## **Management Leads Renovation** in of 19th Hole in **By Insider Staff**

The 19th Hole Restaurant begins a major renovation under the leadership of Jackie Railey, President of Wynmoor Community Council, her management committee and administration.

In our conversation with Jackie, she revealed resident concerns and what we could expect to see within the next few months. This is what she had to say:

"After so many people asked about renovating the 19th Hole, we brought the proposal to our board of directors." After the board members approved moving forward, an architect and interior designer were hired to present their proposals. Once a final concept was completed, the council board of directors voted to approve it.

"We are not only renovating the kitchen and dining room, we are also renovating the bathrooms by the ballroom and the outside area by the 19th Hole. When we are finished, our residents will be able to have an indoor dining experience as well as dining outdoors on the patio, which will be protected by the elements. Jackie noted that the renovation will enhance the 19th Hole Restaurant experience from getting a cup of coffee to having a three-course meal."

The target date for completion is mid-December, however, permits and potential weather construction delays, could prolong the restaurant's opening. If residents would like to see a rendering of what the restaurant, they can visit the Wynmoor Facebook page. Railey states that modifications to the rendering are likely to occur before completion.

Several restaurants have expressed interest in operating the 19th Hole along with the former restaurant operator. Jackie said, "No decision has been made as to who we will have operating the restaurant. A full investigation of all applicants, will be conducted."

Residents will be informed of the restaurant's progress at the monthly meetings and by email. President Jackie Railey, her management team and the administration, wants to thank everyone for their patience during the time of renovation.

### **Lessons Of Mother Nature**

Many years ago, when I was a teenager, I worked on a fishing boat out of New Bedford, Massachusetts. During this time, I was fortunate enough to learn some of the different faces that Mother Nature uses to test our worthiness to learn her different moods. If we learn successfully, she shares her bounty, if not we face disaster. These lessons proved invaluable to me when the U.S. Air Force sent me to Sondrestrom Air Base in Greenland.

I arrived in Sondrestrom Air Base in January 1966 in the heart of a very cold Winter. After four months of frigid weather, things began to warm up. What a change the month of May brought as the ice began to melt and water from the glacier began to flow down the river to the sea at Baffin Bay. Things began to grow, and life came to this frigid land.

Not far from my barracks, there is a small bridge that crosses the river of melted ice that flows through the Fjord to the sea. The sound of the flowing water has both a hypnotic and compelling allure that draws one to it. So out of curiosity, I went down to the ledge next to this awesome site to hear and see this wonder. It is amazing how mesmerizing and captivating the sight and sound of rapidly moving water can have on the human soul as it draws you near to its embrace. So, as I went down to see and experience this phenomenon, I began to feel a rather hypnotic and melodic drawing of my soul to move closer to the edge of this chasm.

It was at that moment that I remembered Homer's epic poem "Odyssey" and the song of the Sirens who tried to lure Odysseus into their watery embrace. So, with slow but determined steps, I carefully backed away from the precipice and thanked the glacial sirens for a glimpse of their beauty and song. I began to realize that this was a sort of test to see if I would be foolish enough to put aside common sense and embrace the sirens song. I wonder how many have embraced that call.

As I walked away from the Fjord, I decided to head out to a hill we called Sugar Loaf, which when you look at it, appeared to be only a football field away. In reality, it is 3 miles away. Remember in the Arctic Tundra, there are few common things one can use to tell distances. The reason for going to Sugar Loaf is because it sits halfway between the glacier, the Air Base, and the hundred-mile-long Fjord. It does give one a great view of the area that is quite beautiful.

As I headed toward Sugar Loaf, I had to cross an area of what I thought was gravel that during the Winter I had crossed many times. What I did not realize was the sand I thought was gravel was, in reality, crushed rock by the glacier into a fine powder and deposited and soaked by the melting glacial waters. What I didn't realize was this is arctic quicksand. (Unlike quicksand one sees in the movies, where you take one step and you're up to your hips in the stuff. This may make great drama in the movies but, in reality, it is a slow and agonizing process). I understand that most people who find themselves in this predicament try to lunge forward to get out of the quicksand only to be in deeper trouble. They don't seem to realize that every movement they make sinks them even deeper. The trick I learned was rather then lunge forward, try to take a step backward. Remember you came from solid ground only a few steps back, so go back the few steps to solid ground. One must learn not to panic but to think things through to find a solution.

Like Odysseus, I was lured by the simple and quick way to my goal as he was by Circe but even he had to figure a way to escape her charms as I had to escape my Circe (the quicksand). As a result, I found an alternate route to reach my goals and had a wonderful day.

It seems Mother Nature had tested my survival skills twice and by sheer

I guess I have had a charmed life both as teenager on a fishing boat and as an airman in the arctic. I have learned how to respect what Mother Nature can do and what she has to offer those who respect and learn from her tests.

I have been a resident of Wynmoor for 22 years. Prior to Florida, my husband and I lived in New York. My husband suffered from Angina. He could not tolerate the Winter weather. One day, he said, "we must move."

My sister and brother-in-law lived in Wynmoor for about five years and loved it. She had been suggesting that we move here often. I vetoed it each time. I dreaded the thought of leaving my son, daughter-in-law and three wonderful grandchildren. I just never thought I would ever move away from my son. However, we had no choice. ### How Can You Leave The Legacy You Desire?

# Enhanced Life Estate Deed: Is It Safe?

There are several ways to avoid probate on your home when you die. If you are single, there will be probate when you die, unless you choose one of the following options:

If you are married and own your home together, your surviving spouse will not have probate, however, there will be probate when the second of you passes away, unless one of these options is done.

Let us assume that you own your home jointly with your spouse and that you have two children. Both of you desire to have your two children inherit your home equally when you both pass away. The first option would be to add the names of your two children to the Deed as joint tenants with right of survivorship. This is not

a good idea. It would affect your ability to claim your full homestead exemption. In addition, you lose control of your property and can only sell it if your children both agree and sign all closing documents. If you wanted to take one of the children off the Deed, you would be unable to do so. If one of your children files for bankruptcy, has an adverse judgment or files for divorce, your property could be subject to liens or other legal action. Therefore, I recommend against a Deed with your children as joint tenants with right of survivorship.

The second option is a Life Estate Deed. There are two types of Life Estate Deed: regular and Enhanced (also referred to as Lady Bird). The regular Life Estate Deed requires that your children join in any sale or other changes on the Deed; therefore, you have lost control and cannot take your child's name off the Deed if you choose to do so. The Enhanced Life Estate Deed gives you the sole right to sell the property during your lifetime or make any other changes to the Deed without the permission of your child. You are entitled to keep your homestead exemption. The Enhanced Life Estate Deed has very specific legal language to be effective, therefore, do



not attempt to do this on your own.

Even with the Enhanced Life Estate Deed, there are risks, particularly if your child has a bankruptcy, outstanding judgment or undergoes divorce. The worst risk, however, is if, God forbid, your child dies before you or with you in a common accident. Your child's estate would then become the owner of the property once you died, which would result in probate being required. Thus, the main purpose of the Life Estate Deed is not accomplished.

The best way to avoid probate on your home is to do a Revocable Living Trust. When you sign the Revocable Living Trust Agreement, you also sign a Deed transferring the property to you as Trustees of your Trust. You

can keep your homestead exemption, maintain complete control of the property during your lifetime and make amendments to your Trust without changing the Deed. There are no risks involved, since your children's names do not appear on the Deed. The only disadvantage of the Revocable Living Trust is that it will cost more money in attorney's fees. When you discuss the options with your attorney, you should discuss the difference in fees between the Revocable Living Trust and the Enhanced Life Estate Deed. You can then determine whether it is worth saving the money and taking the risks involved in the Enhanced Life Estate Deed.

# Saving The Planet, What Can One Person Do?

Here is a brief note of thanks to our Wynmoor friends. We were extremely pleased to receive your very positive feedback and comments regarding our recycling article. It was good to know there are many Wynmoor residents, like us, that are interested in helping save the planet for our children, grandchildren, and their children.

Climate change is an issue we are all familiar with, because in the past years, hurricanes have become more severe and the season seems longer. We already know how to prepare and to keep ourselves safe.

Now, let's talk about how we can do our part in helping reduce our carbon footprint and the Greenhouse effect on the Earth. By definition: A Carbon Footprint is the amount of carbon dioxide and other carbon compounds emitted to the atmosphere, due to the consumption of fossil fuels. What are fossil fuels? Fossil fuels are known as hydrocarbon fuel, such as petroleum, coal, or natural gases, derived from the accumulated remains of ancient plants and animals. They are used as fuel. These and other Greenhouse gases, generated by burning fossil fuels, are considered by many to be one of the principal causes of global warming.

Did you know the Carbon Footprint of the U.S. households is about 5 times greater than the global average? For most U.S. households, the single most important action to reduce their Carbon Footprint is driving less or switching to a more efficient vehicle. This may not be possible for those of us that are concerned with climate change. However, there are many things we can do to reduce our Carbon Footprint and help us live happier, longer and productive lives.

The following are recommendations from the CLEO Institute, a grassroots organization out of Miami, whose mission is to "promote an informed and engaged public that supports climate action locally, regionally, nationally, and globally."

**Food:** *Buy Local:* Shipping burns fuel. A 5-pound package shipped by air across the country creates 12 pounds of  $CO_2(3\frac{1}{2} \text{ pounds if shipped by truck})$ . Eating local also supports local agriculture.

*Eat less meat:* Vegetarians save at least 3,000 pounds of  $CO_2$  per year compared to meat eaters. Eating an all-vegetarian diet could cut your Carbon Footprint by half. If you're not a vegetarian, eat one or two more vegetarian meals each week. Poultry is also less Greenhouse gas intensive than beef. Get on the Meatless Monday wagon!

**Don't waste food**: Get creative in the kitchen. About one-third of all the food prepared annually in the U.S. gets tossed, producing methane in landfills as well as carbon emissions from transporting wasted food.

*Try home-composting*: It makes for great nutrient rich fertilizer for those plants on your terrace. It also reduces the transportation of waste and the amount of waste that is dumped into our neighborhood landfills is one of the largest contributors of methane in Florida.

What To Avoid: Avoid single-use plastic items: Plastics are made from petroleum-based products and often end up in the oceans and waterways. They are difficult to recycle and end up back in the landfills. They also require a lot of fossil fuels to produce and transport.

*Avoid plastic water, juice, and soda bottles:* Buy a stainless steel refillable bottle that will last for many years.

Avoid plastic bags: Use reusable grocery bags and keep them in your car.

With the breeze from a fan, it will feel as cool as you would at 78 degrees with no fans. You'll reduce your costs by about 15% - 25%.

- ✓ Don't choose a lower air conditioning temperature when you first turn it on. It won't cool faster. Whenever its running, its cooling as fast as it can. Set low, it cools longer, not faster.
- ✓ Set the air conditioning thermostat at 78 degrees or higher. Raise it a few degrees higher when away during the day. A lower air conditioning temperature makes your costs much higher. Setting your air conditioner at 70 degrees instead of 78 can almost double your operating cost!
- ✓ When weather is mild, use fans instead of the air conditioner. Your central air conditioner will use about 100 times more energy than a fan at medium speed.

*Lighting:* Use LEDs instead of incandescent bulbs. They use 75% less energy; last 10x longer and pay for themselves in the first 4 months.

*Insulation:* Weather-stripping, caulking and darkened window glass work together to save you energy, improve the comfort of your home, make it quieter and help you save money and the environment.

*Water:* Water-conserving showerheads and toilets: You can reduce water and heating costs, even in your bathroom. Save water by turning off the faucet when brushing, shaving or while doing the dishes.

Adjust your water settings: Turn the hot water heater in your condominium down to 120 degrees and wash your clothes on the cold-water setting. This could save your building \$200 - \$300 a year and a lot less shrunk clothes!

*Appliances:* Always pay attention to the total lifetime cost, including energy, not just the price tag. Look for the \*ENERGY STAR\* label for energy efficient models.

*Electronics:* Turn things off. If you're going away or not using an item for a while, unplug it to prevent "vampire" energy loss from electricity usage on standby. Turning off your lights and electronic devices could save you \$100 per year. Don't forget to unplug your cell phone charger when not in use!

*Solar:* We love solar! Hopefully, Wynmoor will consider installing solar panels on our rooftops. With today's falling prices, the ROI in South Florida can be between 6 - 7 years! Suggest to Wynmoor landscaper to use more native species.

**Engagement:** *Stay informed*: read, read, read. Stay up-to-date on the latest science, data, and socially relevant issues. Understanding the facts is the best way to make informed decisions and help those close to you grasp the issues.

Engage with candidates you wish to support and let them know climate change matters! **VOTE** for political candidates that are mindful of the environment despite party orientation. This is a non-partisan issue. Make sure your Congressperson and/or Senator know you want them to act on climate change no matter what their religion or political views may be. There is no economy on a dead planet and climate change is the biggest threat to our youth.

**Get Involved:** Become a climate speaker. ## **Risk Protection Orders: An Important New Tool To Keep Broward Safe From Gun Violence**

Broward County and all of Florida are safer today, thanks to a new state law that gives law enforcement a valuable tool to prevent gun violence. This helps keep firearms out of the hands of individuals who demonstrate an obvious threat to themselves or others.

Florida joined a handful of states earlier this year when it passed the "Risk Protection Order Act" (RPO), or "red flag law," which spurred much-needed action in response to the tragedy in Parkland. This important law, passed with bipartisan support in the state legislature, allows law enforcement to remove firearms and ammunition from violent or mentally ill individuals, while affording citizens their due process.

Already, this law is clearly proving its worth to law enforcement and the public.

Since the passage of the law, the Broward Sheriff's

Office has made significant use of the RPO Act. Already, BSO has utilized RPOs dozens of times, more than any other county in the state.

In April, BSO violent crimes detectives arrested a Deerfield Beach man who was pending trial for attempted murder, for violating a risk protection order and removed an AR-15, a .22 caliber rifle, hundreds of rounds of ammunition, a bump stock, and numerous other weapon-related items from his home. The arrest is believed to have been the first in the state for violation of an RPO.

The process for obtaining an RPO is straightforward and puts the decision to remove guns in the hands of a judge. First, law enforcement files a petition listing the statement, actions or facts which give rise to a reasonable fear of significant dangerous acts by respondent. The petition is heard by a Judge within 24 hours to determine if there is reasonable cause to believe the respondent poses a significant danger of causing personal injury to themselves or others in the near future by having in their custody, any firearm



or ammunition. If granted, the respondent is served with the temporary order, and they must immediately surrender their firearms, ammunition and concealed weapons license pending a final hearing.

The judge will set the final hearing within 14 days, at which time law enforcement must present clear and convincing evidence that the person poses a significant danger of causing personal injury to themselves or others by having in their custody or control, any firearm or ammunition, or by purchasing, possessing, or receiving a firearm or ammunition. If granted, the final RPO is valid for one year. To extend the order, law enforcement would once again have to present evidence to the court that the person is still a threat to themselves or others.

This is the type of common-sense gun measure for which I have long advocated. This law is intended solely

to remove firearms from individuals who pose an obvious threat to themselves and others, not from law-abiding citizens. It balances public safety goals with the important rights, afforded to citizens by the Second Amendment of the Constitution, as well as the Fifth and Fourteenth Amendment right to due process. In fact, even gun rights organizations have voiced their support for

these red flag laws. While this law is not the perfect solution to ending

gun violence, it's a gigantic step in the right direction and we are all safer because of it.

**2018 TRIM Notices:** The Broward County Property Appraiser's Office mails the TRIM (proposed tax) Notices in mid-August each year. The proposed property tax notice will show your 2018 property assessment, exemptions, and the proposed taxes along with dates and times for the various taxing authorities' public budget hearings.

The TRIM Notice is your opportunity to review your property assessment and ensure you are receiving all the tax-saving exemptions you are entitled to. Our office's contact information will be listed on the newsletter enclosed with the TRIM Notice, giving you the opportunity to contact us directly should you have any questions. *The absolute deadline to apply for any 2018 exemption or to appeal your property assessment is September 18, 2018.* 

Many property owners ignore their TRIM Notice until it is too late to appeal an assessment, question the proposed tax rates or file for exemptions. If you wait until you receive your tax bill in November to inquire about your assessment, you will lose your right to appeal. The first thing to know is your taxes are calculated using this formula:

#### TAXABLE VALUE x TAX MILLAGE RATES + SPECIAL ASSESS-MENTS = TAX BILL

The Property Appraiser determines the market and assessed/Save Our Homes value of your property. Your tax rates and non-ad valorem fees are set by the various taxing authorities (school board, county commission, city commission, hospital district board, water management district, and so on) listed on your TRIM Notice. If you want to question your proposed tax rates, non-ad valorem fees, special assessments, or services, you should contact the elected officials who serve on the taxing authorities and attend the public hearings in September, 2018.

Important: The Property Appraiser does not set your tax rates or collect your taxes. Your tax rates are set by the city & county commissions, school board, and other taxing authorities. Additionally, any PACE (Property Assessed Clean Energy) assessments are not included on the TRIM Notice but will appear on the November tax bill sent by the Broward County Tax Collector.

#### Why Are My Property Taxes Higher than the Prior Owner's Last Year?

Florida law requires property be reassessed at market value as of January 1st, the year following a change in ownership and/or the year the property receives/loses the Homestead Exemption.

After this reset in value occurs, the property will be protected by an assessment cap starting the following year. For Homesteaded property, the Assessed/Save Our Homes (SOH) Value can increase by no more than 3% above last year's Assessed/SOH Value (or the consumer price index, whichever is less), regardless of the increase in just value. For tax year 2018, the assessment increase is capped at 2.1% for all Homesteaded properties. For non-Homesteaded property, the assessed value can increase by no more than 10% above last year's assessed value. The 10% cap does not apply to the School Board taxes.

### Police Department Sets High Goal By Applying For Accreditation



It's an exciting time here at the Coconut Creek Police Department! We have applied for initial accreditation through the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation, or the CFA for short. Only around 30 % of all law enforcement agencies in the state are fully accredited by the CFA. The accreditation requirements include nearly 250 benchmarks in professional standards, many of which we must meet to gain initial accreditation.

Accreditation signals that your

police department functions at the highest levels in professionalism, transparency, and accountability. It means that the department not only "talks the talk," if you will, on working together with the community, but it also "walks the walk" with citizens to make a difference in their neighborhoods. The CFA doesn't tell our command staff how to run the department, but it does provide a set of proven policies and procedures that ensure success in crime prevention, crime reduction, and officer accountability.

Three CFA certified assessors will spend three days here at the department in late August going over all our policies, doing ride-alongs with officers, and talking one-on-one with employees. They'll perform a thorough, top-to-bottom, review of the entire department and give an initial report of their findings before leaving. The assessors will issue a full report to the Commission and the Commission will then meet in Clearwater Beach in September. We are confident the Coconut Creek Police Department will be awarded accreditation!

We're confident because we've spent the past two years preparing for this process and this visit by these three assessors. We have made sure all our policies and procedures are in line with the wishes of the CFA. There will be some challenges ahead, but you can rest assured that we are prepared to meet them. We have several officers, and an accreditation manager, who know the CFA well and have used their knowledge and training to help us get ready for this on-site assessment. It's been easier because a lot of the best practices outlined by the CFA are things we are already doing.

Probably the most important thing about accreditation is what it will mean for you, the resident of Coconut Creek. I firmly believe that it should make you even prouder of this outstanding police department! Accreditation will only enhance the positive synergy that is already going on here in the Creek between its residents and its police department. Our officers really care about you and believe wholeheartedly in community policing.

We look forward to our on-site visit and gaining accreditation in September. This will also be a goal that we cannot achieve without your help. We would like to thank you for being such good neighbors and striving to make positive differences in your community. When we work together, nothing can stop us!

## **Boudicca: She Objected**

Boudicca was a tall red-headed woman with a harsh voice and was trained, like other Celtic women, in warfare. At eighteen, she married Prasutagas, the King of Iceni. It was only one of several of the independent kingdoms left in England after the Roman conquest. To preserve his domain, Prasutagus willed half his kingdom to his daughters and the other half to Nero, the Emperor of Rome, thinking this would preserve his kingdom after his death. Boudicca was not included in the will because of her known hatred for the Romans. Prasutagas believed at least part of his kingdom could be saved by willing half his kingdom to Nero and the other half to his daughters. Unfortunately, Roman officials in England had other plans for Prasutagas's land. They did not recognize the right of women to own property, inherit property, or rule over men. They claimed Prasutagus owed money to Rome and confiscated all the land. Backed by the armed troops, Roman officials went to Iceni and appropriated all Boudicca's land and assets. Boudicca stood her ground and protested. In typical Roman fashion, Boudica was taken to the public square, stripped and flogged. Then her two daughters were raped.

She was not going to be treated like trash and be thrown out to decay. When it was over, she clothed herself, gathered her two daughters, and began to raise an army of 100,00 warriors to throw Rome out of Briton. She called on the men of her kingdom and neighboring states and told them, she, a woman, was going to crush the Romans and the men could do what they wanted. Over 100,000 warriors followed her when she marched on Camulodunum, the Roman provincial Capital. Camulodunum (Colchester) was a Roman colony inhabited by Roman veterans and locals who supported them. Boudicca showed no mercy as her army destroyed the city and killed everyone in Camulodunm.

When the IX Legion came to relieve the town, they were ambushed and slaughtered to the last man. Boudicca then marched her army to Londinium (London), burned the city to the ground and again, killed anyone who had not evacuated. Next, she marched to Verulamium (St. Albans), laid waste to the town and massacred the entire population. In total, over 90,000 were killed by Boudicca's forces.

While the Roman report was greatly exaggerated, it is estimated that Boudicca had an army that was estimated at three to four times larger than the Roman force. This was to be the final battle that would throw Rome out of Briton. The Roman commander strategically positioned his smaller force in a narrow field that was surrounded by dense woods. From this position, there was no escape, no place to run. They had to fight or die. The Celtic forces massed in front of them but were limited in their movements by the close quarters and could not take advantage of the superior numbers. The Celtic force brought their wives and children along to watch the obliteration of the Romans. Their families positioned their carts and baggage tightly behind their forces to have the best vantage point to watch the battle.

With crazed war cries, the screaming Britons ran at a full charge and stormed the Roman formation. For over 700 years, the Romans had developed and perfected their battle tactics, which resulted in conquering most of the known world. After the first throw of javelins, the front line of the Brits lay dead or wounded. The second launch of javelins decimated the next line of Celts. The momentum of the charge thrust the Brits against the shields and deadly short swords of the Romans. Using the square formation, the Roman the massive charge. Once stopped, the Romans, in perfect unison, began to move forward step by military precision step. With each step, they thrust their swords into the bodies of the Boudicca's troops.

It was only a matter of time and the Brits broke and ran. Unfortunately, they were entrapped by their own baggage carts. Disordered and running for their lives, the Romans methodically moved forward and slaughtered not only the trapped warriors, but their wives and children. It was payback. Boudicca and her daughters escaped, only to take poison rather than be drug back to Rome as trophies of war. This battle changed the course of history. Instead of being driven out of Briton, Rome continued to rule Briton for another 350 years.

## **Keep Your Car in Good Condition**

# Good Sugars, Bad Sugars: It's All About The Company You Keep

Television's Dr. Oz and Cleveland Clinic's, Dr. Roizen, report on health, wellness and quality of life.

"The principle difference between heaven and hell," said Lois McMaster Bujold, a Hugoaward-winning science fiction writer, "is the company you keep there." The same might be said for the principle difference between added sugars and syrups and sugars that occur naturally in various foods, from strawberries to 100 percent whole grains.

We're always going on about the evils of added sugars, but conversations with folks around the country have made us realize that you may not understand why it makes a difference to get moderate levels of glucose and fructose from fresh foods instead of highly processed and packaged foods. It's all about the company they keep!

Carbohydrates (sugars are carbs) are found

in all fruits, veggies, and whole grains. You need them to live. All carbohydrates metabolize into simple sugars (glucose and fructose) in your body, feeding your brain, which feasts on glucose. It provides you with energy and interacts with insulin secretion to maintain healthy blood glucose levels.

When the sugars are found in or metabolized from fiber-rich veggies, fruits, and 100 % whole grains, they're digested slowly, fueling you without causing an unhealthy rise in blood sugar levels, damaging your gut biome or disrupting your metabolic processes.

When carbs and sugars are fed to your body in highly processed foods, they're digested quickly and spike your blood sugar levels. That hit of glucose attaches to proteins in your blood and renders them dysfunctional.

When your proteins malfunction, they challenge your body to secrete sufficient insulin. When challenged repeatedly, your body may become insulin-resistant, and chronic high blood sugar results, heading you toward full-blown Type 2 diabetes.

Does that mean you can eat naturally occurring sugars without restraint? No. Once again, it depends on the company they keep. For example, we advocate skipping even 100 % fruit juices (stripped of fiber) in favor of the whole fruit. Why? One medium-size orange has about 10 to 13 grams of sugar; a 16-ounce glass of orange juice packs in 37 grams of the sweet stuff. You'd never eat three oranges in one sitting! And too



much sugar, even natural sugar, has metabolic consequences, including packing on pounds and triggering inflammation.

What about high fructose corn syrup? When you down a dose of (always added, never natural) HFCS, which is packed into many processed foods, from ketchup to frozen dinners, studies show that it affects liver function and can boost uric acid levels (gout anyone?) and blood lipids. There's also evidence that it's particularly damaging when combined with excessive added glucose/starch intake (French fries dipped in ketchup, for example). Reduce your intake, and you reduce risk factors for metabolic disease and obesity.

Don't think cane or corn sugar or expellerextracted rice sugar is a good alternative for

your body. One of the current myths is that having a soda made with cane sugar is a healthier choice than having one laced with HFCS. Wrong. Added "free" sugar is added sugar and it targets your gut, metabolism, blood lipids, liver, brain, and other organs with inflammatory chemicals just like HFCS does.

The debate over the evils of HFCS goes on since its super-use began in the mid-70s. Is it a coincidence that that's when our obesity epidemic burst upon the scene? Princeton researchers found that rats fed HFCS gained far more weight and fat than sugar-fed rats getting equal calorie loads. We think the important point, echoed in this Food and Drug Administration statement, is that ALLADDED SUGARS should be avoided. We are not aware of any evidence, that there is a difference in safety, between foods containing HFCS 42 (that's 42 % fructose) or HFCS 55 (55 % fructose) and foods with approximately equal glucose and fructose content, such as sucrose, honey or other traditional sweeteners. The 2010 Dietary Guidelines for Americans recommend that everyone limit consumption of all added sugars, including HFCS and sucrose. Just don't keep company with ANY of them!
