





Not Easy to Talk About Death-But! By Mobolaji Adedoyin

I know it is not easy to talk about death or dying, especially in December, when many people are thinking about a new year starting soon. One of my friends does not like to use the word die, he always says "When I close my eyes." If you are over seventy years of age closing your eyes one day must cross your mind once awhile, especially when you know and hear that people younger than you close their eyes daily.

An uncle once said, "There is no guarantee a pregnant woman would give birth to a healthy child, but right after that child is born, he or she is sentenced to die one day." It took me a few decades to really understand what my uncle was trying to say many moons ago. Death is a debt everyone must pay no matter how nice, beautiful, or good looking you are. No one lives forever. Just because you don't talk about death or dying does not mean it won't happen to you. You must as well be prepared for it, especially if you have children, loved ones, and friends you love and hopefully love you in return.

I said hopefully love you too because there is a saying, "You can be sure whom you love, but you cannot be too sure who loves you." Love is a complicated word with different definitions by different people. There is also various levels, and degrees of positive feelings or affection for someone. It is possible to love someone very much as neighbor for several years, but is that love to a level you wouldn't mind burying that person when he or she dies?

I talked to ten friends and neighbors over seventy years of age about dying. Here are what I found out:

• Every one of them admitted that dying crosses their minds once awhile.

Six out of ten of those people said they are ready to die at any time. I was expecting more to say they are ready.
A follow up question to those that claimed they are ready for death was,

"Do you have a "Will" or instructions for your children, family, or friend(s) on what you want after you close your eyes?" Four out of those six answered positively. One of them said he does not care how his two daughters bury him - he has funds for them to bury him. The sixth person said he plans to write few instructions for his only son soon.

• Three out of those ten people do not have a "Will" or instructions for their loved ones. One of them with three children from two different women, said he does not want to even think about a "Will" or instructions.

• One person admitted she has no children or relatives alive that would bury her. Her younger sister died about two years ago, after Covid arrived in America. She also did not have any offspring. I know it is very difficult for someone without loved ones to think about death, but you should at least let a close friend know the County or State must bury you. I wish everyone dies peacefully.

There's even a secret garden within one of the secret gardens!

"The gardens are important to see, and this is a great incentive to get residents out and into the outdoors," says Commissioner John Brodie. "It is also a good way see what native plants can attract. And playing off the city's Arbor Day initiatives, this program extends from our current efforts."

The tour ends in Veterans Park that honors those who served, and then leads to the city's Hometown Market for eats, drinks, gardening tools and accessories.

Wynmoor WOODSHOP By Ernest Fleury

In March 2022, the Wynmoor Woodworking Club donated \$5,000 to the Coconut Creek Education Foundation. The Foundation will distribute the funds in the form of a scholarship to qualified Coconut Creek students seeking a career in any discipline of Vocational Education. A letter of appreciation is proudly displayed in the left display window of the shop.

Nominations of the 4 officers and the 6-member Executive Board are now being accepted. Nominations will be announced at the December 2nd meeting. Voting will be held at the January 6, 2023 meeting, and the names of the elected officers will be announced. Members are encouraged to participate.

Wynmoor residents regularly stop by the shop with all kinds of minor repair work from chairs to kitchen drawers. If it's made of wood, we could!

If the Woodshop were to display all the crafts that our members produce monthly, we would need two pages. This month we randomly selected some of the most recent creations.

1. This tanker truck was left at the front door of the Woodshop one morning in a Whole Foods shopping bag. When it was still there at 3:00 p.m. one of the members looked into the bag and found this unfinished wood truck. Research found that it was of Amish origin and worth \$59 unfinished. Ernie tightened the wheels and prepped it for Marty Levin to perform his magic. He finished it with lacquer paint, 2 mirrors, a grill and finished it with Water-based poly gloss.

2. This 8" x 9" bowl was created by Dave Norcross from a 12" Cataphylln log and finished with 2 coats of Danish oil and 6 coats of poly gloss. His lighthouse in this photo is incomplete, but in the next publication he will have added two houses, a skiff, grass, a rock-stone foundation and a bright harbor light to guide the ships safely into Freetown Mass. Harbor.

Dave used the Lichtenberg electromagnetic technique, a microwave element attached to two electrodes to create the unique effect on his 3-tier white oak lazy Susan.

3. Displayed by their proud creator, these 2 shallow bowls or dishes are made from 4 separate segmented circles of exotic hardwoods. The box (if there is a lid on a bowl it is called a box) consumed more than 40 hours of Karl Georgi's time. All three of these treasures have 2 coats of Danish oil and 12 coats of poly gloss.

4. This 14" x 30" painting belongs to Peter Charles who purchased it from a street vendor when he lived in Trinidad. Dave Norcross and Ernie fashioned a solid ash frame to compliment the life-like deep green hues.

5. Ernie and a frame he made.
















6. Everett Yankie created this extra-large bud vase with a glass insert for live flowers from a mahogany limb. The mini candy dish was once part of the limb. Yank doesn't smoke anymore, but his church Pastor smokes cigars. Yank made a cigar humidor, holder with a built-in tip cutter from Certified Bethlehem Olive Wood. Yank even sprang for a \$30 dollar cigar for the Pastor who will put in a good word with his Boss!

7. Steve Gleimer, Shop Treasurer, is displaying just three of the many items that he has created this year. Here he showcases a napkin caddy equipped with condiments ready for the dining room table or out on the patio. Steve's lazy Susan features 4 trivets for hot foods and finally, a neat variety of cute piggy banks for the little ones in his family.

Revocable Living Trust Important For Out of State Property

Are you a snowbird just returning to Florida for the winter? Some of my clients have their homestead in Florida; others declare their legal residence in another state.

In either case, a Revocable Living Trust is very useful to avoid probate in both states. If you are a Florida resident, you can own your homestead property via a Revocable Living Trust without losing your homestead exemption. In addition, you are eliminating the need for probate when you pass away. You can also transfer real estate owned in any



other state to your Florida Trust. Generally, a Florida lawyer will prepare the Revocable Living Trust and Quit Claim Deed to transfer the Florida property into the Trust. If you are a Florida resident, the lawyer will also prepare a new Florida Last Will and Testament called a Pourover Will. This provides for the transfer to your Trust upon your death of any other assets not in the Trust or which do not have beneficiaries already designated. It is a security blanket to cover any assets payable to your Estate. For example, if you were killed in a car accident due to the negligence of another driver, your Personal Representative would be able to settle your Estate's claim and "pourover" the proceeds into your Trust.

If you are not a Florida resident, you can still create a Revocable Living Trust and execute a Quit Claim Deed to put your Florida property into the Trust. Your Last Will and Testament will be done by a lawyer in the state in which you have your legal residence. In addition, that lawyer can prepare a Deed to transfer the out of state property into the Florida Trust. You can also do the Trust in your state of residence and have a Florida lawyer transfer your Florida property to that Trust.

For Canadian citizens, there are possible tax aspects to be considered before you create a Florida Trust. These should be discussed with your Canadian accountant or tax attorney. In general, you will have to weigh the tax consequences versus the money and time that your heirs would save by avoiding probate in Florida.

Another favorable factor in creating a Revocable Living Trust is that you can always amend the Trust without having to change the Deed. In addition, once you create the Trust, you can always buy new properties in any state in the name of the Trust.

The Revocable Living Trust is recommended by most lawyers over a Deed which includes names of other

persons, either as joint tenants, tenants in common or a Life Estate Deed. Once another person's name is on a Deed, there are potential risks to you and your property. These include the possibility that the other person may undergo a divorce, bankruptcy, have a judgment against them, or die before you or with you in a common accident. It may also affect your homestead exemption. All of these risks should be discussed with your attorney before deciding to put someone else's name on your Deed. By contrast, the Revocable Living Trust eliminates those risks, since no other name is on the Deed. You simply transfer it from yourself to yourself as Trustee of your Trust.



Holiday Scams to Watch Our For...And Remember **Our New Non-Emergency Phone Number**

As we are now well into the holiday season it's important to remember a few of the scams we always see around this time of year:

Too Good To Be True: Remember that

if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. If that name-brand sweater you found on some obscure on-line shopping website is half the price you find it at the store, then there's probably a reason. It's a scam. If someone on-line claims to have that hot toy item you want to buy your grandkids, and it's amazing because you can't find that toy anywhere else on-line or at the store because it's always sold out, remember there's a reason for that "good luck"- it's a scam.

"Hello... Grandma?": It's always around this time of year that there's an uptick in reports of the "Grandparents" scam. This is where your supposed grandchild calls out of the blue and needs holiday money because they're in some sort of need. They pretend to need travel money to make it back home. They claim that they're in trouble and need money for a lawyer. It's the scammers pretending to be your grandkid. With a little Internet sleuthing, the bad guys can find your grandchild's name. Never send any money without checking with another family member first.


"I'm sorry... I'm busy that night": We always recommend to conduct all transactions in person. If you find an item you want to buy a loved one as

a gift for the holidays, and the seller keeps making excuses as to why he or she can't meet you in person, we say skip the transaction. Our lobby at 4800 West Copans Road is a designated "Safe Zone" where you can conduct inperson buying and selling. If the seller is legit, he or she won't mind meeting you in the police department lobby.

Porch Pirates: Package thieves love this time of year because of all the on-line shopping that we do nowadays. If you tell UPS, FedEx, or the Post Office to leave a package you've purchased at your front door, then it's a target for these "porch pirates" who might walk up and steal it. Be sure to use all of the delivery service's tracking technology. See about having the package delivered directly to the store and go pick it up there. Ask your boss if you can have it delivered to work. If you're not home, ask a trusted neighbor to grab it for you.

Don't forget that we have a new non-emergency phone number: Early in November, we joined the City of Coral Springs E-911 dispatching services. This changed our non-emergency phone number to 954-346-4400. Go ahead and save that number in your phone so you'll have it handy. It's not designed to call during an emergency. That number is still 911. However you can call it if you see an injured animal, or a stalled out car at an intersection... just to name a couple of examples. The move over to Coral Springs dispatch has been coming along well and we look forward to continuing to work together with our new dispatchers to make a difference here in Coconut Creek.

COLA is Sweet for Social Security Recipients

If you receive Social Security, you've probably already heard that your checks in 2023 will be bigger – considerably bigger, in fact. How can you make the best use of this extra money?

Here's what's happening: For 2023, there's an 8.7% cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) for Social Security benefits – the largest increase in 40 years. Also, the monthly Medicare Part B premiums are declining next year, to \$164.90/month from \$170.10/month, which will also modestly boost Social Security checks for those enrolled in Part B, as these premiums are automatically deducted.

Of course, the sizable COLA is due to the high inflation of 2022, as the Social Security Administration uses a formula based on increases in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W). So, it's certainly possible that you will need some, or perhaps all, of your larger checks to pay for the increased cost of goods and services. But if your cash flow is already relatively strong, you might want to consider these suggestions for using your bigger checks:

• *Reduce withdrawals from your investment portfolio*. When you're retired, you will likely need to withdraw a certain amount from your portfolio each year to meet your expenses. A boost in your Social Security may enable you to withdraw less, at least for a year. This can be particularly advantageous when the markets are down, as you'd like to avoid, as much as possible, selling investments and withdrawing the money when investment prices are low. And the fewer investments you need to sell, the longer your portfolio may last during your retirement years.

• *Help build your cash reserves*. When you're retired, it's a good idea to maintain about a year's worth of the amount you'll spend from your

portfolio in cash, while also keeping three months of your spending needs in an emergency fund, with the money kept in a liquid, low-risk account. Your higher Social Security checks could help you build these cash reserves. (Also, it's helpful to keep another three to five years' worth of spending from your portfolio in short-term, fixed-income investments, which now, due to higher interest rates, offer better income opportunities.)

• *Contribute to a 529 plan.* You could use some of your extra Social Security money to contribute to a tax-advantaged 529 education savings plan for your grandchildren or other family members.

• *Contribute to charitable organizations*. You might want to use some of your Social Security money to expand your charitable giving. Your generosity will help worthy groups and possibly bring you some tax benefits, too.

While it's nice to have these possible options in 2023, you can't count on future COLA increases being as large. The jump in inflation in 2022 was due to several unusual factors, including pandemic-related government spending, supply shortages and the Russian invasion of Ukraine. It's quite possible, perhaps even likely, that inflation will subside in 2023, which, in turn, would mean a smaller COLA bump in 2024.

Nonetheless, while you might not want to include large annual COLA increases as part of your long-term financial strategy, you may well choose to take advantage, in some of the ways described above, of the bigger Social Security checks you'll receive in 2023. When opportunity knocks, you may want to open the door.

All qualified Florida residents are eligible to receive a Homestead Exemption on their homes, condominiums co-op apartments, and certain mobile home lots. To qualify for Homestead Exemption, you must own and make the property your permanent residence on January 1 of the year for which you are applying for this valuable exemption. Pursuant to Florida law, all assessments and exemptions are based upon the status of the property on January 1. If you purchased and/or made the property your permanent residence in 2022 and have not applied for Homestead Exemption, you can apply for 2023 exemptions at any time – there is no need to wait until 2023 to file your exemption application with the property appraiser's office. You can easily apply online at https://web.bcpa. net

The timely deadline to file for all 2023 exemptions is March 1, 2023. You must make the property your permanent residence by January 1, 2023 in order to qualify; however, you have until March 1 to timely file your application with the property appraiser's office. The late filing deadline for all 2023 exemptions is September 18, 2023. For information about all the other exemptions available to qualified applicants, please visit the "Exemptions & Classifications" page on our website https://web. bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/Homestead

Once approved, your Homestead Exemption automatically renews each year provided there is no change in the ownership or use of the property. If you have already applied and been approved for Homestead Exemption at your current property, you do not need to reapply for this exemption. You will receive a Homestead Exemption renewal card next month to keep for your records.

East is East and West is West

In ancient China, people visited their doctor regularly and paid him to keep them healthy. If they got sick, they stopped paying him until their health was restored. Go figure.

This arrangement was one of necessity,

in that when a patient was sick, they were usually unable to work and if they weren't working, they had no income with which to pay the doctor. It was in the doctor's financial interest to keep his patients healthy. Prevention was viewed as the highest form of medicine and the most esteemed doctors were the ones with few sick patients.

Here in the West, we do things differently. We incentivize doctors to treat our complaints rather than cure or prevent the illness which is causing them. We pay them to prescribe medications that suppress our symptoms and create other symptoms and illnesses for which we are then given different medications and the cycle continues. The root cause of our illness is seldom addressed, and we are made into lifelong patients who must see our doctors on an ongoing basis to monitor and manage our medication. This reflects the influence that large pharmaceutical companies have on our healthcare system. They sponsor most all the current medical research being done, and dictate, through their sponsorship, what medical students are taught and how they are trained in becoming doctors.

I am NOT suggesting that Western medicine is bad or that anyone should stop taking prescribed medication.

But I think patients would be better served by their healthcare providers

if a more comprehensive approach to care were adopted. The ideal model would be one where each person is viewed as a unique individual, and an honest attempt is made to empower that individual with the information and tools necessary to make optimal lifestyle choices which help maintain the highest state of health and well-being possible. This could include dietary assessment and appropriate recommendations for using food as medicine as well as the incorporation of safe and effective herbal supplements. It may include alternative or complementary medicine approaches such as acupuncture, functional medicine and naturopathy. Equally important would be the inclusion of exercise and mind-body practices such as TaiChi, Qigong, and yoga, which, through simple breathing, movement and mindfulness, help maximize the subtle self-healing mechanisms our bodies inherently possess. In the large teaching hospitals of China today, it is not uncommon to find an auditorium filled with cancer patients, for example, all being directed and led in breathing and movement exercises (Qigong) as an integral part of their care.

This model outlines how most acupuncture physicians are currently trained in the US. If you are tired of constantly changing medications and dealing with their side-effects or getting cortisone shots which help only temporarily or not at all, or if you have been told by your doctor that nothing else can be done for you and that you must simply "learn to live with it," whatever "it" is, it is important for you to know that other options may be available.



Balance *and* **Aging** ~ **Resistance Training**

Hello again. Last month I covered the benefits and different methods of resistance training. One of the safest and easiest ways of doing resistance training is with tubing. Tubing come with handles in different amounts from 10 pounds, to 100 pounds of resistance in 10 pound increments. We have them in the fitness center or you can purchase online or in sporting goods stores. They come in sets usually 10 to 50 pounds with ankle straps to do leg work. You can purchase them separately. The sets come with instructions on how to do some of the exercises, but there are literally dozens of exercises that can be done with the tubes.

You can work your whole body with tubing. Most of the exercises can be done alone, some need another person to help if you're able or confident to do them alone. I can answer some of your questions if you contact me at 954-673-6700. You don't need a lot of room to work with tubing and you don't have to pick up weights. If done correctly you will get great results, such as strength gains, flexibility and improvements in body composition. They can help with balance. On a personal note, I always played a lot of sports when I was young. When I was about 24 years old I started working out with weights and I have never stopped (my son was born that year, 1966). I turned 80 years old on November 20th. I work out five days a week for an hour and a half, I dance two nights a week and I'm told I have great posture. I believe that the weight training gets the credit. I hope this encourages you. Remember just keep moving. Until next time, good luck.



Frederic J. Frommer had an interesting article in the "Forward" about the beginnings of the World Series. Let us go back to 1901 and 1902. The Pittsburgh Pirates won the National League Pennant in both years. Then, the players went home. See, there was no World Series or a post season matchup between the Champions of the two leagues.

The owner of the Pirates, Barney Dreyfuss, a Jewish immigrant, wrote to the owner of the Boston Americans, Henry Killea. He stated that it would be good for baseball, their leagues, and the players, besides helping the bottom line, to have a best of nine competitions.

Killea agreed and the World Series was born in 1903. Unfortunately for Dreyfuss, his team lost 5 games to three, with Cy Young winning two games for the Americans, now known as the Red Sox.

The American League began in 1900 and tried to raid players from the established National League. Dreyfuss helped to get an agreement between the two leagues and pushed for baseball to hire a commissioner to manage the sport.

In 2008, Barney Dreyfuss was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York.

Dreyfuss was born in Germany in 1865, coming to the U.S. when he was 19, sponsored by cousins in Kentucky, who owned a bourbon business. For exercise he started playing baseball as a second baseman.

Ever a businessperson, he organized semi-pro teams in Paducah, Kentucky, using workers from the distillery. That was followed by an investment in the Louisville Colonels of the American Association. That League merged with the National League. In 1899, Dreyfuss was the owner of his team.

Dreyfuss learned the National League paring down teams from 12 to 8, including his. He bought a half interest in the Pirates and brought along with him future Hall of Famers Honus Wagner, Rube Waddell and Fred Clarke. In 1909 he built Forbes Field, one of the great stadiums.

He died in 1932.



WYNNOOR Golf and Tips By Kevin Battersby, PGA



BALL POSITION REVIEW

Last month's article focused on successfully transitioning iron shots from the tee to fairway lies. The essence of the article was that the deepest point in the swing is contacting the ball first, then the turf. Shorter irons because the ball is further back in the stance allows the divot to be more in front of the ball also producing the highest trajectory.

By contrast, as the ball moves to the middle of your stance for your middle numbers, the divot is not as deep as your anticipating a middle trajectory.

Finally, for your driving the ball is positioned opposite your lead heel or in front of your spine with more weight on your trail foot to promote a level to slightly upward strike for a lower trajectory.

There are three trajectories required so there are also three ball positions to accommodate each.

On final note when watching lower handicapped players or professionals. They may not play the ball as far back on their irons because of their lateral shift of their weight. Famed teacher, Harvey Penick, suggested taking a practice swing with your irons and positioning ball at the back of the divot you made on that practice swing. Lastly, if you make a nice divot fill it with sand in Florida it is not necessary to replace the divot like northern courses.

So, no questions in my mailbox this month. You will have to bear with me as I ramble about a subject that just keeps coming up in my discussions with people. Selfishness. Actually, this will be in part a small excerpt from a chapter in my book.

Being unselfish has been pounded into us forever. We have been told since we were tiny tots that selfishness was bad and we should avoid being that way. When we were children, it was often about sharing our precious possessions with another child. I remember when my first

granddaughter was very young and I was babysitting. If she had a friend coming over I would advise her that anything she didn't want to share, she didn't have to but she would have to put it away somewhere and that anything left over was to be shared. It worked quite well. At least she never moved her entire toy room into her bedroom.

Of course, anyone telling you that you are being selfish usually means that you aren't doing what they want or giving them what they need. I have always found this rather amusing because it made me wonder just who was being selfish here. However, calling someone selfish is almost like cursing at them. This is so far from the way it really is and so many people are reluctant to understand and accept the true nature of what selfishness is. It is not about exploiting or taking advantage of anyone else. It is about taking care of ourselves. It is about understanding how much we matter. When you are questioning this or trying hard to be 'unselfish' you are in a state of inner conflict.

This is you trying to change yourself into something you were not meant to be. Once again, importantly, this does not mean or even insinuate, not caring about others or wanting them to give you whatever you want. That is not the definition of selfishness, it is the definition of narcissism.

I tell people I am selfish all the time. They really have no idea what I am talking about, especially because I don't appear mean or narcissistic. Because I am neither. But I am definitely selfish. I can't help anyone if I don't take care of myself first. And I understand that means looking for ways for me to feel happier, more at peace and emotionally stronger. For me, it also means that I don't keep a balance sheet. If I need a favor from someone who can't do it, I recognize that they can't do it. I don't expect people to put my needs before their own. It doesn't matter how you want to take care of yourself or what is important to you. The idea is to maintain your good feelings and your equilibrium regardless of what is happening around you.

I actually like and prefer to be with similarly healthily selfish people. I remember my mentor, Nathaniel Branden, saying that no one wants the fruit of someone else's sacrifice. I loved hearing that. I want to know that the person who wants to be with me or even do something for me is doing it because it is giving them pleasure. I don't want to use them to serve myself at their expense nor do I want to be used so they can serve themselves. This does not preclude or negate my doing something for someone else because I want to and it is a value to me to do so.

I hope this doesn't confuse anyone but you will most likely be able to tell why you want to be with someone and why someone wants to be with you, why you want to do something for someone and why they might be doing something for you. Your beliefs will be screaming at you to not be selfish and sacrifice your good feelings for the sake of those of another while your feelings are telling quite a different story.

Perhaps the first question to ask yourself is if you believe that you are supposed to be living your precious life for the well-being of someone else, not sometimes because you really want to, but at those times when you know you really don't want to but think you should. If your answer is yes, then go on to the companion question. Do you believe that someone else is supposed to live his or her precious life towards your well-being? Did you answer yes to that also, or did this question have you answering no? If you answered yes to the first and no to the second, ask yourself a third question. Why is their life so much more important than yours?








You've Tried The Rest, **Now Try The Best** Temple Beth Am, Margate By Linda Storfer



Being active in this way informs my experience and fills my life with a zest


In a daytime's light which at dusk, dims as the sun gently sinks in the west.

Back To Business At BSO!

What a year it's been! As we turned the corner on the COVID-19 pandemic, the Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) remained fully committed to our core mission of providing top-notch public safety services while continuing to create new and innovative programs and initiatives. We returned to hosting in-person community events, solving decade-old crimes, and improving critical training and educational opportunities for employees. Here are some of the highlights:

CONNECTING WITH THE COMMUNITY

After two years of limited in-person community interaction, BSO showed up in a big way. We hosted numerous important events, including our Shred-a-thon and Operation Medicine Cabinet events, National Night Out, town halls and other community centered events. These opportunities continue to build mutual trust and

understanding with those we serve. Check our community events calendar on sheriff.org for dates and locations of upcoming events near you.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

We awarded 76 deserving community-based non-profits a total of \$930,000 in Law Enforcement Trust Funds (LETF). This was the most money given out in a single year under my leadership. These funds, which come from the forfeiture and seizure of contraband used in the commission of a crime, are given back to the community through organizations to further the mission of preventing crime and keeping our neighborhoods safe. STRENGTHENING OUR 911 SYSTEM

Earlier this year, BSO succeeded in obtaining additional funding from the Broward County Commission to increase the salaries of our communications operators. In one instance, we identified and criminally charged a man known as the Pillowcase Rapist, who was responsible for many sexual assaults in the 1980s. In another, the unit solved the 1994 rape and murder of an 89-year-old woman. We also launched an exclusive Cold Case video series to uncover possible new leads and bring more exposure to these investigations. STAFF TRAINING AND EDUCATION

Training and education are paramount for operational preparedness and excellence in service. In 2022, BSO partnered with local universities to expand higher education opportunities for all personnel and increased participation in executive-level training courses. As sheriff, I must lead by example. This year, I was selected to participate and completed the FBI's prestigious National Executive Institute Leadership Course. I am also currently pursuing my Ph.D. at Nova Southeastern University. As an organization, we are on a mission to become the most academically credentialed agency in the state.

This year, we finalized plans for BSO's state-of-the-art training center, broke ground and construction crews are making tremendous progress. Upon completion, the 100,000+ square-foot facility will be the first dedicated onsite training facility in our organization's 107-year history. 





Enjoying Stellar Paintings By Joseph Stella and Fine American Art at The Norton By Barry Isaac

his review is dedicated to the Norton Art Museum's fine collection of 20th Century American Art. On a pleasant Mid-October Saturday, I returned to the delightful Norton Art Museum in West Palm Beach, Florida. I stayed a full day as usual from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

I entered this treasure trove and segued to study its fine temporary, "Joseph Stella Visionary Nature" Exhibit (it ends January 15, 2023). Joseph Stella was born in Italy but spent much of his life in the United States and was a citizen of the United States. Joseph Stella's Paintings reflect the joy he received from the plants that he studied at New York City's Botanical Garden in the Bronx and his love of birds. Joseph Stella's Paintings also depict his devotion to Catholicism and his Italian roots. Favorite paintings in this very comprehensive exhibit were; "Swan 2 Rainbow," "Lyre Bird," "Purissima" (devotional theme influenced by Italian Renaissance Paintings), "Smokestacks," "Brooklyn Bridge," "Banyon Tree," and the very copiously botanical painting, "Tree of Life."


The Norton Art Museum's collection of 18th and 19th Century American Art on display is very limited, but I saw a delightful portrait by Gilbert Stuart worthy of encomium and a fine Florida Theme Painting by Thomas Moran, "Florida Scene." As for the first half of the 20th Century, favorite



American Paintings of mine that day were; Edmund Tarbell's "Eleanor Hyde," a fine example of American Impressionism, Childe Hassam's Impressionistic "Gloucester Harbor," John Grabach's "Sidewalks of New York City," George Bellows' "Wintry Afternoon, Riverside Park, New York City," Stuart Davis' "New York City Mural" (somewhat political), Georgia O'Keefe's "Pelvis With Moon, New Mexico," William Glackens' "Ocean With Two Figures," Robert Henri's "Orientale," and Maurice Prendergast's "Ramparts of St. Malo."

Second half of the 20th Century paintings that especially captivated me were Wayne Thiebaud's "Neapolitan Pie," Fairfield Porter's "Porch in Maine," Roy Lichtenstein's "Oh Allright" (quintessential American Pop Art), and Joan Brown's "Self Portrait with Gorilla and Wolf." I also saw fine mixed media creations by Contemporary American Artists, Nice Cave "Spacesuit," Teresita Fernandez "Rise and Fall," and Michalene Thomas "Naomi Looking Forward #2."


