will be held on Saturday mornings at 10:30 AM, beginning 10/14/17, at Coconut Creek Community Center. 

MAKING A DIFFERENCE FOR SENIORS

Seniors hold a special place in Florida, which has the nation's largest proportion of residents age 60 and older. There are over 339,317 year-round Broward seniors, with 11% or 37,325 living below the poverty line. Many of these seniors live alone and are finding it harder to afford and access proper nutrition, necessary medications and healthcare. They are struggling to stay in their homes and remain independent.

WHAT IS SENIOR TOUCHLINE?

Senior Touchline is a free service that offers a daily telephone call for people over 60 years of age who live alone. The purpose of the program is to ensure that older adults can maintain their sense of well-being while remaining in their homes and community. Many times, receiving daily Touchline calls can prevent older adults from requiring more costly services or institutional placement.

Touchline calls also provide social contact and emotional support. The 2-1-1 counselor establishes a relationship with the senior and provides them with a sense of security and safety. In some cases, the Touchline Counselor may be the only voice or human contact the client will hear that day or week. One simple phone call can help give a client peace of mind knowing that a volunteer will be checking in with them at the same time each day.

HOW DOES TOUCHLINE WORK?

Each day, within a pre-determined time period, a 2-1-1 counselor calls registered seniors to make sure they are safe and well. If the 2-1-1 counselor is unsuccessful in reaching the senior after one hour of repeated attempts, the designated emergency contacts will be called and asked to check on the senior's well-being. If we cannot reach anyone, we contact the local police department to perform a senior wellness check to confirm their safety. In some cases, we will call to dispatch emergency services.

HOW DOES TOUCHLINE HELP SENIORS IN TIMES OF DISASTER?

Each year before hurricane season, the Touchline counselor will work with the participants to develop a plan of action in the likelihood of a storm. We review their options for evacuation and provide them with information and referrals about programs that can assist them with any special needs. After the storm, we will resume the daily reassurance calls to make sure all of our seniors are safe.




