And The Music Plays On

It is a comfortable Tuesday summer's night in the neighborhood of my youth. The year is around 1944. Children will soon stream out of their homes to follow our own Pied Piper - Major Drews, conducting the City Municipal Band, which will emerge from the local high school to practice marching up and down the nearby residential streets.

This excellent group, with a unique formation, steps brightly to the drum cadences led by several rows of percussionists. After an introductory drum roll, the entire band marches up between these rows to play instruments and take the lead. When the music (often by John Phillip Sousa) ends, the drummers once again come to the fore and resume rhythmic patterns.

We children, absolutely enchanted, follow them.

My decision about which instrument to study stems from this weekly experience. I chose snare drum, joined the junior high band and then the high school band, loving both the playing and the camaraderie -- and most especially performing during the half-time intervals of our football games and occasional parades.

My parents were most encouraging, and my father even invested by renting a compete drum set for the huge sum of \$5 a month (with a three-month minimum). We placed it out-of-the-way in the basement, and I struggled to master this, placing right foot on the base drum pedal, left foot on pedal for the high hat cymbal, and doing different - separate -- rhythms with left and right hand -- all in a schizophrenic attempt to accompany Gene Krupa records.

It all paid off, and in my senior year, I rose to the high position of First Chair of the Percussion Section of the Washington High School Band. Therefore, it was with high hopes that I set off for the University of Wisconsin in 1952, ready to sign up for band. Imagine the shock and horror when I reached the

Director and was told in ringing tones: "No girls in the marching band." My career was over.

Years passed. I married and had two daughters. Tracy enjoyed guitar and Marla studied Clarinet. In fact, Marla met her trumpet-playing husband in her high school band where they were both band officers.

So, I stopped in 1952, but began again when Marla and Steve, now married -- formed a Skokie band and invited me to join. Hurrah -- a rebirth. However, it only lasted a short time (around two years), and I retired again, not to reawaken until, as a senior citizen, I joined the North Shor, a local New Horizons' band (one of 220 worldwide), especially for our advanced age group.

Now, in 2020, there is the pandemic. Bands don't meet. Bands stop playing. Enter technology and SMART MUSIC!

Not only are there virtual bands via Zoom, but there are an entirely new teaching and participating techniques. Before this, I could always request a song on YouTube and play along with it. SMART MUSIC puts this technique in the shade. With SMART MUSIC I can request a song, see the music for my part, hear a metronome, set the time at any speed, and follow a blue shadow as it marks the music while I play. I can play with a full accompaniment or alone.

If I wish, I can ask the program to mark properly played notes in green and mistakes in red. I can SEE and HEAR what I am doing right while it is happening. I can request that the score loops in order to repeat difficult parts and at the end can request a recording. If this were part of an academic course, I could send this to my teachers for comments and grades. I had always been told that I tended to speed up. Now, for the first time I saw where this consistently happened and can correct it. I can learn so much more than ever before.

Imagine the difference between playing at home alone, or with YouTube, and not being sure whether you were successful. There is no feedback. With Continued on page 10



Would we cat sit in her Lincolnwood condo? Sure!


What a character. He moved in with food and three toys -a brush (that he loved), a pom pom on a stick (which he hated) and a laser pointer (which he ignored).

What does our office do?

Our office receives numerous calls every year asking us to confirm property tax exemptions on the recent tax bills. The Property Appraiser's Office does not set your tax rates or collect property taxes. Florida law requires our office to assess all property based on the market data on January 1 of each year. We are also able to grant tax exemptions to qualified applicants. Our office does not determine the tax rates or determine how the tax revenue is allocated by local government. The property tax bills are mailed by the Broward County's Records, Taxes & Treasury Division.

Where is my 2021 Homestead Exemption?

The tax bill you received this November from the Broward County Tax Collector is for the 2020 tax year. If you purchased your home in 2020 and the previous owners of your new home were entitled to and received Homestead Exemption or any other exemption on January 1, 2020, you may have inherited their exemptions on your 2020 property tax bill. Florida Statutes require these 2020 exemptions be removed for 2021 and the property be reassessed at the 2021 just value. This will often result in an increase in your 2021 property taxes so it is important you apply for 2021 Homestead Exemption and any other exemptions for which you may qualify. Your new 2021 Homestead Exemption will be reflected next year on all 2021 property records, notices

and tax bills. Any exemptions applied to the tax bill are totaled and shown in the third column "Exemptions" on the individual tax bill.

Escrow Adjustments for 2020 Tax Bills


The Property Appraiser's Office does not handle anything related to the financing of property. If you make monthly escrow payments for your property taxes, your mortgage or escrow company typically does an escrow analysis after paying your annual tax bill. Any changes to your monthly payment will be determined and they will notify you. Should you have any questions about this, you should contact your mortgage company directly for assistance.

Quarterly Installment Payments

If you pay your property taxes through Broward County's quarterly installment plan, any newly approved 2020 exemptions will be applied on the 3rd and 4th installment payment amounts. Any adjustments for 2020 are made on the final two quarterly 2020 installment payments.

two children from her first husband. Her family was very religious when she was younger, and she always went to church with her mother. Everyone on both sides of her family were registered Republicans and they voted for conservative candidates religiously for many years. In December 2019, Gloria was still registered as a Republican. She is complicated based on her views on Homosexuals and the "Welfare Program" in America. She said, "I believe 99 percent of homosexuals or gay people were born like that - it was not their choice." When I asked her to elaborate on her statement, here are summaries of what she told me.

• She explained how some children were born blind, crippled or deaf and doctors had no explanations as to why or what happened, especially when both parents were healthy. She believes the same misery happens when a child is born gay.

She maintained, if not, America will have millions of poor people sleeping and living on streets just as in many countries that do not have Welfare Programs.

emotions will be at a fever pitch of intensity in preparation for the next few days (or weeks or months) of the election, you will be shocked and saddened by the continuing Covid losses, (will it ever end), economic problems if not for yourselves then for a family member or friend, and the myriad effects of continuing isolation, uncertainty and fear.

I am also aware, that anything I wrote, you had probably already read and thought about and might not remember anyway. So...this month let's take a break... We'll look at a question posed to me as a result of last month's article with an eye toward short, light, feel-good, and grandmotherly wisdom.

Last month, we looked at five ordinary (or better said extraordinary) neighbors who I called mensch. We defined mensch, and a neighbor who hadn't heard the word, asked if they could be a mensch too. I had never heard that question before since in my family growing up, we were expected to be mensches. In growing up in the real world I was continuously surprised when people I met were anything but. So back to the question. In this very complicated world right now, what if everyone here in Wynmoor worked at menschhood (is that a word?). It might mean getting to know some of your neighbors better. You might find a hidden gem.

One of the things we have in abundance now is time. For instance, if you are going to the store ask a neighbor if they need anything. Or, if you are going to BJ's, do they want a cooked chicken (which could provide them with many delicious meals). As a tribute to the times- hand sanitizer, wipes or paper towels. So easy, yet how many times have you done it? Are you able to help with a computer or TV remote or home gadgets? You are golden. If someone is sitting alone by the elevator, consider stopping to talk (with a mask). In my building the benches are about six feet apart. Particularly for those living alone this is really special - just a few minutes time. Richard helps me out of the pool each day. I could not go in without his help and that is a huge part of my physical therapy. Patricia brought me a plant when I was feeling down and Koral taught me Facebook. Charlotte's face at my door with something home cooked or something they have purchased or been given in excess, is always a treat. All are such small things. Be creative. And I try to do the same for my friends and neighbors - to pay it forward.

We cannot change the world around us but with so little effort we can make a dent in the fear, uncertainty and isolation here - at least for a little while. And you might be surprised how good being a mensch makes you feel.



A Few Thoughts As We Move Into November



Coconut Creek Police Department Special Needs Database:

You might have noticed our response early on the morning of October 6th after an 81-yearold Wynmoor resident left her apartment unannounced and her nurse could not find her. We sent every available officer to the area to search. We also had help from the Broward County Sheriff's Office, which sent us a helicopter

and a bloodhound tracking team.

Luckily, after almost four hours, we found the woman, who has an Alzheimer's diagnosis, in the stairwell of a nearby apartment building. Ironically, she told one of our officers she was scared to be seen because of all the police presence in the area. She thought something bad was going on.

We have a Special Needs Database in which caregivers, loved ones, and health aides can use to help us find seniors with conditions such as Alzheimer's or dementia or sometimes wander. It can be found on our website (www.coconutcreek.net/pd/police) on the right-hand portion of the page under the "Community Services" heading. You can enter all of your loved one's information into the database, ranging from height and weight, to what kind of car they drive, to destinations where they might

go if they leave your residence unannounced. You can even upload a current picture of your loved one for all those using the database to see.

The only people allowed to see the database are officers and dispatchers. It's very advantageous for us because, if all the information and a picture are already in the database when officers are dispatched to the call that an individual is missing, they don't have to spend all of that time collecting that information.



Digital Seniors: You're Never Too Old to Learn New Tech Tricks!





College Debt Is "Good" Debt A Message to Grandparents for their Grandchildren

Among other financial planning specialties, I am a Financial College Planner, and I am continually surprised at the fuss made about students leaving college with outstanding loans. A few years back President Obama issued an Executive Order "capping" the amount of loan that needs to be repaid each year. There may be some students, usually not undergraduates, who do have significant loan obligations when leaving graduate school. However, the average debt of an undergraduate student following graduation is about \$30,000. This number also includes those students who do not finish in 4 years (only about 40% do finish in 4 years). Interest on these loans is quite low and students have many years to pay them off. If the payoff period commenced upon the day of graduation, a \$30,000 loan at 5% for 10 years would require a payment of \$240/mo.

On the other hand, one of the first things a student does when starting their first job is to get a car. Let's do the math in this instance. A \$20,000 car financed for 5 years

at the same 5% rate would require a payment of \$377/mo. with no down payment. Of course there are cheaper cars, longer loan terms, and not all students have \$30,000 in loans. Many students who attend private institu-

tions will often carry lower debt. Today especially, it also takes some college graduates to find suitable employment following graduation, but in the long term, a college education should provide at least \$1 million more in income than that earned with a high school education alone. That's not a bad investment!

Notwithstanding the current pandemic, the point here is that one needs to keep everything in perspective. The college loan is "good" debt, as it should prove to have been a prudent investment for the student's future. A car loan is "bad" debt, as the value of that asset only depreciates over time. Besides the value of just traveling between points for personal use, it provides no additional value.

In order to send a student to college, the college takes risk when providing merit aid or grants, the State in providing grants takes risks and, of course, the parents usually assume much of the risk in sending a child off to college. So why shouldn't the student have some skin in the game

as well? It's amazing at how much better a student performs when they also have something to lose due to poor performance. Just saying... See our ad on page 31.

The Spanish Flu is a misnomer. Ninety-nine percent of researchers agree that the Spanish Flu was not Spanish nor did it originate in Spain. In Fort Riley, Kansas, soldiers at Camp Funston were the first recorded cases of what became known as the Spanish Flu.

When these American troops were sent to Europe to fight Germany in WW1, they transmitted the flu throughout Europe and the world. As soldiers returned to America after the war, they brought the unwelcomed tag-along disease with them. Once here, it wasted no time and raced through every state leaving fields of gravestones in every community across the country. The Influenza infected 500 million and killed between 20-50 million people before its worldwide run was exhausted. An estimated 600,000 Americans lost their lives to the Spanish Flu.

A devastating pandemic, yes. However, the effects could have been lessened with honesty and immediate response to the outbreak. Regrettably, dishonesty, hesitation, and inaction killed far too many. Why?


As the war raged in Europe, the countries involved in that conflict gave more attention to reporting on battles than the pandemic. Part of their rationale was not to overload citizens with more depressing news. Immediate government input could have blunted the death toll. A pitiful and almost nonexistent acknowledgment of the situation by federal and state governments in the early stages of the crisis only exacerbated the problem. The government left cities and local communities to their own resources and capabilities in dealing with the pandemic.

As dead bodies continued to mount, metropolitan areas, suburbs, and rural communities were at the mercy of the disease. The flu was no respecter of persons. Government agencies encouraged quarantines, closures, social distancing, wearing masks, and avoiding large gatherings. Some listened, others did not, some inflamed the situation. "New York City's public health director waved away calls for greater vigilance, finding that other bronchial diseases and not the so-called Spanish influenza... [caused] the illness of the majority of persons who were reported ill with influenza." Colonel Philipp Doane, who led health and safety at the military shipyards of Philadelphia where the disease first spread, dismissed the so-called Spanish influenza as "nothing more or less than the old-fashioned grippe." Philadelphia's Director of Public Health and Charities, Dr. Wilmer Krusen, assured the public that the flu would just go away and downplayed the crisis, not wanting to frighten people. On his recommendation, the city held a Liberty Loan Parade that was attended by thousands. Over 200,000 became sick with the flu and thousands died in Philadelphia.

Cities like St. Louis and San Francisco required masks, closure of schools, movie theaters, and large gatherings. San Francisco even fined people for not wearing masks. Cities that responded immediately saw much fewer cases and deaths than those that ignored the warnings.

Hesitation and ignorance spawned unnecessary death.

Avoiding Probate On Your Home

There are several ways to avoid probate on your home when you die. If you are single, there will be probate when you die unless you choose one of the following options. If you are married and own your home together, your surviving spouse will not have probate; however, there will be probate when the second of you passes away, unless one of these options is done.

Let us assume that you own your home jointly with your spouse and that you have two children. Both of you desire to have your two children inherit your home equally when you both pass away.

The first option would be to add the names of your two children to the Deed as joint tenants with right of

survivorship. This is not a good idea. It would affect your ability to claim your full homestead exemption. In addition, you lose control of your property and can only sell it if your children both agree and sign all closing documents. If you wanted to take one of the children off the Deed, you would be unable to do so. If one of your children files for bankruptcy, has an adverse judgment or files for divorce, your property could be subject to liens or other legal action. Therefore, I recommend against a Deed with your children as joint tenants with right of survivorship.

The second option is a Life Estate Deed. There are two types of Life Estate Deed: regular and Enhanced (also referred to as Lady Bird). The regular Life Estate Deed requires that your children join in any sale or other changes on the Deed; therefore, you have lost control and cannot take your child's name off the Deed if you choose to do so. The Enhanced Life Estate Deed gives you the sole right to sell the property during your lifetime or make any other changes to the Deed without the permission of your child. The Enhanced Life Estate Deed has very specific legal language in order to be effective; therefore, do not attempt to do this on your own.

Even with the Enhanced Life Estate Deed, there are risks, particularly



if your child has a bankruptcy, outstanding judgment or undergoes divorce. The worst risk, however, is if, God forbid, your child dies before you or with you in a common accident. Your child's estate would then become the owner of the property once you died, which would result in probate being required. Thus, the main purpose of the Life Estate Deed is not accomplished.

The best way to avoid probate on your home is to do a Revocable Living Trust. When you sign the Revocable Living Trust Agreement, you also sign a Deed transferring the property to you as Trustees of your Trust. You are able to keep your homestead exemption, maintain complete control of the property during your

lifetime and make amendments to your Trust without changing the Deed. There are no risks involved, since your children's names do not appear on the Deed. The only disadvantage of the Revocable Living Trust is that it will cost more money in attorney's fees. When you discuss the options with your attorney, you should discuss the difference in fees between the Revocable Living Trust and the Enhanced Life Estate Deed. You can then determine whether it is worth saving the money and taking the risks involved in the Enhanced Life Estate Deed.



Dear Dr. Joy...

I was asked about dementia a little while back and although the following article was published in January 2016, I decided to rerun it here.

It is very likely that all of us have been, are, or will be, touched by this horrible illness in one way or another. It may be our parents,

spouse, siblings, friends or even ourselves. Since I am not a psychiatrist and have not dealt with this professionally in a direct way, I have looked into quite a few important factors that I will share with you. I have, on the other hand, worked with many people who have been directly affected because of loved ones and will touch upon 'caregiver syndrome' as well.

Causes: Dementia, as most of us know, is a catchphrase for impaired cognitive functioning and can have many causes. Alzheimer's Disease is the type we are most familiar with, but dementia can be caused by strokes, brain trauma, drugs (both prescription and otherwise), vitamin deficiencies, and illnesses such as Parkinson's and alcoholism. Theories abound as to aluminum cookware also being a potential cause although this has not been confirmed by medical science.

One Canadian study showed that people with a lifetime of bilingualism had an onset delay of about four years, from 71.4 to 75.5 on average. Although this is an interesting statistic it does little for people in our age group unless they are already bilingual.

Symptoms: Forgetfulness is the prime and most immediately noticeable symptom and is usually seen first in short-term memory. For example, at breakfast the person may ask a question and an hour later ask the same one again. At first you might think your answer wasn't heard or paid attention to and after another time you might become short-tempered and impatient. Slowly you will realize that the answer just was not remembered. It never went into the person's memory bank and will be asked repeatedly. Another early symptom is misplacing things or putting them in strange places. I realize that sometimes we might put our keys in the refrigerator, but it is usually because we were holding them while looking for something or putting something away and just put them down and left them there. This is not the case with early dementia, and we will find this event occurring more and more frequently.

Sometimes the person will forget how to do a task like tying their shoes or

turning on the oven. If it is early enough in their illness that will upset them, and they will become frightened and perhaps even belligerent. They may make up stories as to why they can't do what they were able to do before but because their cognitive functioning is impaired the stories will be hollow and probably not make sense.

Another sign is mixing up and/or forgetting words. Because their communication skills are lessening, there is a tendency to withdraw and not bother trying to understand or to get their point across at all. This often leads to a general malaise and mood swings are also not uncommon. Since they are having trouble with their reasoning skills, they just get frustrated and angry which leads to deeper withdrawal.

You may also notice that they have become somewhat disoriented as to time and place. Their sense of time is off, and they don't remember when something occurred. When taken out, especially in a car, they have trouble recognizing where they are or how far from home they are.

By the time they no longer recognize you or other close family members it is often too late for drugs to intervene and slow the progression.

Caregiving: This is a tragic scenario for all involved and a time when family members must join forces and give each other strength and support (both in the physical, emotional and financial sense).

It has been estimated that the life-expectancy of the caregiver is reduced by about 10 years and it is no wonder. Here is a situation that will only worsen over time and although new drugs have been promising, there is still no cure.

It's an interesting phenomenon that many victims of non-Alzheimer dementia often stay alive longer than average, especially if they are cared for at home by a loved one. However, the health of the caregiver deteriorates rapidly. The most important thing this person can do for themselves is to get help; whether it is another family member or professional assistance, it is crucial to not do it all yourself and to also know when it is time to let go and place the person in a full time care facility.

If you suspect that someone you love is in the early stages of any form of dementia from any cause, please see a physician at once. The available drugs work best when given as early as possible and may give them and you some quality time that wouldn't be had otherwise.





Avoid Financial Mistakes During Retirement

When you retire, you've learned a lot about all sorts of things, helping you avoid some of the mistakes you made earlier in life. However, you may still be susceptible to financial missteps specifically related to your retirement years. How can you dodge these errors?

Consider these suggestions:

• Manage your withdrawal rate carefully. You will likely need to tap into your retirement accounts – your IRA and 401(k) or similar employersponsored plan. But you should establish an annual withdrawal rate that's appropriate for your situation. By withdrawing too much each year, especially in the early years of your retirement, you risk outliving your resources. You may want to consult with a financial professional to determine the withdrawal amount that's right for you. (Keep in mind, though, that once you turn 72, you will be required to take out at least a certain amount each year – based on your age and account balance – from your traditional IRA and 401(k) or similar plan.)

• **Don't underestimate health care costs.** Once you turn 65, you will be eligible for Medicare, but you may still need a Medicare supplement plan and will probably also incur other expenses. In fact, A healthy 65-year-old couple who retired in 2019 will need nearly \$390,000 over their remaining years just to pay for health care, according to HealthView Services, which produces health-care cost projection software. Other estimates show different amounts, but they all amount to hundreds of thousands of dollars. So, when calculating your expenses during your retirement years, reserve a big space for health care.

• **Don't take Social Security too early.** You can start receiving monthly Social Security checks when you reach age 62, but your payments will

generally be significantly larger if you wait until your "full" retirement age, which will probably be between 66 and 67. (The size of your payments will "max out" at age 70.) Of course, if you need the money at 62, you may have to take it, but if you believe you have longevity working in your favor, and you can afford to wait, you may be better off by delaying Social Security as long as possible.


• **Don't invest too conservatively.** Once you're retired, you might think that you should take as few chances as possible with your investments – after all, you simply have less time for them to bounce back from a downturn than you did during your working years. Nonetheless, it's important to own a reasonable percentage of growth-oriented investments to help keep you ahead of inflation. Even at a low rate, which we've experience recently, inflation can erode your purchasing power over time.

• **Don't be more generous than you can afford.** If you have grown children who need financial help, or grandchildren heading to college someday, you'd no doubt like to do whatever you can to provide assistance. However, the hard truth is they simply have more time than you do to find workable financial solutions, whereas if you deplete your funds through your generosity, you could put yourself in a precarious position. So, be as giving as you can afford – but don't go beyond that. By preserving your financial independence, you'll end up benefiting your family, as well.

Retirement can be a wonderful time of your life – and you may enjoy it more by doing what you can to avoid costly financial mistakes.





You may not find all of these terms in your rule book but here's a sample of the common jargon I've learned in golf.

Lob Shot or Flop Shot - Usually with your highest lofted wedge. Very defensive shot with high launch angle and soft landing.

Bump and Run - Implies you will land your ball just short of the green and then run up to the pin. Very common in Europe usually on golf courses that aren't as lush and poorer lies from the fairway necessitates safer approach.

Rehearsal Swing - A practice swing prior to your real shot.

Pin High - your shot had the proper distance and you are either right or left of the hole

Flier or Jumper - Implies because of water, grass or some foreign substance interferes with the backspin on the ball. Typically goes further than normal distance.

The Turn - The 10th hole or start of back nine

Explosion Shot - Describes a sand shot where the sand displaces the ball.

Gimme - A putt you have to count the stroke yet deemed so close you don't actually putt it.

Mulligan or Lunch Ball - An extra shot commonly taken on first tee but not in tournament play.

Punch Shot - A shot utilized in windy conditions. The finish of your swing is abbreviated keeping the balls trajectory lower than normal.

Halve - Term used in match play meaning a tie on the hole or match.

Fat - Implies you made contact with the ground before the ball

Thin - You did not strike the ground with your stroke and typically has a lower flight




