

CONDO LAW By Mark Bogen

Q and A



We recently had our election in our condo association and there was a tie between two owners running for a seat on the board of directors. How do we break this tie?

As "notice of runoff election" within 7 days after the election. This new notice will inform the owners that there will be "runoff" election to break the tie. The new notice must include a new ballot with the tied candidates' names, the candidates' information sheets (if they provided one to the association), as well as inner and outer envelopes. The runoff election is held in the same manner as the original election. The runoff election must occur between 21 and 30 days after the original election.



My next door neighbor is using their unit as a hotel. Every couple of weeks there are new occupants who stay for weeks at a time. Shouldn't the board be doing something about this?

First, the board must have the authority in the association's governing documents to approve or reject person(s) who will be residing in the unit or renting or occupying the unit for a certain amount of time. Without such authority, the board has nothing to do. Second, if the governing documents do give the board the authority to approve or reject people staying in the unit, the next step would be to send a letter to the owner stating that they must obtain approvals for renters or any person occupying the unit to be in accordance with whatever the association's

governing documents state. Third, if the owner does not comply with the association's letter and is still violating the governing documents, the next step would be for the association to file a lawsuit to obtain something called a permanent injunction, which is a court order instructing the owner to do or not do something, such as violating the association's governing documents by allowing unapproved occupants or renters. If the owner violates the court order, the court may hold the owner in contempt, which could result in fines or even jail.



I am selling my condo unit and the title company asked for a letter stating how much I owe on my unit. The association provided the letter but required a \$100.00 fee be paid. Is this legal?


A Yes. If the closing does not go through, however, the Association must return the fee.




Our condominium has several employees, including a full time manager. I asked to see the association records however, I was told that I was not allowed access to the payroll records of our employees. Is that true?

HISTORY CORNER

An Unmarked Grave



An unmarked grave laid quiet in Ft. Pierce, Florida. In the ground, laid a woman who rose from the bottom and soared to the top through determination, hard work, incredible talent, and a wild-crazy spirit. She was recognized as the "Queen of the Renaissance" in the 1920s in New York City, but spent her last days scrubbing floors and dying alone in a St. Lucie County welfare home, before being buried in The Garden of Heavenly Rest Cemetery in Ft. Pierce. Zora Neale Hurston's story begins in 1891, when she was born into a family of eight in Alabama. Her father and mother moved to Eatonville, Florida, which became the first incorporated black township in the United States. Her father was carpenter, clergyman, and three-time mayor of Eatonville. Her mother died when she was thirteen years old. Her father quickly married another woman, whom Zora did not get along with, and, at fourteen, Zora was out on her own. She landed a job with a traveling troupe of Gilbert and Sullivan, where she worked as a maid.

Zora Neale Hurston continued to work at various jobs until she could afford go to school, with the help of scholarships. As the only black student at Columbia University, Zora earned a BA in anthropology and worked in the field for a number of years. However, it was her writing and her social life that brought her fame and condemnation from both whites and blacks. Zora had two husbands. The first marriage lasted just over two years and the second lasted less than eight months. She was a lighting rod for the social scene in New York during the Harlem Renaissance. Her partying, love affairs, and affinity with voodoo painted part of her portrait. The rest of her portrait was filled in with her writing, lecturing, and research. Interestingly, her positions against racism juxtaposed with her stance against integration, which brought approval and reproof from both white and blacks.

Regardless of what folks thought of her, she was admired and respected for her brilliant writing. Though she wrote many academic pieces, her novels captured the hearts of Americans. Every major literary critic in the country praised her work. She was referred to as, "The High Priestess of the Vernacular." Her most famous novel, "Their Eyes Were Watching God," is a story of a young black woman with dreams and a whole life ahead of her. As she begins her journey into womanhood, she experiences the realities of the real world. Her adjustments to life, her setbacks, and her acceptance of life as it is, makes her an indomitable character who brings excitement and passion to life. The story is written using the dialogue of southern black culture. It is a vivid and articulate representation of the culture at that time. While most reveled in her writing, some in her community criticized her because she depicted the culture so well; they felt it made the African American community look deficient.

In the late 1950s, Zora moved to Ft. Pierce and worked as a librarian, substitute teacher, and maid. Hard times fell on her and she began to experience health problems. By this time, most had forgotten her writings and contribution to America. She died alone in a welfare home and was buried in an unmarked grave.

Shannon Thornton writes, "In 1973, when Alice Walker discovered the unmarked grave of Zora Neale Hurston and read her stories, Walker make an active choice to be friend the spirit of Hurston. Hurston was an influential writer in the Harlem Renaissance, but most of her work was out of print by the time she died in 1960. She was a forgotten writer until Alice reached through the mists of time, blew the dust away from the covers, and re-introduced Hurston's work into American literature."

Zora Hurston's gravesite is now graced with a befitting marker. Yearly, festivals honor her work while scholarships and endowments in her name are given to deserving recipients. Zora's story has generated numerous plays and a made-for-tv movie. They pay honor to her creative and determined spirit. A Writer's Sensitivity to His Society

A concerned writer must be disciplined at looking at what is important to write about. Through the eye of his pen, he should communicate his inner vision, which he has by necessity, become sensitized to the mores of society. He will allow us to read the comparison in fundamental differences between fictional and factual modes. His poem or story should image the innocence of children—their lack of self-consciousness; their whole-hearted pleasure, in whatever their experience provides. Even the ugly and the repellent, and the traumatic loss of that innocence. His writings might also evince pain and concern in the hearts and minds of adults, where impotency and self-loathing diminish their efforts of healing and correcting the injustices of society.

When poets wish to present the experience of living in the world as it actually is, even in its sorry state, they often turn back to a natural scene, where the world looks very much like an Edenic garden. But a closer view shows us that things are not always what they ought to be. This is evidenced in some poems of e.e.cummings, G.M.Hopkins, and Emily Dickenson. In Dickenson's poem, "A Narrow Fellow in the Grass," the white dimpled spider and the narrow fellow in the grass are somewhat sinister. In cumming's poem "In Just-," the focus shifts from the happy awareness of children to the self-consciousness of the observer. In Hopkin's poem, "Spring and Fall," there is a sense that a lovely youthful Spring time will change to Fall, the altering seasons foretelling the coming of Winter, signifying age and death. Desperate escapes into forgetfulness and selfishness are attempted at the same time, where it is acknowledged that escape from responsibility is near impossible, because what has fallen is not so much the world as most worriedly the human self. Yet there is too, the excitement as well as the pain of the poetic experience, which comes from the way the actual world is constantly set in memories of an ideal world, where all was once pure and perfect, as in Eden; and where no poetry, as we know it, would or could have been written.

Is there a perfect 'ethical' world? I would like to be convinced that

there might be. Socrates devoted most of his life in pursuit of which, some philosophers have chosen to title as ethics. Since ethics is the science of human conduct, and an inquiry into our moral behaviour, each of us must learn the rules that ought to govern our human actions, our humanity, and basic kindness for those who are indigent and less fortunate.

It is posited that man has been imbued with self-will and a stubborn continuation. Thus, there should be the commitment by concerned souls, described in Hebrew, as "Tikkun Olom," which is the obligation to repair and heal the world. Let us then, as writers, try to align ourselves to this worthy enterprise.



What is Probate?

Probate is a formal court proceeding to distribute assets when a person dies. Probate can occur with or without a Last Will and Testament.

Probate is necessary in Florida when a person dies, owning any type of property (real estate, stocks, bank accounts, etc.) in his or her name alone, without any named beneficiaries. For example, if a husband and wife have a joint bank account and one of them passes away, there will be no probate necessary because the survivor still owns the account. However, if the survivor then passes away and has not named a beneficiary on the account, that asset would have to be probated. A bank will allow you to designate beneficiaries with a form called "payable on death," "transfer on death," or "in trust for." Similarly, if a person has a

brokerage account, either in joint names or with a named beneficiary, that account will not have to be probated, but will go automatically to the beneficiary upon the death of the account holder. Therefore, it is possible to avoid probate on most assets by simply designating beneficiaries.

However, real estate is different. It is not advisable (for legal and tax reasons) to add children's names to a Deed. If a home is owned jointly by a husband and wife, and they both die, their heirs will need to go through the probate process. While the property is tied up in Probate, expenses must continue to be paid. This includes taxes, maintenance, utilities, etc.

Probate in Florida generally lasts about a year. It involves filing the original Will (if there is one) and preparing initial pleadings requesting that the Court appoint the Personal Representative designated in the Will in a court Order called "Letters of Administration." Once



the Letters of Administration are issued, it is required that there be a publication in the newspaper, primarily so that any creditors can put in a claim against the Estate. This would include credit card debt, unpaid hospital and doctor bills, unpaid funeral expenses, etc. Florida law requires that no assets can be distributed for the first ninety days from the date of first publication. If the only asset that is being probated is the home of the deceased, the Court can be petitioned to declare the property "homestead," thereby exempting it from claims of creditors.

Florida Law entitles an attorney to charge up to 3% of the gross value of the assets that are being probated. A lawyer can charge less than the 3% but not more if the fee is based on a

percentage. Lawyers can also charge an hourly rate if the client (the Personal Representative of the Estate) agrees to substitute the hourly rate for the percentage. However, it is definitely preferable to agree to a specific percentage, which may be negotiated below the 3%; otherwise, there is an unlimited ceiling for an hourly rate.

The entire probate process can be avoided by creating a Revocable Living Trust and transferring, via a Deed, any real estate owned in Florida (or other states) to the owner as Trustee of the Trust.



Cultivating Healthy Habits

Did you ever take a pen out of your desk, try to write and then stick it back in the drawer because it was out of ink? Why do we do that? I think it has to do with our habits and that we hate throwing things away!

Habits can help us to move in a positive direction. But, there are also habits that hold us back or even keep us stuck in a rut. Certain habits are self-destructive and lower energy. What are some ways we can get motivated to create or sustain good habits and decrease or eliminate the unhealthy ones? Erasmus said, "A nail is driven out by another nail; habit is overcome by habit."

First of all, take a little time to watch your daily habits for a few days. What are some parts of your routine that you like and think fruitful? Are there other routines that you find drag you down? Why do we at times sabotage ourselves when heading in a productive direction? Don't judge yourself, but just observe and write down your habits across a few days.

A lot of people beat themselves up because they say they know they "should" exercise but won't. Think realistically about what form of exercise you'd like to do and also the amount of time involved. If you push yourself to do a form of exercise you dislike, you can end up resisting it and quitting. Starting with a twenty-minute walk can give you a sense of accomplishment which builds up an interest in increasing fitness. When you begin with something too extreme or challenging, you can get discouraged or feel deprived. This happens often with dieting patterns as well.

Steven Guise said, "Doing a little bit each day has greater impact than doing a lot in one day."

I've talked to people who only exercise at a gym, but others prefer to follow a program on television, DVD or even mall walking. When you pick something, you like to do, you are more likely to stick with it. If you skip a day or two, don't beat yourself up. Instead, have compassion and then start over in a few days when you are ready. You lose days if you are self-critical because this can lead to paralysis and negative circling.

Catch judgments such as, "Watching TV is bad." It is often our **relation** to an activity that's the problem and not the activity. For instance, a TV show can stimulate a lot of reflections about love, the search for meaning or something profound. On the other hand, if we are watching TV to numb ourselves or for hours or to zone out, it is less fruitful. It's all about balance, but remember that we do need to rest our minds too!

There are some habits we engage in because we've copied our parents or other significant people in our lives. We have the ability to **choose** whether we want to repeat the patterns or not. For instance, I was speaking with someone who said she sends food back in a restaurant often because her mother always did that. When she reflected on it, she realized that she really wasn't as particular about her food preparation as her mom. She saw this as a habit that wasn't part of her identity.

Did you ever put your foot into one of your old shoes and feel it pulls the foot towards the right side, due to how it was worn over the years? Our past habits can drag us in certain directions. This is why former addicts are often advised to avoid their old crowd of friends.

Seneca said, "The mind unlearns with difficulty what it has long learned."

What habits do you want to shed versus cultivate? Visualize the self you wish to become and see what habits support this direction. Be realistic, pace yourself and don't beat yourself up. Look at the habits you've changed over the years and appreciate this capacity with awe and wonder.



STOP HOMESTEAD FRAUD



Property owners should only pay their fair share of property taxes. If they are entitled to an exemption they are not getting, then they are paying too much in property taxes and not their fair share. Conversely, any property owners receiving an exemption they are not entitled to, are paying too little in property taxes and not their fair share. If someone is deceptive in an attempt to lower his or her taxes

by claiming an exemption he or she is not entitled to, someone else has to make up the difference.

Our office aggressively seeks to stop Homestead fraud. The Department of Professional Standards and Compliance works with city governments, homeowner and civic associations, and concerned members of the public to help identify tax fraud. Since October 6, 2004 the Broward County Property Appraiser Office has back-taxed property owners not paying their fair share

Since I took office in January 2017, we have investigated 2,617 reported cases of potential fraud resulting in 1,313 non-qualifying exemptions being removed from the tax roll and have back-taxed property owners not paying their fair share \$352,415.79. Most importantly our office's fight against Homestead fraud over the last decade has put billions of dollars of value back on the tax rolls ensuring that all properties are treated fairly across the board.

Once reported, our office will fully investigate each Homestead Exemption to ensure the owner is entitled to this savings. Property owners who intentionally cheat on Homestead Exemption can be back-taxed for as many as ten years, plus be required to pay a substantial penalty and annual interest.

Our anti-fraud work makes sure everyone pays their fair share and helps keep

your taxes down. If you believe you have reliable information about someone engaging in Homestead fraud, (you may remain confidential) please call our investigators at (954) 357-6900 and we'll check it out.


The Place To Enjoy Contemporary Art In South Florida

The Perez Art Museum By Barry Isaac

First of all, the Perez Art Museum is a splendid work of exterior and interior architecture beside the beauty of Biscayne Bay. For those you who know me, I have a strong propensity toward paintings and works of Art from earlier periods (Medieval, Renaissance, Baroque, etcetera). Nevertheless, on a hot, humid April Fool's Day, I spent 5 hours enjoying Contemporary paintings, videos, and other works of Art at the Perez Art Museum in Downtown Miami. From its permanent collection, I saw fine paintings by Al Held ("Solar Wind," a splendid Geometric work, acrylic on canvas) Morris Louis ("Delta Eta." fine example of Minimalism), Polly Apfelbaum ("Mojo Jojo," work of Art on floor, she employed velvet and dye fabrics) Sean Scully ("Wall of Light, Rain", oil on linen by this prominent Irish painter), and Sue Coe ("Pinonchet," mixed media college on paper, fine light effects, depicts the horrors of Fascism in 1990's Chile and the execution of dissidents), among others. I also saw fine creations from its permanent collection by Hew Locke ("Hemmed in Two," a ship made of cardboard by this Scottish artist), John Chamberlain (a work of Art made of automobile fenders, very metallic), and Charles Gaines ("Numbers and Trees"), among others.

I also saw fascinating videos temporarily on display produced by Susan Hiller (video with captions and sound showing dying languages of people worldwide such as; Wichita, Livonian (Latvian tongue), and Breton, exhibit ends on June 4, 2017), Ulla Von Brandenburg (video depicting white stairs which triggers gymnastic actions of performers, very surreal almost out of Marcel Duchamp, exhibit ends on June 25, 2017), and John Akomfrah (video which depicts Post Colonialism in Africa and the African diaspora by Ghanan born artist, ends on August 27, 2017).

Parking is available at this art museum for two dollars an hour, seniors receive a discount on admission, and there are lovely swings on the premises for children and those who wish to evoke fond memories of their childhoods.



Being Happier and More Optimistic is Good for Your Health

You have enormous power over your health. True, you cannot control everything -- unknown exposure to environmental hazards, unmodifiable genetic predispositions, random encounters with infectious agents or just plain bad luck -- but there's a lot you can do to maximize your health.

One area that you have far more control over than you may imagine is your attitude! Solid science demonstrates that feeling happy and optimistic reduces your risk of everything from heart attack to post-surgery setbacks. A positive

attitude also improves your quality of life, even if you are diagnosed with something as serious as cancer, and promotes resilience, which helps you rebound if you do become sick.


One study looked at the outcomes of wound healing after hip and knee replacements, hernia surgery and a procedure to correct varicose veins. Patients with Amoderate anxiety and depression were about 1.2 times more likely to have wound complications post-surgery than more upbeat folks, and they were 1.2 times more likely to be readmitted to the hospital to deal with wound complications.

Optimists also fare much better in studies looking at heart disease, heart attack and stroke. A positive attitude correlates with healthier blood pressure levels: In a Finnish study, pessimists were three times more likely to develop high blood pressure than more optimistic folks. An American study found that the more positive the participants' outlook, the lower their blood pressure.

Optimists are 50 percent less likely to have heart attack or stroke, and have better scores for blood lipids. And they're half as likely to require rehospitalization after coronary bypass surgery. Among patients getting angioplasty, another study found that pessimists were three times more likely than optimists to have heart attacks or require repeat angioplasties or bypass operations.

The journal Circulation published a study that found, compared with pessimistic women, optimistic women had a 9 percent lower risk of developing heart disease and a 14 percent lower risk of dying from any cause after more than eight years of follow-up.

There's more: A 2006 study found that a more positive outlook was protective against respiratory infections. A Mayo Clinic study found that



people who have high anxiety have a moderately increased risk of developing Parkinson's disease decades later -- so do pessimists.

Why does attitude affect your health? Chronic pessimism dings the immune system and changes hormones levels throughout the body. In contrast, folks with a positive outlook have lower levels of the stress hormone cortisol and epinephrine, a healthier heart rate and blood pressure, and reduced inflammation, which is a big health hazard.

So, how can you improve your outlook? If your glass is rarely half

full, there are easy-to-adopt habits that will raise your spirits and improve your attitude. (If you suffer from serious bouts of depression or anxiety, try these steps AND consult a therapist who can help you resolve or modify such problems.)

- 1. Cut the Clutter. Research shows that cleaning up small messes, like the bills on your desk or making the bed daily, contributes to happiness because they represent "small wins" for your willpower.
- 2. Cultivate Gratitude. Regular expressions of gratitude promote optimism, better health and greater satisfaction with life. Take time to count your blessings. Try spending just one minute every morning thinking about the good things in your life. And do like Dr. Mike does: Write three thank-you notes every evening.
- 3. Consciously Look on the Sunny Side. Irritated that you have to stop at the grocery store on your way home from work? Focus on how lucky you are to be able to make a healthy, home-cooked meal.
- 4. Change your Wiring. Did you know that laughing -- even for no reason at all -- makes you happier? And listening to music that features a fast tempo and is written in a major key can cause immediate physical signs of happiness, such as a faster breathing. Dr. Oz shares a great playlist of tunes; Google "Dr. Oz My Happiness Playlist."

ARE LOWER TAXI RATES COMING?

For many years, Uber and Lyft have operated in Broward County. For those of you who do not know these companies, Uber and Lyft provide car transportation in Florida and most other states. The main difference between using a Taxi and Uber/Lyft is that Taxi rates are regulated by Broward County and Uber/Lyft rates are not regulated at all.

Therefore, if you use Uber, the fare may be one price on Monday and a different price on Tuesday. Uber/Lyft have the authority to raise and lower their prices based on demand. Uber/Lyft can charge you any price on any day. However, Taxi prices are set by a meter (and regulated) and the cost to go to a specific location should be the same every day.

Since Uber or Lyft can lower their price and be more cost competitive than a Taxi, the Taxi industry is now asking Broward County permission to be able lower their prices and be more competitive with Uber/Lyft. Also, the Taxi industry wants to be able to give you a choice of a set price from one location to another location; or a zone price from one zone to another zone without using the meter.

As a Broward County Commissioner, I believe it is in the consumer's best interest to allow Taxis to be able to lower their price when they choose to do so. As crazy as that sounds, the Taxi industry has not been allowed to lower or change their prices due to the county regulation.

Allowing Taxis to give you a set price or a zone price without using the meter will allow consumers to save on their transportation costs. This issue will be coming before the County Commission during the next month. Please let me know your thoughts.

SAVING MONEY ON YOUR REAL ESTATE TAXES

Last year the Broward County Commission passed a law called the "Low-Income Senior Homestead Exemption" which allows seniors to save money on their real estate taxes. If your condo is registered as your homestead, you are 65 years old or older and your combined household income (your social security taxes are not included) is \$28,800 or less, you may be eligible for a savings. 





The FUN will continue during the summer months.






Both shows will be held in the West Wing. So, there is no travelling necessary. And, as usual, the prices will include tax and gratuity. The exact prices will be announced shortly.

Did you know we are hard-wired for WANTING TO BE HAPPY? This may seem obvious but how many truly HAPPY people do you know? Turns out, we make our decisions on an emotional level with intention of *wanting* to be fulfilled and happy, but we are surprisingly not tuned in with what will actually bring us ultimate joy. The late American Poet, Maya Angelou, once said, "Pain is inevitable but suffering is optional." Let's choose to be conscious of what we hold onto and what we let go of. Let's be clear - HAPPY CHOICES LOOK DIFFERENT ON DIF-FERENT DAYS! Some days, that green drink will get us on track and other days ONLY the chocolate cake will do! Dear Dr. Joy,


My father always told me, "you pick your friends but you"re stuck with your relatives." He went on to say, "if you have one good friend, you have a lot." Can you define what a "good friend" is?

I'll begin my answer with a little story. About 40 years ago, I was having lunch with a rather prominent psychologist and his wife. He was my mentor and guide, both professionally and personally and of course, I had a great deal of respect for him. His wife mentioned the name of a famous man who had been trying to get together with him for a while and asked why he seemed to show no interest in seeing this person. The answer was, "he's one of those people who wants to hang out with me but doesn't really want to be my friend." That statement naturally led to a conversation about what it means to be a friend, how many we need, the place in our lives for interesting acquaintances, helpful neighbors and also about situational friendships.

So you ask what exactly is a friend. I don't completely agree with your father about choosing your friends. It's a lot like choosing who you fall in love with. It just isn't done. Chemistry plays much too great a role here. However, you are free to choose whether to act on your feelings or not. Your choice would be based on what characteristics are important to you. Just because you "love" someone, doesn't mean they are right for you to be with and here is where choosing is important. I can tell you what some of the criteria we discussed 40 years ago were, because I still believe them today. I think there has to be a form of platonic love, caring, honesty, support, loyalty, enjoyment, and some mutuality of values between true friends. It would be hard to put these qualifications into a hierarchy, but I think for me, loyalty would have to be first. I would need to know that my "friend" was on my side and I would need to know that I could trust that person completely. I would never expect anyone to tell me I was right when she/he believed I was wrong, but I would expect that they would say what they had to say to me privately and certainly not malign me to someone else, or in public. Being right or wrong about a certain "fact" is provable, having an opinion is personal, and it is certainly not disloyal to disagree with what our friend believes.

We all have friends of different religions, different political views and different tastes. A part of loyalty is defending our friend's right to hold these views whether we agree with them or not. I mentioned situational friendships and, very often, we confuse these with the real bond of friendship. People often come together because of a shared passion or goal. There is usually a great deal of emotion and connection within that relationship but it is really based on the temporary bond of a certain set of circumstances and not necessarily a true caring between the people involved. You can usually spot these situations because most of the energy is geared toward the mutual passion and when that either fades, or changes, there's really not much basis for the friendship to continue. Sometimes, unfortunately, one party truly believes it was a real bond and when the focal point changes and the mutuality of the goal disappear, that person is left feeling betrayed and

Friendship is very similar to a love relationship or a marriage when it comes to deep feelings of being bonded or connected. These are the people in our lives who have the power to devastate us emotionally. Since, as your father said, we chose these people, there is also the component of being angry and upset at ourselves because we made such a mistake and put our faith in the wrong person. Unrealized expectations both about ourselves and our choice of friends wreak havoc on our self-esteem and often we can't forgive ourselves as well as the "friend." But in reality, we all make mistakes about the character of those we bring into our lives and our hearts; we have all been fooled at one time or another.

We can enjoy the company of certain people and share interests with them, but to assume that they are our friends is a great leap. We can work together with people and have our personalities mesh and even find them stimulating and interesting company, but to assume that they are our friends is a great leap.

We can have helpful, friendly neighbors who will check our homes and take in a package for us and even join us for a meal, but to assume that they are our friends is a great leap. I am certainly not demeaning those relationships.

There is an important place in our lives for all types of connections but a good and true friend is a rare blessing. This person wants the absolute best for you. He or she is your advocate and really likes and respects you as well as cares deeply for you. This is the person who when he agrees with you, will fight your battles with you, as if they were his own and if he disagrees with you, will fight for your right to be who you are, and if he gives his views, will do so without attacking yours, especially in public.

Your father was right on this, if you have one such friend, you are indeed a lucky person.




