# From the President

We have had the pleasure of hosting a "New Residents Orientation," once a month to introduce ourselves and explain how the Wynmoor governing body operates and all the amenities we have to offer. It has proven to be a very successful event and a rewarding experience to be able to meet our new residents and show the wonderful Wynmoor way of life.

Council Officers elections were held at the February Annual Board of Director's meeting. Congratulations to those that were reelected to serve another term, Vice Presidents, Ann Goldman, Ronny Sydney and Secretary, Alan Wagner.

Your Officers of the Wynmoor Community Council remain intact due to the election that was held at the February 2, 2023 Annual Board of Director's meeting. For those of you who may not know who we are let me introduce your Officers; Vice Presidents, Selma Bass, Ann Goldman, David Mintzes, Ronny Sydney, Secretary, Alan Wagner and Treasurer, Fred Stein; and I am your Council President.

Through our experience as a "team," we have learned to work well together thereby allowing us to focus on the issues and accomplish our set goals. By listening to one another's opinions and hearing various points of view, we have come to understand the importance of compromise and have successfully finetuned each project, the results of which have proven to satisfy a greater majority of our resident population.

As stated before, we were fortunate enough to be reimbursed \$3,056,032 for expenses during COVID. At the recent February, Board of Director's meeting it was unanimously voted on to allocate \$1,000,000 to the paving reserve and \$1,056,000 to the Capital Fund. To alleviate some of the burden of the increase in the 2023 insurance premium, \$1,000,000 will be allocated to the Associations, hopefully, this will take some pressure off our residents.

I would like to take this opportunity to address those who have taken the responsibility of becoming Directors of all our 44 Associations. It is imperative that decisions are made regarding your Associations with the authority of the entire Board of Directors. No single Director has the authority to make changes and decisions on their own and must be in compliance with Florida State Statute 718 and your governing documents. To avoid any conflicts a united decision will benefit all residents.

I would be remiss if I didn't mention our residents' safety is paramount to all

of us. Whether it's driving, biking, or walking our traffic rules and regulations have never changed and remain the same. STOP at stop signs, the speed limit is 25 mph around the circle and no passing. So please adhere to these safety measures that are put in place for all our residents' protection.

Keeping our community safe is

our primary purpose. We wish we could have the luxury of a sense of security. Unfortunately, no matter where we are, we must be aware of our surroundings. As busy as life makes us, it is important to get to know our neighbors so that we can all work together to make sure we are involved as much as possible to keep each other safe. Keep your windows, doors and vehicles locked and be mindful not to keep any valuables in your vehicle. If you see burnt out lights in hallways or stairwells, notify your building director. Lighting helps in so many ways to insure our sense of awareness.

We would like to bring to your attention of the assistance available to you for security, and beautification in your association through municipal grants. We have facilitated an Ad-Hoc Grant Committee. If you are interested in applying for any of these grants, please contact Abbey Lauth, Wynmoor Council Secretary at 954-978-2600 and your information will be forwarded to the Grants Committee, chaired by Marcella Stock, who has worked tirelessly in this area.

March has always been a time for the Coconut Creek local elections. I can't stress enough the importance of making sure your vote counts, so please make sure you cast your ballot on March 14, 2023.

Spring is often referred to as the season of new beginnings; things always seem brighter and more beautiful at this time of year. For those of us that are lucky enough to live here in South Florida and more especially right here in Wynmoor, we are blessed all year round!

# Smart Moves For Investors After A Down 2022

Many investors were glad to see the end of 2022. But what's ahead this year? And what moves can you make in response to last year's results?

To begin with, here's what happened: 2022 was the worst year for the financial markets since 2008, with the Dow Jones Industrial Average dropping nearly 9%, the S&P 500 losing more than 19% and the technology-heavy Nasdaq falling 33%. Several factors contributed to these results, including the moves by the Federal Reserve to aggressively hike interest rates to combat inflation, the Russia-Ukraine war, recession fears and increased concern over COVID-19 cases in China.

However, 2023 may be different. Many experts believe that inflation may moderate considerably, especially during the second half of the year. If that happens, the Fed may well pause its interest rate hikes and perhaps even consider cutting rates — a move that is often positive for the financial markets. Also, if a recession emerges, but it's relatively short and mild, as expected, the rebounding economy may be favorable for the investment outlook.

Regardless of what transpires this year, though, you can help move toward your financial goals by following some basic steps that make sense in all investment environments. Here are a few to consider:

• Focus on the long term. It can be disconcerting to look at investment statements containing negative results, as was the case for many people throughout 2022. But it's important to view a single year's outcome in the larger context — and historically, the stock market has had many more positive years than negative ones, though, of course, past performance is not a guarantee of what will happen in the future. In any case, it's generally not a good idea to overreact to short-term downturns and make moves that

could work against your long-term strategy.

- Keep adequate cash in your portfolio. The value of your investments may have gone down in 2022 but you didn't really sustain any actual losses unless you sold those investments for less than what you paid for them. To avoid having to sell investments to supplement your income or to pay for unforeseen costs, such as a major home or car repair, try to build the "cash" portion of your portfolio, so it covers a few months' worth of living expenses. When you're retired, and it becomes even more imperative to avoid selling investments when their price is down, you may need an even bigger pool of available cash.
- Look for opportunities. Although 2022 was certainly a down year for the financial markets, some developments have presented new opportunities for investors. For one thing, the contribution limits have increased for IRAs, 401(k)s, and Health Savings Accounts (HSAs), all of which are pegged to inflation. Also, with interest rates considerably higher than they were a year ago, fixed-income investments may offer more income and provide added stability in portfolios during times of economic weakness.

When you've been investing for a long time, you will experience down years in the market, such as the one in 2022. These years are an inevitable part of the investment process. But since you can't control what happens in the financial markets, you need to concentrate on what you *can* control — and that may be a lot more than you think.







# Legal Plan Checklist To Protect Yourself

I have touched on these subjects in many articles. Here is a condensed checklist.

- 1. Current Advanced Care Directives:
- A. Designation of Health Care Surrogate for someone to make your medical decisions if you cannot communicate. Even if you are married, you MUST have this legal document and it needs to be current and done by a Florida lawyer. Do NOT rely on generic forms or a document you got from your doctor or a hospital or out of state documents.



- B. Living Will. Very specific Florida language regarding "pulling the plug." Must be witnessed and notarized and designate someone to make the final decision.
- C. Durable Power of Attorney. Covers legal and financial matters while you are alive. Again, needs to be done by a lawyer who is aware of current Florida law, including many specific powers that must be initialed by you to be valid. Our current document is 26 pages.

When you die, the advanced care directives die with you.

- 2. Last Will and Testament. If you are a Florida resident, you should have a Florida Will and your Personal Representative (Executor) must be a Florida resident OR a blood relative.
- 3. If you own real estate, in Florida or elsewhere, you need one of these to avoid probate when you die:
  - A. Deed as Joint Tenants with Right of Survivorship;
- B. Life Estate Deed: You own property for the rest of your life and you designate someone on the Deed as having the remainder interest to inherit it without probate when you die. Be sure it is an "enhanced" (also known as "Lady Bird") to allow you to sell it without consent or joinder of the person you name.
- C. Trust and Deed transferring property to you (and your spouse) as Trustee(s) of your Trust. This allows you to name contingent beneficiaries in case your first choice dies before you or with you in a common accident. The Revocable Living Trust also allows you to buy future properties as Trustee and to Amend the Trust at any time while you are alive. The Deed to your home should have language confirming that it remains your homestead.

The above documents should be done with the assistance of an Estate Planning Attorney. The following need to be done by you personally:

- 4. Designate beneficiaries on ALL of your accounts to avoid probate. This is also known as payable on death (p.o.d.), transfer on death (t.o.d.) or in trust for (i.t.f.). Also designate contingent beneficiaries. Each institution has its own forms but it should not cost you anything except some time.
- 5. If you know that you want to be cremated or buried, contact cremation societies or funeral homes to discuss pre-need plans. You will be signing a contract to pre-pay for your funeral, saving your loved ones
- a lot of stress, time and money. Be sure to give a copy of your contract to your primary and contingent Personal Representative so they will know who to call.

  6. If you qualify based on age and health, consider long-term home health care plans. You will be entering into a contract providing for a specified term
- care plans. You will be entering into a contract providing for a specified term of years that you are eligible for home health care if incapacitated. These contracts vary greatly, so shop around and consult an impartial expert before signing.
- 7. Have car insurance that includes at least \$100,000 of bodily injury liability (b.i.) And uninsured motorist (u.m.). Do not have any deductible on your P.I.P. (no fault). If you own more than one car, consider "stacking", which allows you to double (two cars) or triple (three cars) your uninsured motorist coverage for a small additional premium. Uninsured motorist is the most important insurance you can have, since Florida does not require bodily injury coverage.

If you do all the homework on this list, you are well on your way to getting an "A" in Legalities of Life 101.





# HISTORIC MOMENTS

# 240th Anniversary of the Purple Heart

2022 was the 240th anniversary of the creation of the American military medal known as the Purple Heart. Created by George Washington

in 1782, the award was known then as the Badge of Military Merit. George Washington himself presented the award to three Revolutionary War soldiers to recognize their bravery in combat.

In October 1781, the British Army under Lord Charles Cornwallis had surrendered at Yorktown Heights, Virginia, ending the shooting war of the American Revolution, and paving the way to peace treaty negotiations.

The new confederation of states then entered a precarious time during which many thought that the union of the new American states might not hold together. In April of 1782, peace treaty negotiations got underway in Paris, but were dragging on. The treaty of Paris would not be signed until September 3, 1783 at the Hotel du York in Paris. The Congress was in dire financial straits, and had no money to pay the Continental soldiers. Robert Morris, Superintendent of Finances (forerunner of Secretary of the Treasury) had stopped the soldiers pay because of a lack of funds. Congress had no authority to raise taxes or order the states to do so. The soldiers grumbled. George Washington was sympathetic to their concerns, but he could do nothing to get them paid. In June of 1783, Continental soldiers in Philadelphia mutinied, and demanded their back pay. The Congress, insulted and threatened, hastily fled Philadelphia, and resumed its session in Princeton, New Jersey. The small, rural town of Princeton then rose to the occasion and became the nation's capital for the next 4 ½ months.

It was in this environment that George Washington issued his Orders of the Day of August 7, 1782. These orders announced:

"The General ever desirous to cherish a virtuous ambition in his soldiers, as well as to foster and encourage every species of Military Merit, directs that whenever any singularly meritorious action is performed, the author of it shall be permitted to wear on his facings over the left breast, the figure of a heart in purple cloth or silk, edged with narrow lace or binding. Not only instances of unusual gallantry, but also of extraordinary fidelity and essential service in any way shall meet with a due reward."1

As far as is known, the Badge of Military Merit was awarded to only three Continental soldiers, all non-commissioned officers: Sergeant Daniel Bissell of the 2nd Connecticut Regiment of the Continental Line, Sergeant William Brown of the 5th Connecticut Regiment of the Continental Line, and Sergeant Elijah Churchill of the 2nd Continental Dragoons, also a Connecticut Regiment.<sup>2</sup>

After the Revolutionary War the Badge of Military Merit fell into disuse. In 1932, however, to mark the bicentennial of Washington's birth, General Douglas MacArthur led the effort to restore the use of this medal to recognize bravery in action, but also to recognize soldiers who are wounded in action. A new design was created by Elizabeth Will an army heraldic specialist, along with the Washington Commission of Fine arts. This design features a bust and profile of George Washington.

It was issued on the bicentennial of his birth, on February 22, 1932. In General Orders No. 3, the Army announced the revival of the award, and the opening of the award to wounded soldiers, by adding: "A wound which necessitates treatment by a medical officer, and which is received in action with an enemy of the United States, or as a result of an act of such enemy may...be construed as resulting from a singularly meritorious act of essential service."3

In World War II over one million purple hearts were awarded. John F. Kennedy was wounded in action in 1943, and later received the Purple Heart. He was the only president to have that honor bestowed upon him. "Arguably, the most famous soldier of the war to receive the purple heart was Audie L. Murphy who was awarded three Purple



Hearts." My own father-in law arrived in France in early June, 1944. His unit, the 90th Infantry Division, known as "Tough Ombres," came ashore in Normandy, on Utah Beach on June 7, 1944 (D-Day plus 1). For the injury he received, he was later awarded the Purple Heart.

Over time, new types of injuries and new types of combat were added to the qualifications for the award of the Purple Heart. As examples, soldiers wounded or killed by acts of terrorism, and friendly fire would qualify. As of 2010, there were an estimated 1.7 million awards of the Purple Heart in the U.S. Armed Forces.



# ASK DR. JOY

Some people might find it odd that I'm going to be writing about change to a group of seniors. I so often hear people saying that they are too old to change whether it is behavior, habits, feelings or points of view. You may be surprised to hear that on my first day as a psychology undergraduate student, in my first course, Psych 101, the professor asked us to raise our hands if we had plans to become therapists. About 1/3 of the class raised their hands. He then asked us to write down what we believed would be the most difficult part of this career we were headed for. We all wrote our answers and he asked us to read them out loud. When we had

completed that task, he told us we were all wrong and that we would one day find out that the hardest thing we would be doing was attempting to separate the client from the problem. How right he was. At first, we all thought he was joking with us. After all this was the reason the clients were coming, wasn't it? Maybe yes, maybe no but it was often excruciatingly difficult. Admitting the need for change was the easy part, implementing that or any other change was another story altogether. And these people did not have 50 or 60 or 70 or more years to become set in their ways. Mostly they were people between 25 and 45. So what is the issue with change and why do so many people find it a nearly impossible task?

It appears that our basic identity and outlook sets itself concretely at a very young age. We decide early on what we can or cannot do, what our basic abilities and talents are. We see ourselves as athletic or intellectual or funny or good at math or writing or music or performing or anything else....and we do this early on. Then we follow that path even if at some point we realize we don't like it or prefer something entirely different. We also decide how happy we are or how successful or how worthy or deserving or lucky and we then go about fulfilling that image as well. We usually succeed to the degree we see ourselves. These scripts are not fully conscious but they are not unconscious either. We then program our lives to carry out our plans.

So, when clients would come to therapy, there was often a push/pull going on in them. At a conscious level they knew they wanted more out of their lives than they were getting but they didn't fully realize that they were actually living

according to a default plan. Their identities were tied up with these ideas that they held and the longer they held them the more they believed and followed them. Separating them from these concepts, no matter how much they wanted to live and feel differently, was extremely difficult. They didn't seem to know who they would become and how they would navigate life as this new person.

So, without going into my methods for working with these individuals, these couples, these families, I would just like to ask my readers if any of this applies to you. Regardless of your chronological age or your thinking that change takes a lot of time, is there any change you would like to make in yourself or your life?

Is there something new you would like to try or is there another way you would like to present yourself to the world? Are there ideas that you realize you still hold that are not serving you but you don't know how to replace or rethink them or even where to start? What I've noticed by living in three different senior communities is that there are differing ways that people retire. Some people decide to jump in and do all those things that they didn't have time to do when they are younger and working, others do the same things but don't get paid for it anymore. They just take whatever expertise they had and use it in various ways in retirement. And some people just sit down. Perhaps you want to change what you are doing. What would that mean to you?

Why not write down your fantasy changes. Let your mind wander and see what comes up for you. It may be a small thing or something you think is way beyond you. Even if you don't implement any of them, it would be a great mind-expanding exercise. Note if there are any fears or trepidation in the mix and what they might be. Do this for fun. Don't even tell anyone if you don't feel comfortable. This is just for you. Play with it. I think I'll do it with you as well. Go for it....

Recently a new science has come to the forefront of the mind-body-brain connections. It's called neuro-plasticity or brain plasticity. It is about forming new neural passageways in the physical brain. This is important at any age and is how learning takes place. For seniors it is just as important if we don't want our brains to shrink. Yes, old dogs can learn new tricks and we can learn to approach our senior years with the same enthusiasm that we might have thought was left in our past when everything was new. We can train ourselves to think differently so we form new pathways in our brains. If you find it easier to be negative or anxious in your thinking, it only means that pathway has often been used and the brain finds it and uses it as a default thought. To change that thinking to become more positive takes repetition and commitment. At some point the positive thought will become the default one.

It's the same for learning a new skill. Keep at it until the new neural pathway has been formed. New physical skills are learned in the same way.

Every new pathway you form actually makes your brain younger.

# Food As Medicine, Part 2 (recipe ideas)

Last month I discussed the concept of "food as medicine" and the idea that the foods we regularly eat can be viewed as medicine we take at least three times a day on an ongoing basis for most of our lives. And how perhaps more than anything else in our lives, the foods

If we do an internet search for health-giving meal ideas the response we get is overwhelming, to say the least. It is much easier to take a close look at what we already eat, and by tweaking things here and there, adding a bit of this and removing a bit of that, find ways to make those food choices as healthy and beneficial as possible. As it is impossible to know exactly what is

in the food we are served in restaurants, I am speaking about home-prepared meals only. And I recommend the use of organically-grown vegetables as well as pasture-raised or organic protein sources, both of which are readily available these days.

We don't have much of a winter here in south Florida but chicken soup seems to be a popular staple none-the-less. And it is historically considered to be health-giving by itself, especially for issues such as colds and flu. What follows is a very simple chicken soup recipe that is a potent immune-system builder and is also great for reducing inflammation and the symptoms associated with arthritis, due to the healing qualities of gingerol (from ginger). Bon Appetit!!

#### Ginger/Garlic Healing Chicken Soup

Total Time 50 minutes
Prep Time 10 minutes
Cook Time 40 minutes

Yield 1 large pan, 12 servings

#### Ingredients

- 2 Tablespoons Olive Oil
- 2 Tablespoons fresh garlic, minced
- 2 Tablespoons fresh ginger root, peeled and minced
- 1 Tablespoon ginger paste (optional)
- 1 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 large sweet onion, finely diced
- 2 lbs boneless, skinless chicken

breasts, cut into pieces

½ cup fresh carrot, sliced

32 ounces chicken broth, organic

6 cups water

1 cup fresh spinach

#### Steps:

- 1. Heat olive oil in a large pan.
- 2. Add fresh garlic, fresh ginger, and onion.
- 3. Cook for 3-4 minutes. Add Ginger paste, cayenne pepper and salt and pepper. Cook an additional 3-4 minutes, stirring often.
- 4. Add the chicken broth, water, chicken, and carrots.
- 5. Bring to a boil. Reduce seat and simmer for at least 30 minutes (up to 1 hour)
- 6. Add spinach and let cook for 5 minutes just before serving.

To add more antioxidants, you can also add sliced mushrooms (white or baby portabella) at the same time you add the carrots).





### The Liberal Jewish Temple

How did so many Jews get involved with things that are decidedly Christian? The simple answer is that they were filling a need with something with which they were familiar. Songwriters wrote songs. Candy makers made candy. Bakers baked cake. They were filling needs doing what they knew how to do. Of course, they were also earning a living.

Most of you have seen Peeps - the neon-colored marshmallow Easter treats. Well, Jews produce them. Just Born Quality Confections have been producing these sweets since 1953, when it purchased The Rodda Candy company. Roscoe Rodda had come up with the idea of "3D marshmallows." Jewish immigrant Sam Born developed the Peeps we know today.

Mr. Born was educated at a rabbinical school in the Ukraine. He learned the candy business as a young teen when his family moved to France. In 1910 he immigrated to the United States. Six years later he was awarded the key to the city of San Francisco for his invention of a machine that insert sticks into lollipops. He opened candy stores that were called Just Born, a play on his name and freshness.

Just Born grew, and in 1932 moved to a large manufacturing facility in Bethlehem PA. There they produced brands such as Mike and Ikes and Hot Tamales.

It took Rodda 27 hours to make one Peep by hand. Sam Born's son, Bob Born, mechanized the process so that it took just six minutes. By the 1960s shapes other than the chick were introduced. Today there are over 50 varieties made all year round- many for specific holidays like Halloween and Christmas. 5.5 million peeps are produced every day.

Sam Born died in 1959. Bob Born died Jan 29th.

Do you know one of the best known makers of Panettone, the Christmas cake? He is Roy Shvartzapel. He is an Israeli American Jew. He studied under Iginio Massari, a master Baker in Italy. There is a 40-hour production cycle. Mr. Shvartzapel started his company in 2016 and was endorsed by Oprah Winfrey in 2018. Each cake cost at least \$85.

Shvartzapel was born in Karmiel, Israel. He was raised in Houston and now lives in California. He loved basketball but realized he would never make the NBA. He thought of becoming a lawyer, but baking was his passion. He graduated from the Culinary Institute of America in 2004. He eventually started working in Paris where he had his first taste of panettone. He loved the texture, the aroma, and the chew. It was a love affair.

I bet you are ready for a snack about now. Enjoy!

### A Fine Place to Study 20th Century and Contemporary Art In Broward County, Florida By Barry Isaac

In January, on a pleasant Fort Lauderdale Saturday, I visited the NSU Fort Lauderdale Art Museum again. This art museum is primarily an art museum with 20th and 21st Century works of art. It has a definitive collection of paintings and drawings by American Impressionist, William Glackens in its permanent collection. It has a very large collection of paintings and works of Art produced by COBRA School Painters after World War Two from Denmark, Belgium, and Holland in its permanent collection. It has fascinating Contemporary Art Exhibits.

Favorite paintings by William Glackens, during my recent visit were "Cape Cod Pier," fine shadows, "Tugboat and Lighter (1904)," "Bandstand," "Bay Shore," "Route de Trajus, Cannes," and "Wickford, Low Tide," quintessential American Impressionism. William Glackens early in his career was associated with the Ashcan School, but during his peak years was an American Impressionist. William Glackens was a Francophile, a lover of French Culture and Art. Some called him "The American Renoir." I also savored Ernest Lawson's painting, "Lighthouse on Peggy's Cove, Nova Scotia" Ernest Lawson was part of Glackens' Circle of Artists in the early 20th Century.

Favorite COBRA School works of Art from their permanent collection

were Karel Appel's "Couple" (Hyplar on Wood), Lucebert's "Blue Boy" (painting), and Henry Heerop's buoyant painting, "Moon Girl."

At the temporary Malcolm Morley Contemporary Painting Exhibit (it ends on April 16, 2023), I saw fine photorealistic depictions of ships and boats in maritime settings. Favorites of mine at this exhibit were "Castle with Sailboats," "Crushed Liner with Lighthouses," and "Man Overboard."

I saw the temporary Scott Covert Exhibit which ends on April 23, 2023. This exhibit featured Scott Covert's Monument Paintings employing the Victorian Gravestone Rubbing Technique. Scott Covert is sort of a human printing press. I saw Scott Covert's "I Had a Wonderful Life" which utilized wax oil pastel and acrylic on muslin. It honored the memories of Bricktop, Cole Porter, Lionel Hampton, Billie Holliday, and Leonard Cohen. I appreciated his works that honored the memory of Houdini, Serge Rachmaninoff, and architect, Ludwig Mies Van Der Rohe #3, 2004, among others.



### 2023 Homestead Exemption/Save Our Homes Cap Set By The State

The Florida Department of Revenue has set the 2023 Save Our Homes (SOH) cap at 3%. This SOH assessment cap limits increases to the Assessed/SOH Value for properties receiving Homestead Exemption to no more than 3% per year or the increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) regardless of increases to the just value of the property. This cap results in considerable property tax savings over time for properties with Homestead Exemption. It is important to remember this is not a cap on the actual taxes, but rather a cap on the amount the Assessed/SOH Value of the property may increase annually.

Important: The Save Our Homes cap begins the year after you receive Homestead Exemption. This cap does not cover new construction or construction that was not taxed before the "Save Our Homes" limit applied to a particular property. When buying/acquiring real estate, do not assume the property taxes will remain the same as the current owner's taxes. Under Florida law, a change in ownership will reset the assessed value of the property to full market value, which could result in higher property taxes. To help property owners better prepare, our office offers a New Homebuyer's

Tax Estimator on our website at https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/Tax-Estimator.

#### Late Filing Exemption Deadline - September 18, 2023

Homestead Exemption automatically renews each year provided there is no change in the ownership or use of the property. If you are already receiving Homestead Exemption on your current home, you do not need to reapply. If you have not yet applied for your 2023 Homestead Exemption, Low-Income Senior Exemption, or any other exemption, you can still late file until September 18, 2023. To apply for any of these exemptions, please visit https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/Homestead. Once the September statutory "late-filing" deadline has closed, we cannot accept any more 2023 exemption applications regardless of any good cause reason for missing the late filing deadline. Property owners who moved to a new home in 2023 can pre-file for tax year 2024 at https://bcpa.net/homesteadonline\_with\_portability/web/index.aspx.

### Old Scammers' Favorite Cycles Back Up

I've often written about how many scams are cyclical in nature, meaning they cycle up and down. IRS scams for example typically peak around mid-April, when our tax returns are due to Uncle Sam. Lottery scams, you know, the ones where all the sudden you "win" a lottery you don't remember entering, seem to

increase around the holidays. After all, it's the holidays when many of us go over budget buying gifts for our loved ones and we get worried about money. What better way to "solve" all of our problems than a total stranger telling us we've won a lottery?

Other scams just seem to cycle up and down for no apparent reason. We typically see a lot of distraction scams for example for a few weeks every couple of years. This is where the con artists show up at your door claiming to be from your homeowners association, or some other group, and they con their way into your home saying there's some branches they need to cut in your backyard and they want to show them to you. While one distracts you, the other bad guy steals all your cash and jewelry. We've seen little runs of these scammers come through the area during the spring, sometimes during the fall, but there seems to be no pattern as to when they strike; it just seems to cycle up and down.

Grandparent scams are the same way. In the grandparent scam, the fraudsters

call you up and pretend to be your grandchild. They usually use your grandkid's name. They've found it somewhere while sleuthing the Internet. They tell you they're either in jail or in some other form of trouble, like stuck in the hospital for example, and they try to convince you to send them money to help. Oftentimes they hang up, and then their "jailor" or "doctor" calls you back explaining how to send the money. Of course they're in on the scam too. We've had reports of this type of scam cycling back up again in the area so be wary. If you get a similar call, hang up, and call your son or daughter and check on that grandchild of yours. I bet there's nothing wrong at all.

### WYNMOOR Golf and Tips

### **Putting-Grip, Stance, Alignment Tips**



The number of strokes taken on the putting green is probably the easiest of ways to lower your score by avoiding the dreaded 3- putt. Putting can be up to nearly half of your score and a few sound tips max help you.

Grip - the grip is not as essential as your full swing grip. Most players will put the club in their palms almost facing upward to eliminate excess hand a wrist action. The swing is similar to a pendulum. There are many variations to the grip it becomes a personal item in your game.

Stance - because your body is very stationary your stance also is of a personal nature. The ball should be positioned just off your lead heel so the club will strike the ball on a level plane. Your eyes will be just inside the ball or possibly over the ball as the swing is the most straight of all your shots. For medium and longer putts the swing may come a little inside.

Alignment - the putters today have various additions to the face to help you align the face properly on your intended line or break. The use of a line on your ball allows you to point the line on the ball on your intended line of each putt. The use of a technique "spot lining" similar to bowling using the arrows help you find a spot on your intended line usually between 3 to 6 feet in front of your ball is advisable.

As far as speed, especially in Florida, a putt with the pace to go 18 inches past the hole will negate any subtle breaks or the imperfections of the green.





### **BUILDING TRUST**

Our nation has witnessed, once again, another tragedy that took place at the hands of five Memphis police officers. Incidents like this spark outrage and distrust from the people we serve and disappointment among our ranks.

When I entered the law enforcement profession, I took an oath to serve and protect – an honor I hold with high regard and implore among our ranks. While the actions of a few can tarnish the efforts of many, the Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) has taken progressive steps toward preventing incidents like this from happening in Broward County.

Since becoming Sheriff, I've worked with our organization's leadership core to implement policies and procedures that identify areas of concern, address behaviors, enhance training and hold people accountable for their actions. The below highlights some of these initiatives:


- Early Warning System: A process designed to detect policy violations and misconduct through various review boards: Use of Force Review Board, Vehicle Pursuit Review Board and the Shooting Review Board.
- **Professional Standards Committee (PSC):** We restructured the PSC to include greater diversity and inclusiveness including minority members,

qualified civilians and BSO command staff. The PSC gives the public a voice in critical decisions regarding discipline of deputies accused of wrongdoing.

- Racial Intelligence Training (RITE): Training focused on reinforcing a bias-free workplace, racial and cultural sensitivity and de-escalation techniques. While BSO nears 100% completion for all deputies, we have also funded the RITE Train-The-Trainer Course, expanding this valuable training opportunity to all local law enforcement agencies to train their personnel.
- **8 Can't Wait**: BSO is in full compliance with the eight immediate proven steps to curtail police violence.
- **Neighborhood Support Team:** A proactive law enforcement presence in the community designed to make law enforcement more visible, reduce fear and support interactions between the public and law enforcement.

At BSO, we understand the value of maintaining trust from those we serve. As a public safety organization, we will continue to evaluate policies and build programs centered around doing what is right, responsible, fair and equitable while being accountable and transparent with the community.




