Mailbag **ROAD KILL - SAFETY ALWAYS**

If you decide to walk at night which a lot of you do because it is cooler at night, just keep in mind that the lighting is very poor and drivers may not see you within Wynmoor boundaries.

Try to wear white or light color clothes and YOU watch out for cars that may turn in a cross street.

Good thing I was driving slowly and I came to a complete stop. This man jogging late at night was crossing the road, and was clueless of any cars being on the roadway. He continued his jog. "If you do not follow these simple rules, you may end up being "Road Kill" which was what I would tell the students who did not want to follow the rules.

THIS COULD SAVE YOUR LIFE:

In 2004, my 73-year-old mother died of a heart attack. Prior to suffering a heart attack, she exercised daily and appeared in good health. What she did not know is that one of her arteries was 99% blocked.

Holy Cross hospital now has a machine (one of the latest technologies) referred to as a "256 slice scanner machine," which can tell you (show clear pictures) of whether your arteries are clear or blocked. The best part of this test from what I was informed is that it takes less than 20 minutes; it is **not** invasive and has very little radiation.

Therefore, two weeks ago, I decided to undergo this test to determine whether my arteries were clear or blocked. The test was quick, easy and painless and the good news was that my arteries were clear.





Norfolk Island Pines

While driving through Florida, one of my great delights is the sighting of the Norfolk Island pine trees. Scientifically known as Araucaria heterophylia, these Christmas tree-like evergreens stand out in any southern Florida landscape. They can be very tall, reaching to more than one hundred feet and their parallel branches lend them grace and beauty not commonly found in other trees. Curiosity about their name and origin led me to do some research on this subject.

Norfolk Island in the South Pacific is a tiny speck of volcanic land three by five miles in size, discovered by Captain Cook in 1774. He noted the presence of the giant pine trees growing up to sixty meters high and with trunks up to six feet in diameter, quickly writing that these trees would make good masts and spars for the sailing vessels of the time. England established a penal colony on the island in 1788 when it shipped its worst inmates to Australia and Australia shipped the worst of these to Norfolk Island. Conditions were terrible there and convicts both male and female were brutally treated. The island had a history of repeated convict revolts and brutal repressions and hangings by the jailers. Finally, around 1840, the penal colony was discontinued. Remains of the prison housing and cells are now a tourist attraction on the island.

1789 was the year of the mutiny on HMS Bounty. Although Captain Bligh was a brilliant seaman and navigator, he was a vicious disciplinarian and his crew mutinied. He was set adrift in a life raft with those sailors refusing to participate in the mutiny. After seven weeks at sea and a voyage of 3000 miles, he reached the Dutch port of Timor and ultimately returned to England. The mutineers retrieved the wives and children they had acquired in Tahiti and sailed to another small island, Pitcairn. There, many of their descendants still live to this day. Due to the difficult conditions on Pitcairn Island, in 1856, 194 of the mutineer descendants moved to Norfolk Island. Today there are 1800 permanent residents on Norfolk Island, about 35 percent of who are direct descendants of the Bounty mutineers.

Our interest in Norfolk Island now jumps to 1942 during the Second World War. Our navy was seeking an island as a refueling stop for planes flying from New Zealand to islands closer to Japan. A young naval officer later to become famous as the author James Michener was flown to Norfolk Island to set up a landing strip for the military. On approaching the island, he was impressed with the towering pine trees between the volcanic peaks. On landing beautiful pine trees grew all over the island and were planted by the natives in neat rows on the area best suited for landing strips. It was necessary to negotiate with the local people for the clearing of these trees to prepare a landing strip. He met the native leaders and their names were revealing. The most common last name was Christian. Other names were Young, Quintal, Adams, Nobs, and Buffet. These were the descendants of the mutineers. Their language resembled English and they had maintained their cultural identity. Over their objections the young pine trees were cut down and the landing strips built. These helped hasten the defeat of the Japanese navy. These landing strips also helped redirect the economy of the island. After the war ended, planes could fly in food and supplies in days rather than the weeks needed for delivery by sea. The airplanes also brought in tourists and this quickly changed the economy. Tourism is now the number one industry having rapidly outpaced farming and fishing.

This is the island from which the stately Norfolk Pine originated. It has been imported to many states and countries. It seems to thrive well in the climate and soil of southern Florida and we have been the fortunate recipients of this

gift from the South Pacific.

Epilogue December 2005

Upon returning to Florida two months after Hurricane Wilma, remains of damaged trees were still evident in all areas of the southeastern part of the state. Many trees were completely overthrown and uprooted. Most were damaged to a greater or lesser extent and relatively few, the younger and shorter stature ones escaped permanent damage.

This was essentially true for the Norfolk Island Pines which presented an unusual appearance. The lowest longest branches (those facing directly into the strong winds and driving rain) were torn off leaving the base of the tree bare. The upper branches were damaged badly leaving a ragged appearance to the peak of the foliage as if the trees had gotten a shaggy haircut. The pine needles as well as the younger branches were shorn clean by the powerful winds. A few trees were spared from severe damage. Fortunately the very youngest trees were resilient enough to allow the winds to pass through and not tear them from the earth.

Will these trees recover? I hope so. Trees are slow growing organisms and will take many years to return to their previous pristine appearance. That is if we do not experience another catastrophe in the coming years.

Epilogue Two 2017

More than a decade after the massive hurricane, most of the Norfolk Island Pines have shown a remarkable recovery. Their lower branches have regrown and the trees have recovered their conical Christmas tree shapes. They have been fairly resistant to severe environmental damage and insect attacks. They still grace many parks and homes. So if you see one of these trees, consider the fact that you may be looking at a direct descendent of a sapling, planted almost two hundred years ago by one of the Caine Mutiny mutineers. So enjoy their beauty.







My Grandmother's Cow

Thus, Autumn quickly overtook my grandmother, and she was once again the busy matriarch-cum servant of her own queen-dom. Sonya and her calf both shared the ripened hay. But since mortals are sovereign in God's domain, the little heifer was discretely slaughtered by my grandfather, much to the dismay of his family. Fresh veal soon graced the festive table, with the balance of meat salted and stored for the winter. Still life and custom goes on and Sonya, the cow, was soon again with calf.

Uncle Jack's Casablanca

Looking at him you would never imagine that my uncle Jack was in his late eighties; maybe in his mid-sixties, but late eighties, no way, nor, would you ever guess that he was terminally ill. Although I maintained contact with him, I had not seen him in at least five years. Jack's wife of sixty odd years passed away at that time.

Uncle Jack, my mother's brother, was a one of a kind. A graduate of Boston University's School of Law, he was the first in the family to become a professional.

When it was not fashionable he was always in the forefront to defend those, who could not defend themselves, and more often than not, pro bono. He possessed the qualities that were rare then, and much rarer today. He was just a kind and good person.

He greeted me warmly at the door of his old Cape Cod home that he had built for his wife and himself in 1938. Jack at the time was a rising star in the legal profession and managed very well even through the economic downturns of the 1930's.

When World War II broke out he enlisted in the army, in spite of the objections of his wife and family members. Before too long he rose to the rank of captain.

He saw action, in the D-Day invasion of Normandy, as well as fighting his way through Europe. Like many bona fide veterans, he did not speak willingly of his military experience. I respected this and never asked questions.

He ushered me into the living room where the TV was tuned to the Movie Channel and the classic picture *CASABLANCA*.

Jack was an avid reader. He was fascinated with American history, particularly as it related to World War II.

"I love this film, I must have seen it at least a hundred times. It brings back so many memories. It is my very favorite. You know, it was the last picture I had seen before we had invaded France."

I reached out and held his hand, as the tears cascaded down his face.

Not knowing exactly what to say, "It is a classic."

"So memorable... so memorable."

"Yes, I know." I felt stupid saying that, how would I know. He let that slide.

"Those were terrible years," almost inaudibly he said, "I do love that film." Although I was more interested in talking to him...how are things going...

how are your daughters...what have you been doing...etc. *CASABLANCA* had a special meaning for him. I wasn't about to take it from him.

Still enraptured by *CASABLANCA*, on the TV screen, Uncle Jack in unbroken dialogue continued, ..."1943 Battle of Stalingrad...7,000,000 in the American army...the second Warsaw ghetto uprising by Jews...the continued liquidation of the Jews, and others... end of the war in North Africa... Italy surrenders and declares war on Germany."

He always had a photographic memory; he was so bright! These factors, along with his natural drive, elevated him to the top of his class at Boston University's Law School. His obsession with the past was a little disconcerting, but, if that is what he wanted, certainly he was entitled.

I was a young boy in 1943. World War II made headlines every day. I asked my mother one day why she didn't read the newspaper. "I don't want to read them, too depressing..."

I guess her thinking was that if you don't know or talk about an unpleasantry it will go away. No disrespect intended, but by today's definition it would be called escapism or denial. I did not adhere to this thinking and even as a youngster I followed the news avidly.

After an hour or so *CASABLANCA* ended, and Uncle Jack insisted that I join him with tea and lemon.

I got word about a month later that uncle Jack passed away. I returned to Boston and attended the funeral. His daughters were there as were several of his neighbors. The full military honors were impressive, and added a solemnity and finality to the ceremony.

The actual burial was put on hold until all those in attendance had left. As I had planned, I was the last to leave. I asked burial ground workers to give me a little time alone.

I removed an envelope, which had a message that I had written on the plane to Boston. I thought it was appropriate; a quote from Shakespeare's Julius Caesar and one from *CASABLANCA*:

"His life was gentle, and the elements So mix'd in him that Nature might stand up And say to all the world, "This was a man!"

"Here's looking at you, kid."

I dropped the message into the grave and left.

Almost immediately a rain cloud that had been hovering above opened, and there was a brief shower. I didn't mind as the rain blended with my tears.

And, then we have to repeat the information to the customer service person. What a waste of time!


The issue is that these big companies want to make each moment count; and for me, it only makes my time aggravating and exceptionally longer than I intended to wait.

Improving My Knowledge of Ancient History In Ann Arbor

Recently, I visited Ann Arbor, Michigan's Kelsey Museum of Archaeology and I improved my knowledge of ancient civilizations in the Fertile Crescent, the birthplace of Western Civilization and Egypt. I studied numerous objects found in excavations done by the University of Michigan, the Cleveland Museum of Art, and the Toledo Museum of Art in the 1920's under the leadership of Leroy Waterman. Most of the objects that I studied came from excavations done in Seleucia (present day Iraq, 18 miles from Bagdad), Karanis (located in present day Egypt), and the Fayoum area (present day Egypt). From Seleucia, I saw an abundance of Parthian Period pottery. From the Parthian Period in Iraq and Syria, I saw a fine collection of female figurines (245 BC-226 AD) which symbolized fertility and successful childbirth. I also appreciated antiquities from the Sumerian Civilization (mace head with inscription 2112 BC, found in Ur) and the Babyllonian Civilization (tablet made of clay with inscriptions 2000 BC).

I also saw its copious collection of antiquities from Fayoum and Karanis, including green axe heads and flint knives from Neolithic times (6000=4000 BC). Most of the Kelsey Museum's objects from Karanis came from the Ptolemaic and Roman Periods in present day Egypt. I saw several Egyptian mummy portraits from the Ptolemaic Period, as well as Egyptian mummy masks. I also relished studying the coffin of Djehutymose from Egypt's Saite Period (685-625 BC).

I also saw its large collection of ceramic works from Ancient Greece and an Opulian Votive Krater done in 340 BC and made of clay by Gioia Del Calle.

Considering the destruction of the archaeological ruins of Palmyra (Syria),

Aleppo (Syria), and the museums of Ancient History and Art in Baghdad and Damascus, the Kelsey Museum of Archaeology has the valuable function of maintaining our ability to study life in the Fertile Crescent in ancient times. I also appreciated the Kelsey Museum of Archaeology's staff for their devotion to the work they have done in educating the public in the field of Ancient History.

VACATION? LEAVE YOUR A/C ON



Enhanced Life Estate Deed: Is It Safe?

There are several ways to avoid probate on your home when you die. If you are single, there will be probate when you die unless you choose one of the following options. If you are married and own your home together, your surviving spouse will not have probate; however, there will be probate when the second of you passes away, unless one of these options is done.

Let us assume that you own your home jointly with your spouse and that you have two children. Both of you desire to have your two children inherit your home equally when you both pass away.

The first option would be to add the names of your two children to the Deed as joint tenants with right of survivorship. This is not a good idea. It would affect your ability to claim your full homestead exemption.

In addition, you lose control of your property and can only sell it if your children both agree and sign all closing documents. If you wanted to take one of the children off the Deed, you would be unable to do so. If one of your children files for bankruptcy, has an adverse judgment or files for divorce, your property could be subject to liens or other legal action. Therefore, I recommend against a Deed with your children as joint tenants with right of survivorship.

The second option is a Life Estate Deed. There are two types of Life Estate Deed: regular and Enhanced (also referred to as "Lady Bird"). The regular Life Estate Deed requires that your children join in any sale or other changes on the Deed; therefore, you have lost control and cannot take your child's name off the Deed if you choose to do so. The Enhanced Life Estate Deed gives you the sole right to sell the property during your lifetime or make any other changes to the Deed without the permission of your child. The Enhanced Life Estate Deed has very specific legal language in order to be effective; therefore, do not attempt to do this on your own.



Even with the Enhanced Life Estate Deed, there are risks, particularly if your child has a bankruptcy, outstanding judgment or undergoes divorce. The worst risk, however, is if, God forbid, your child dies before you or with you in a common accident. Your child's estate would then become the owner of the property once you died, which would result in probate being required. Thus, the main purpose of the Life Estate Deed is not accomplished.

The best way to avoid probate on your home is to do a Revocable Living Trust. When you sign the Revocable Living Trust Agreement, you also sign a Deed transferring the property to you as Trustees of your Trust. You are able to keep your homestead exemption, maintain complete

control of the property during your lifetime and make amendments to your Trust without changing the Deed. There are no risks involved, since your children's names do not appear on the Deed. The only disadvantage of the Revocable Living Trust is that it will cost more money in attorney's fees. When you discuss the options with your attorney, you should discuss the difference in fees between the Revocable Living Trust and the Enhanced Life Estate Deed. You can then determine whether it is worth saving the money and taking the risks involved in the Enhanced Life Estate Deed.

Dean Dr. Joy...

Dear Dr. Joy,

Diet seems to be a major factor in many of our lives. We learn that calorie reduction is what loses weight and exercise, although a healthy practice, does little in weight management. What is not mentioned is the psychological aspects. We know when going for stomach surgery reduction of any kind, there is a psychological test that goes with it.

The secret I suspect is going from "living to eat,} to "eating to live." Can you give us some tips that we can apply today.

I wrote an article a few years back about weight

loss and how frustrating it can be. I thought about reprinting it here but since then, my perspective has changed somewhat.

The facts remain the same; diet and exercise are still important as are your priorities. But I have some additional ideas as well.

To begin, different people lose weight by eating different types of food.

If you have a family history of heart disease and you have high cholesterol, especially high LDL, you will lose weight easier with a low fat, higher carb diet. Remember, the carbs here are complex, not simple sugars. Complex carbs consist of fruits, veggies, whole grains, fiber rich foods. They do not mean cakes, ice cream, candy, cookies, etc. Even most dried fruits should be avoided. Complex carbs with their higher fiber content are slow release and keep you fuller longer. Simple carbs make you hungrier than you were before you ate.

If you have a family history of diabetes and you carry your weight around the middle, a low carb diet is best.

Without these genetic predispositions, a balanced diet that is low-calorie is probably the right one for you.

No matter which diet you choose to go on, you are correct in stating that there is a huge psychological component involved.

I mentioned in a previous article, that I owned an obesity clinic in the early 80s and although the center was diet oriented, there was a very important slant on the psychological/emotional aspects of a person's ability to lose weight. I did private counseling and ran groups. When I closed the clinic, I worked for the hospital, "Optifast" programs doing psychological counseling. Weight loss was always a large part of my private practice as well so I am pretty much an expert in this area.

To begin, you may be able to lose weight doing the right stuff but you most likely won't be able to keep it off unless you change the way you **think** about food, weight, your body and yourself in general. You can't stay thin unless you change your entire orientation towards all the above subjects. You need to know what food and eating mean to you and how you view your body and what you tell yourself about how you look and feel.

You can't stay thin if you are thinking about being fat just as you can't be healthy if you believe you are ill and give it a great deal of your attention.

Your imagination plays a large role in your success. Your mind really doesn't know the difference between the thoughts you are having that are 'real' as in a reflection of your observations and imaginary ones that you are choosing to hold. Your mind orients itself towards what you tell it. If you imagine yourself eating healthy and looking good and taking care of yourself, your mind will begin to look for ways to manifest that. If you are constantly telling yourself that you look terrible and feel awful and that you are a failure at dieting your mind will manifest that as well.

It's mental exercise and it works. It may work slowly and it may feel strange and unusual to think of yourself as how you want to be rather than as the 'real you' that you are today, but the more you can impress these thoughts and images on your mind, the easier it will become to do the necessary things to create your new self.

A lot of people believe that if you think of yourself as thin when you are fat, then you will eat more.

This will not be true if at the same time you are thinking of yourself as thin you are also thinking of yourself as healthy and fit. When you live in that orientation, you will continue to treat your body with respect and the more you do, the more real it will become and the more you will want to continue to do it. It's like the better it gets, the better it gets. When you are in a downward spiral of lethargy, overeating and depression, then the worse it gets.

You can't get thin and fit if you believe you can't and if it just isn't important enough to commit to. You can if you believe in yourself and the ability to create your body the way you want it to be.

Genetics and age may or may not play a role here. No one really knows for sure but everyone assumes it is true. Even if it is, you can still move forward to the best you can be under the circumstances.

Changing your body and your fitness and health level can be looked upon as an adventure instead of as an ordeal.





HISTORY CORNER

Some Soldiers Stand Taller Than Others



Vietnam, March 1968, Quang Ngai Province. They were outnumbered, but Chief Warrant Officer Hugh Thompson Jr. made his stand with his two crew members, Specialist Glenn Andreotta and door gunner Specialist Larry Colburn. There are those rare times in life when you move beyond the realm of your country or your flag. You find the courage to do the right thing, even if it means your life.

All three men were under twenty-five years old, and they did the unthinkable. They ignored orders from a ranking officer and turned their guns on fellow American soldiers of Company C, 1st Battalion of the 20th Infantry Division and were prepared to shoot and die if necessary. Americans standing against Americans was unheard of and this tragedy became one of the greatest attempted cover-ups of the Vietnam War.

Thompson and his helicopter crew were supporting an infantry sweep of several Vietnamese hamlets in the Quang Ngai Province. When they spotted several wounded, they dropped flares to alert the ground troops to assist the wounded. Later, they flew over these same people again and noticed that they were all dead. The helicopter crew knew that American troops had murdered these folks instead of assisting them. They then saw American soldiers massacring unarmed civilians. Thompson landed his helicopter after radioing his base camp and told them what he had witnessed. Once on the ground, Thompson confronted the ground officer, Lt. William Calley, who outranked him. Lt. Calley told Thompson that he was in charge and for Thompson to mind his own business.

Going airborne, Thompson noticed another group of American troops chasing unarmed civilians. He told his crew that this had to stop and asked if they would back him. Both crew members agreed. Thompson then landed his helicopter between the civilians and the Americans and said to his crew, who were both manning M-60 machine guns, "Y'all cover me! If these bastards open up on me or these people, you open up on them. Promise me!" They replied, "You got it boss. Consider it done."

With guns locked on him, Thompson approached the American troops and confronted the officer in charge. He told him he was taking the civilians out. He then coaxed the civilians out of the trench and begged other helicopter pilots to come in to pick up the civilians because there were too many for his copter. After the civilians were lifted off, Specialist Andreotta noticed movement in another ditch that was filled with over 100 lifeless bodies. Thompson landed his copter, and Andreotta waded through the dead bodies and found a young boy who had been shot but who was still alive. He picked the boy

up, carried him to his copter, and flew the boy to safety. Back at his base, Thompson reported the massacre to his superiors in the strongest and loudest manner possible. The order was finally given to stop the killing.

When Charlie Company entered the hamlets, not one shot had been fired at them. They began torching homes, torturing civilians, raping women, shooting everyone they could find, beheading the dead, and mutilating bodies. In the end, over 500 Vietnamese were massacred. Most were women, children, and old men. Then began the cover-up from the top down.

Thirty years after the My Lai Massacre, the army wanted to present Thompson with a medal for his actions. They wanted a quiet ceremony tucked away where no one would notice. He said he would only accept the medal if his crew was honored and the ceremony had to be at the Vietnam Memorial, the black granite wall referred to as "The place of healing." Thompson and Colburn accepted their medals. Andreotta had been killed in action three weeks after the massacre, so his medal was awarded posthumously.

What do we learn from My Lai? Yes, horrible things happen in war, and yes, American soldiers commit atrocities just like all other armies. During war, no side is innocent of appalling acts. We also learn that some soldiers stand taller than others. Some soldiers, as well as civilians, will stand in the gap and do what is right and just. These are the soldiers and civilians that bring honor to our country. These courageous men and women, who put their lives in harm's way for the weak and the oppressed, are the folks who make America great. Greatness is not measured by how powerful one is but in how one acts in an honorable way toward the weak. America's greatness before the world is our conviction to stand tall for the poor, the weak, the hurt and the defenseless.

Thompson and Colburn were shunned, ostracized, and received death threats from Americans for their actions. Larry Colburn went back to Vietnam in 2008 and received his greatest reward. He met that young boy from thirty years ago, Do Ba, whom Andreotta had rescued in 1968. Mr. Ba thanked him. Specialist Andreotta died three weeks after the massacre in combat. Chief Warrant Officer Thompson died of cancer in 2006 and Larry Colburn died of cancer in 2016.

General Douglas MacArthur may have said it best. "The soldier, be he friend or foe, is charged with the protection of the weak and the unarmed. It is the very essence and reason for his being."

God bless America for its true greatness that has been recognized around the world.



Declare Your Financial Independence Day

We're getting close to the Fourth of July, when we celebrate the freedoms we enjoy in this country. The U.S. constitution grants us many of these liberties, but we have to earn others – such as our financial freedom. What steps can you take to achieve the financial independence you need to reach your long-term goals?

For starters, always work to build your resources. Contribute as much as you can afford to your IRA and your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan. At a minimum, put in enough to earn your employer's matching contribution, if one is offered. If you don't take advantage of this match, you are essentially leaving money on the table. While how much you invest is an essential factor in gaining your financial freedom, how you invest your money is equally important. So make sure you have sufficient growth potential in all your accounts. While growth-oriented investments, such as stocks and stock-based vehicles, carry investment risk, you can help moderate this risk by also including other investments, such as bonds.

Another way to gain your financial independence is to liberate yourself from the shackles of debt. This isn't always easy, of course – most of us have experienced times when our cash flow simply wasn't sufficient to meet our expenses, so we had to take on some type of debt, either through a credit card or a loan. But the more you can control your debts, the more money you'll have to save and invest for your future.

One way to manage your debt load is to build an emergency fund, containing three to six months' worth of living expenses, which you can use to pay unexpected costs such as a major car repair or a large medical

bill. Ideally, you should keep this money in a liquid, low-risk account, so you can access the funds quickly and without penalty. Aside from possibly helping you control your debts, an emergency fund also may enable you to avoid dipping into your long-term investments to pay for short-term needs.

Thus far, we've only discussed achieving your financial freedom through methods of saving and investing. But you also need to consider your protection needs, too. If you were to become ill or suffer a serious injury, and you could not work for a while, your financial security could be jeopardized. Your employer might offer you disability insurance as an employee benefit, but it may not be enough for your needs, so you might need to purchase some additional coverage on your own. And to help ensure your family's financial security, you'll also need sufficient life insurance.

You also might want to protect yourself from the catastrophic costs of long-term care, such as an extended nursing home stay. The average annual cost for a private room in a nursing home is more than \$92,000, according to the 2016 Cost of Care Study issued by the insurance company Genworth. And Medicare generally covers only a small percentage of these expenses. You may want to consult with a financial professional to learn about ways you can protect yourself from the long-term care burden.

By following these suggestions, you can go a long way toward declaring your own financial independence. Consider taking action soon.



Health-Care Generosity and Connection Have Overwhelming Benefits to You and to Society

In tough times, lots of folks think that when it comes to health care, tightening the purse strings, letting folks fend for themselves and advocating tough love (or not so much tough love as just tough noogies) is the smart way to proceed. It's, well, responsible, is what gets said.


We say, yes, front-end, costcutting measures are responsible... for increased health risks, higher health costs and expenditures, and a reduced economic base. Not really what most people want or think they're advocating!

Turns out, there's no time like the present to expand the love in your heart and in your budget. There are enormous benefits gained physically, emotionally and economically when you reach out to help others and support programs that do that too. Over and over, studies have shown that a generous, social and compassionate approach to your neighbors' problems, returns a bounty of **benefits to YOU and society.**

On a Social Level

Health-care costs in this country are out of control; we all know that. In fact, according to the Commonwealth Fund, we spend more per capita than other high-income countries, with worse results (lower life expectancy and worse health). We have ever-more folks developing chronic diseases, and we spend 84 percent of all health-care dollars on such conditions, many of which are preventable. But does that mean we should spend less on programs that measurably improve people's health? Not by a long shot.

A new study published in the New England Journal of Medicine, titled "Economic Effects of Medicaid Expansion in Michigan," found that contrary to expectations (of some folks), even though the state's cost of expanding Medicaid coverage to more than 640,000 low-income people will hit \$399 million in 2021. The economic benefit of providing the health care will more than make up for it. It seems the expansion generates jobs -- lots of them -- and that brings in an additional \$150 million a year in revenues to the state from income and sales taxes. The study also shows that this year, the state's economic windfall from the expansion (including health care expenditure savings picked up by the federal government) will be \$432 million. It declines as the state has to pick up more costs of the program, but will still be \$162.3 million in 2021. And none of that takes



into account the enormous health benefits (and reduction in health-care costs) to people whose lives are made far, far less stressful and who receive improved medical care, which helps prevent chronic diseases. In Michigan, expanding Medicaid pays huge dividends!

Then there's the study in the American Journal of Public Health in 2015, which found that states with a generous unemployment compensation payment reduced unemployed men's reported health problems! Together, these studies demonstrate that you can save money and improve

people's health by spending money on programs that expand health-care coverage and improve economic stability.

Another way it helps? Generosity -- say, by donating money and time -- protects your health by making you feel that you can make a difference, and that feeling of positively affecting your world creates happiness. That's one of the best health elixirs there is.

In short, supporting a cause that matters to you, helping a neighbor and extending kindness, makes the RealAge of the person you help younger, while making your RealAge younger, too.





Scam artists are calling people posing as Medicare or other government employees telling them that new cards are being issued and that in order for them to continue receiving benefits, the agency must "verify" or "update" identifying information. This includes requesting their Medicare number and birth date and in some cases even financial accounts. Don't be fooled. This is a scam to steal your personal information, money and possibly your identity. Here is some information you need to know:

- Social Security number absent Medicare cards will be issued to new and existing beneficiaries from April 2018 to December 2019.
- Medicare will not phone you asking you for personal information. This includes your Medicare number. Nor will Medicare email or visit your home unannounced to "verify" or "update" information it already has.
- If you receive a suspicious phone call, simply say, "I don't give out personal information over the phone," and hang up.
- Report your experience at 1-877-272-8720 or go to www.stopmedicarefraud.org.

Dear Friends,

The 2017 Hurricane Season is here. Broward County Emergency Management closely monitors weather activity in the tropics, especially during Hurricane Season. As South Florida approaches the peak of hurricane season, it is strongly advised that residents have their emergency plans in place.

Don't wait for last minute help when you can easily remain prepared through the season!

- Register with Broward County's Vulnerable Population Registry. This registry allows people who are disabled, frail or have health issues to register in advance with their city so that emergency workers may plan a better response following a hurricane or other emergency. For more information or to register, call 3-1-1 or 954-831-4000.
- If you plan on going to a Special Needs Shelter, pre-registration is encouraged to ensure that the shelter is adequately prepared to meet your needs. If you pre-register, you are not obligated to go to the shelter in an emergency. You can change your plans without notice if you make other arrangements. To pre-register, call Broward County Emergency Management

at 954-831-3902.

• Pre-register for evacuation transportation if you think you may need it. As with shelter registration, you are not obligated to take advantage of the service if your plans change. To pre-register, call Broward County Emergency Management at 954-831-3902.

It is also important to prepare important documents.

- Make a list of your Personal Support Network the people you can count on to help you before, during and after an emergency. Document contact information (home, work and cell phone numbers) for each person on the list, including family members, friends, coworkers and neighbors.
- Create a Personal Information Card with all your health information (doctors, insurance policy numbers, hospital preferences, current medications, medical conditions, etc.) Identify your disability-related or special medical needs.

Ending The Opioid Epidemic

A terrifying opioid epidemic is sweeping the nation—infecting our neighborhoods, poisoning our families and filling our morgues. Nationwide, nearly 33,000 people lost their lives to opioids in 2016—more than died in auto accidents or homicides.

Sadly, Broward is not immune from the devastating crisis, which knows no bounds and impacts individuals across nearly all demographic and socioeconomic categories. The numbers are alarming. In 2016, opioids claimed 582 lives in Broward—nearly two each day. The death toll from this deadly menace is rising all the time. By the end of the year, deaths attributed to this threat will likely exceed 1,000 in Broward alone.


The dramatic uptick is largely the product of cheaply-made synthetic drugs, such as fentanyl and carfentanil, which are used as replacements for heroin. For instance, fentanyl is many times more potent than heroin, while carfentanil is up to 1,000 times more potent than heroin, and a very small dose can sedate a 13,000-pound elephant (while the same miniscule dose can easily kill a person).

In more than 30 years of working in law enforcement, I have personally witnessed the horrific damage drugs can inflict on individuals, families and communities. The drugs may change over the years, but the overall narcotics problem remains. While this public health emergency is historic and its impact far reaching, the Broward Sheriff's Office is doing all we can to make a difference and end this deadly drug plague.

BSO is a member of the Community Action Team, comprised of law enforcement, treatment providers, epidemiologists, first responders,

physicians, the Broward Medical Association, Broward Health, Memorial Health, United Way and many others. The team has developed a three-pronged attack at ending this epidemic via a combination of enforcement, education

and intervention.



This war on opioids is not our first fight to end a drug epidemic gripping Broward. We've been here before and we've had much success. When the highly-dangerous, imported, designer drug "Flakka" suddenly appeared on the scene a few years ago and became an out-of-control

local plague, we met it head on. Within months, we effectively stamped out the deadly drug from Broward's streets. I am hopeful we will have similar success in the battle against opioids.

The opioid crisis is very real and very deadly. But, together, BSO and our community partners are committed to ending this alarming epidemic and saving lives.

It has been just over 100 days since I was sworn into office as Broward County's Property Appraiser and we have hit the ground running. The Property Appraiser's Office is responsible for determining the taxable value of all residential, commercial and tangible personal property located in Broward County. We also grant tax-saving exemptions and classifications to qualified individuals. The amount of property taxes a property owner pays is based on the assessed value less any exemptions and the tax rates set by the various taxing authorities. Our Compliance Department works to ensure no property benefits from an exemption or classification it is not entitled to. When a property owner frauds the system, it forces everyone else to pay more than their fair share.

We have taken great strides in a short time. Nowhere is this more evident than in the level of community outreach and education we are engaged in. Over the past 100+ days, our Community Outreach Department has attended 309 events serving 12,859 residents with exemption filing and providing other important information. Through these events, we were able to grant 2,135 exemptions to qualified individuals resulting in tax savings on their upcoming 2017 property tax bills. I have personally spoken at 75 events. The Property Appraiser's Community Outreach Department visits homeowner associations, community groups, realtors, business groups, places of worship and local organizations all over Broward County as part of our ongoing commitment to educate residents. If you would like our Outreach Representatives to attend one of your events, please contact them directly at 954-357-6905.

Communication is a key part of our current success and long-term goals. The Property Appraiser's Office inspects all property on a three-year review cycle unless there is a permit issued on the property or we are notified of

a change. We have started using door hangers when we inspect the property to let the owner know we were there and

provide our contact information should the owner have any questions. Our social media presence has been a key component of our success and ability to reach people wherever they may be. Did you know our website, www. bcpa.net, receives more than 1 million hits each day? To further improve our ability to not only educate but also provide a one-stop place for information, we are working on an improved website. This website will still contain the information you are used to but also be responsive allowing you to access enhanced information and apply for exemptions on your smartphone or tablet.

Customer service remains a priority in my office. Our Customer Service Department has assisted 11,518 visitors in our office since January 3 and served thousands more online and by telephone. Along with our Outreach Department, they have approved 22,889 Homestead Exemption applications; 22,096 Additional Low-Income Senior Exemptions; 8,941 Portability applications; 2,827 Veterans, Military, Disability and Widowed Exemptions; and 2,493 Non-Profit Exemptions. When visiting our office or interacting with our customer service representatives online or on the phone, rest assured you will be treated in a friendly and efficient manner. We will work to provide you with every tax-saving exemption you are entitled to and get you on your way quickly.



Dear Reader,

Do you remember the top of the charts Bee Gees song, "How Deep Is Your Love?" The easy melody and tender lyrics reveal a gentle vulnerable soul requesting reassurance from his love. Most of us, at some point in our lives, can relate to the lyric, "And the moment that you wander far from me, I wanna feel you in my arms again." I have felt this tugging sensation of wanting to keep my loved ones close with both my husband and my children, no matter what their ages or stages. If we have been blessed to know love, we also know the pain of separation. Whether it's romantic love that simply has to be temporarily paused for both people to return to work or those parenting milestone moments of having to let go of our babies for either preschool or college, that old familiar tingling, almost acidic feeling of having to let go a little bit or a lot, to allow the other person to expand can kick in.
