

For the safety of all, please be aware that the traffic light at the entrance on Lyons Road into Wynmoor requires everyone's attention and understanding of the signals. This will ensure your safety and that of the community.

You can be ticketed as the same violation as going through a red light! Be aware it may save lives!

**Solid Red Arrow:** Means **STOP**. It is the same as a red light! Do not go until it flashes or turns green.

**Green Arrow:** Means it is safe to proceed.

Flashing Yellow Arrow: Indicates that drivers may make a left turn, but only after yielding to oncoming traffic and pedestrians in the crosswalk. **Note:** This is not a protected turn—drivers must yield before turning.



**Flashing Red Arrow:** Indicates that drivers may make a left turn, but only after yielding to oncoming traffic and pedestrians in the crosswalk. **Note:** This is not a protected turn—drivers must yield before turning.

Additionally, remember that a flashing red signal acts just like a stop sign: **STOP**, and then proceed only when it's safe, following right-of-way rules.

If you need additional information, you can always visit the **Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT)** website for official guidelines and traffic signal explanations. Stay informed and drive safely!

As many of our neighbors are preparing to leave Wynmoor for the summer months, we wish you a safe journey and a wonderful time away, and we look forward to welcoming you back soon!



Our conversation starts like this...


Him: So, what did you do today?





Friends,

The House Republicans passed a government funding bill that fails to protect the programs American families depend on and fails to deliver the lower costs they're counting on. I voted no and I wanted to tell you why.

This bill threatens to cut funding from a whole host of critical government programs—everything from healthcare and nutritional assistance to veterans benefits and disaster relief. It slashes resources from care for veterans exposed to burn pits and other toxic substances, and it risks throwing thousands of seniors, veterans, and individuals living with disabilities out of their homes. Cuts like these quite simply do not help Florida families.

And that's just the start—what's not in the bill is just as important.

This bill does not have the necessary guardrails to protect Medicare, Medicaid, and Social Security. More than 100,000 Floridians in our district depend on Medicaid for their healthcare, including seniors, children, and individuals living with disabilities, and this bill puts their coverage at risk.

I've always stood up for Medicare, Medicaid, and Social Security, and I wasn't going to let the threats to these programs go unchecked—so I took action.

I filed an amendment to emphasize that this bill could not allow the Administration to make cuts to Medicare, Medicaid, and Social Security. It was a straightforward, commonsense move to ensure that Floridians could continue to access these critical lifelines—but Republicans in the House majority blocked it from taking effect.

As long as I'm representing Broward and Palm Beach Counties, I'll never support threats to Medicare, Medicaid, Social Security, and other earned benefit programs. Too many seniors and working families depend on them to access healthcare and put food on the table, and it's critical that we stand united with these Floridians behind the programs they rely on.

So while this bill wasn't close to what it should be for our working families, I'm going to keep fighting for the policies that WILL support hard-working Floridians—efforts like my bills to expand the Child Tax Credit, improve seniors' access to hearing aids, and lower the sky-high cost of insurance for homeowners. These are commonsense proposals that will make a real difference for seniors and working families—and these are the sorts of proposals that Congress should be focused on.

#### WE SOLVE MURDERS



I read this book fast, partly because I had to return it to the library, and partly for fun. The action moves from New Forest in England to a private island in South Carolina to an ultra-fancy resort in St Lucia, on to Dublin and then to Dubai, ending at "a small bench by a quiet pond." During not quite four hundred pages, influencers, security services/bodyguards, international money smugglers, a retired policeman and a horny bestselling author, track, investigate and stalk each other. People are murdered and framed for murder. Dry British wit oversees the confusion. In such a plot it must be that

not everyone is who they seem to be, and what the reader assumes are the intentions of some of the characters is way off the mark. The author has written four previous books about the Thursday Murder Club; this book introduces a new set of characters. If you read it very fast, like I did, it's less bothersome that you can't always understand the action. Just keep going.

#### A WILDER SHORE

Modern readers know the Scottish author Robert Louis Stevenson for his three novels from the 1880s: Treasure Island, Dr Jekyll and Mr. Hyde, and Kidnapped. He was a compulsive writer, and these books constitute a fraction of his total writings produced during a disease haunted life. This book is a dual biography of RLS and his American wife, Fanny Van de Grift Osbourne. Fanny was ten years older and literally the reason for his vast output, due to her efforts to keep him alive for the last fifteen years of his life. They moved from California back to Europe, trying locations in Switzerland,

Scotland and England in search of a climate for him. After a brief stay in the Adirondacks, they began to wander the south Pacific, settling finally on Samoa, where mortality caught up with him. The author has done her research on these complicated lives; the book is dense with details. This can make for slow going but also for a fascinating recreation of their times and places.



# Latest Scams Show Community Must Remain Alert



The latest scams we've been seeing show the community must remain alert for these con artists and fraudsters. Below is a list of our latest scam alerts. Some of these involved Wynmoor Village and/or Township residents:

The Zelle Government Approval Scam is the reason for this Coconut Creek Police Department Scam Alert. We had a woman come to us recently after falling victim to this scam. Zelle is a cash app you can download on your phone. Transactions are quick, easy, and final – which makes this app very alluring to scammers.

Our victim was trying to sell a dress on Facebook Marketplace when a fraudster contacted her wanting to buy it. They worked out the deal but the scammer claimed her money wouldn't get to our victim until she paid a "government approval" fee. This of course was a scam. There is no such fee. The victim sent the money, only figuring out it was a scam after a family member told her.

So, if you get a similar type of request when you're trying to buy or sell something online, remember it's a scam.

We'll take a look at why **Bitcoin** is becoming a **regular "red flag"** when it comes to **scams** in this Coconut Creek Police Department Scam Alert.

A 77-year-old man recently withdrew cash from his bank account and deposited it in a Bitcoin machine after the scammers convinced him they were from Facebook and his account had been hacked.

We've written before how there are "red flags" when dealing with these fraudsters, such as them telling you to go buy gift cards or suddenly having the solution to a problem you never knew you had. Trips to the Bitcoin machine are certainly becoming one of those red flags. If someone tells you they can solve all your problems by depositing your money into a Bitcoin machine – it's a scam.

This man also found a phone number online he thought was for Facebook customer service. Remember none of those phone numbers can be trusted. More and more scam artists are starting to use Bitcoin to enrich themselves, which is why we thought you need to be aware of it.

**The Facebook Messenger Scam** rearing its ugly head once again here in Coconut Creek is the basis for this Coconut Creek Police Department Scam Alert.

A woman recently reported she sent some money to a friend who reached out to her through the Facebook Messenger app. It turned out, the friend's page had been hacked. The woman didn't send the money to the person she intended to.

The hacker asked our victim to send the money through Zelle. She didn't realize it at the time, but the hacker's phone number didn't match her friend's phone number... that's how she figured out she got scammed.

If this ever happens to you, the important lesson to remember from this story is to check with your friend first. It could save you a lot of trouble.







# Nature and Arts Club Features Enid Wolf-Schein at Monthly Breakfast

The director of the Wynmoor Short Film Festival, Enid Wolf-Schein, was the featured speaker at the Nature and Arts Club breakfast last month. A 30-year resident of Wynmoor, Wolf-Schein began making videos while working at the University of Pennsylvania. These videos were assessment tools to describe behaviors in autistic children, and as teaching tools for the children in their development of language and literacy. The result of some of those videos was the development of Behavior Rating Instruction for Autistic and Other Atypical Children (BRIAAC,) which was published and is used around the world.

After retiring and moving to Wynmoor, Wolf-Schein joined the Video Club and received help in making some videos she was working on, and her interest in short films continued and grew. When her son, Marcus Wolf, retired, he also became interested in film making and eventually moved to Wynmoor as well. Currently, the mother-son duo is busy making a series of instructional dance videos in conjunction with the Monday Social & Dance Club, and they can be seen on Wynmoor Community Television.

Wolf-Schein explained that a short film is defined as any film that runs for 40 minutes or less, including credits, and many have a much shorter run time. The Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences distinguishes films

between live-action, documentary and animated. There are over 12,000 film festivals worldwide each year, ranging from major industry events to small, local events. This is where Wynmoor's Short Film Festival comes in, and they held their 5th annual show on March 21st and 22nd. Ten films were shown, beginning with last year's favorite *A Senior Moment*, followed by a short comedy made in Wynmoor entitled *We're Not Ginger*. The program concluded with two of the previously mentioned instructional dance videos, complete with costumed demonstrations. As Wolf-Schein explained at the breakfast meeting, the film festival here has added new and interesting events each year, such as a ballroom reception with wine and popcorn and the opportunity to "strut the red carpet" in your festival finery. There is also an opportunity to participate in instructional line dances, adding to the fun!

The breakfast presentation concluded with the screening of several very short films made by members of the club, including Senior Moments, Wakodahatchee Birds, and Chip, featuring a well-fed and humorous chipmunk.





### Peace Management

e have all heard about stress management...but who just wants to manage stress? After all, what we focus on tends to persist. Instead, we can learn how to manage the amount of peace we experience in a day. By focusing on what we'd like more of (peace), we can begin to experience the results more quickly.

A negatively stressful life will rarely lead to a healthy body and mind. Even if you could be healthy while experiencing high levels of stress, you'd just be a healthy miserable person. However, someone who has peace of mind who knows who he or she is, takes life's problems as opportunities for growth, and works hard to have loving relationships will be more likely to enjoy their good health.

Emotions play an important role in health. All emotions you have affect some part of your body: skin, heart rate, joints, digestion, sleep patterns, etc. Every cell and system in the body changes with every emotion. This is called a *stress response*. Good stress (feeling good emotionally) rarely has an adverse effect on the body, but bad stress (feeling tense, afraid, worried, anxious, overwhelmed) certainly does.

Stress becomes negative when:

- We respond negatively to it (resistance)
- Our feelings and emotions are inappropriate (overreaction or self-blame)
- The response lasts an excessively long time

Feeling continuously overwhelmed and powerless can result in serious health problems, and some lesser but still problematic health issues such as insomnia, headaches, and digestive problems. In addition, feeling overwhelmed can lead to difficulty with relationships, poor decision making,

and lack of concentration.

So, how do we find the peace we are seeking? How do we restore balance in our lives and return to self-confidence, happiness and physical health? The first step is to eliminate any stored stress and tension we may be carrying from the past. Unaddressed emotions and faulty negative thinking build up as stored energy in the body. Toxic emotions, beliefs and thoughts lead to a toxic body. We need to "throw these out." Try these simple techniques to release this unwanted toxicity:

- Beat up a pillow
- Yell in the car (when you're alone!)
- Run, jog or walk briskly
- Practice Quantum Light Breath or any form of deep breath work
- Shake it out





### Leading The Way In Emergency Medicine

On January 8, 2025, Broward Sheriff Fire Rescue responded to an emergency at a home where an elderly woman was found unconscious. Upon arrival, firefighter/paramedics assessed her condition and determined she was suffering from dangerously low blood pressure and shock due to internal bleeding. Recognizing the urgency, the team made a critical, life-saving decision to administer whole blood on-site.

BSO is revolutionizing pre-hospital trauma care with its groundbreaking Whole Blood Program, reinforcing its commitment to providing the highest level of emergency medical services. As the first organization in Florida – and one of few nationwide – to administer whole blood transfusions, BSO is leading the way in this critical intervention.

Whole blood – a complete blood product containing unseparated platelets, packed red blood cells and plasma – has revolutionized trauma care. Previous standard practice was to administer saline to patients suffering from blood loss. While saline can aid in hydration, it lacks the oxygen-carrying red blood cells and clotting factors necessary to stop bleeding. Though saline buys time, it does not address the core issues: hemorrhaging and loss of oxygen to the brain. Whole blood, however, provides both, which significantly



improves a trauma patient's chance of survival. BSO's Whole Blood Program eliminates dangerous delays in treatment by delivering this essential resource at the scene of an emergency or during transport. Since the program's launch in early 2020, whole blood has been administered to over 262 patients, resulting in an impressive 81% survival rate

As the first program of its kind in Florida, the BSO Whole Blood Program serves as a model for organizations nationwide seeking to enhance pre-hospital trauma protocol. Its success underscores the importance of bringing advanced medical interventions directly to the scene of an emergency. The BSO Department of Fire Rescue and Emergency

Services is actively pursuing the expansion of this life-saving technique throughout Broward County, ensuring more critically injured patients have access to immediate care.



Recently, I visited the NSU Fort Lauderdale Art Museum and I appreciated fine Contemporary Works of Art produced by female artists in two fascinating temporary exhibits. I saw very inventive works of Art by Vanessa German and Rose B. Simpson in the "Rose B. Simpson and Vanessa German, It Includes Everyone, Everywhere, Always" Exhibit. This exhibit ends on April 13, 2025. Vanessa German is an Afro-American Female Artist. According to Ariella Wolens Bryant-Taylor Curator at the NSU Fort Lauderdale Art Museum, Vanessa German addresses Structural Racism, Heteropatriarchy, and the persisting reverberations of resource extraction in a post-colonial world. Nevertheless, I appreciated Vanessa German's very inventive "Bird" made of wood, foam, black pigment, gold metallic paint, plaster, gauze, glass bottles and other things. I also liked Vanessa German's other mixed media creations such as; "Pure Lard Three," "Heart Overhaul," and "Blue Boys Blues."

Rose B. Simpson is a Native American Female Artist who resides in the Santa Clara Pueblo in New Mexico. Rose B. Simpson integrates ancestral pottery traditions with metalwork and automotive design. I was captivated by Rose B. Simpson's "Conjure Two" made of clay, grout, and New Mexico

Pine Wood, as well as her "Root One" creation. Even though, I respect both of these Contemporary Artists, the curatorial work at this exhibit was quite discombobulating.


As for the temporary "Jacqueline de Jong: Vicious Circles" Exhibit which ends on May 4, 2025, I saw fine paintings by this Contemporary Dutch Artist who recently passed away. I especially relished Jacqueline de Jong's "Billiards," "Playboy#1," and "Refugee Camp." Some of the paintings on display depicted the Russian invasion of Ukraine. Jacqueline de Jong was greatly influenced by the COBRA Art of Asger Jorn. Jacqueline de Jong, like Asger Jorn was associated with the Situationalist Movement in Holland.

### ASK DR. JOY

Do you have a comfort zone? Do you live in it? Is it a physical one, a mental one, an intellectual one, an emotional one, a spiritual one? I'd like to imagine this article being interactive and while you're reading it you are answering these questions. I would love for us to have a dialogue about this subject but since we can't do that I'll just ramble on with some observations and suggestions.

The 2.5 hours a week went so fast and my excitement level soared. I felt completely alive and completely engaged. And the fun

level was off the charts. I was definitely out of my comfort zone since I had never done anything artistic in that way before. While washing up after class one day one of the students asked me how old I felt just then. I said about 5. So did she. We are kids again just enjoying being alive with a purpose that was nothing but pleasure. My friend, Carolyn, holds classes for wannabe artists. I have yet to attend due to some physical issues right now but I am looking forward to participating very soon.

I do a lot of things and most of them I do well because I'm doing things I feel confident about but there was no greater excitement than doing something I hadn't done before and didn't care about the outcome. Now in all honesty I won't step too far out of my zone in a physical sense. I might try car racing but I could sit down for that. In fact, I attended a class called Ageless Grace. It's exercise to rousing music and although it's done in a chair, I still manage to look like a spaz. How about thinking of something new to try for yourself. See if it adds a more youthful zing to your outlook. There are certainly enough classes in Wynmoor to try your hand at something you never thought to do before. I'm rooting for you.

In an older article I once described retirement as coming in three different types. There are probably more, but these are the prevailing ones. Briefly they are: The one where you are so happy to be retired that you fill your bucket list and do everything you didn't have time for before. The one where you do the same things you did when you were getting paid for it but now you don't get paid and do it all on a voluntary basis. The one where you sit down and turn off. Maybe you read some, maybe watch some TV, do crosswords, play computer games, etc. Hopefully you're happy. If you're not this will diminish the life force faster than anything else. It becomes a quicksand trap. I remember quite a while back I had a bad cold and cough. It was the second time in a month and I decided I would stay in my comfy bed with the TV remote, my tablet and a book. This morning, I wanted to go to a meeting at 10 so I dragged myself up and into the shower and went. I'm so glad I turned my button back on. It may take an act of determination to get started but I know you will feel so much better when you do.

I mentioned that I'm having some physical issues that are keeping me from doing some of the things I like. I decided that if it was at all possible, I would get up, get dressed and meet friends for breakfast. It's a push but an important one. It is certainly not comfortable physically but it keeps me mentally in good shape. I give myself kudos for whatever attempt I make and double kudos when those attempts are successful. You can do the same and even better. Raise your happy vibes and keep going. Open the door to a new zone. You won't be sorry.



# Florida Law for Pedestrians and Bicyclists

If you are a pedestrian or a bicyclist and you are injured by a car, there is important information you need to know. If you own a car, your car insurance PIP (no fault) coverage will be your primary medical insurance for hospital and doctor bills. Just as you would do if you were injured driving your car, you should contact your car insurance immediately to report the accident and get a claim number for your PIP coverage. You should also obtain the driver exchange information to get the information on the driver of the vehicle that hit you, including their insurance company. Any injury claim that you have will first be against that driver's bodily injury liability coverage. If you do not own a car, the driver's PIP



Since Florida does not require bodily injury liability coverage, it is possible that the driver will only have the basic PIP, which will not help you. Therefore, it is very important that you also have uninsured motorist coverage for your vehicle so that you can still obtain a settlement for your injuries. I recommend at least \$100,000 per person for uninsured motorist coverage. If you have more than one vehicle, I recommend stacking. Please see other articles that I have written for further details.

It is possible that the other insurance company may find you at least partially at fault if you disobeyed the rules of the road. For example, while you have the right of way as a pedestrian on a marked crosswalk, you must yield the right of way to all vehicles if you are not using a marked crosswalk.



If there is a sidewalk on the street, you have to use it. If there is no sidewalk, you have to walk on the road facing traffic. If you are a bicyclist, however, you need to be going in the direction of traffic, in a bike lane if available. Even if you are disobeying the rules of the road, you may still be successful in getting at least some settlement for your pain and suffering, over and above the medical bills. Florida has the law of comparative negligence. If a jury were to decide the case, your total damages would be reduced by the percentage that you were found to be at fault. For example, if the jury finds that your total damages are \$100,000, but you were 70% at fault, then you would still receive a net verdict of \$30,000.

If you are at all injured, it is important

that you allow an ambulance to take you to an emergency room for immediate treatment. This is very important, not only to be sure that you are okay but also to preserve your rights under Florida's PIP laws.

For more information, you should be sure to consult with a personal injury attorney as soon as possible after the accident.



# Qualifying for the Limited-Income Senior Exemption – Does Your Social Security Count?

To qualify for the 2025 Limited-Income Senior Exemption, an applicant must be at least 65 years old as of January 1, 2025, and have a combined household adjusted gross income not exceeding \$37,694 for 2024. Many seniors believe they do not qualify for this exemption because their social security payments exceed this amount; **however**, applicants who file income taxes should look at their adjusted gross income amount (*line 11 on the IRS 1040 form*) to see if they do qualify for this additional savings. If you are not required to file an income tax return based on your age and income, you would qualify for this exemption. Please visit our website to apply for the additional Limited-Income Senior Exemption.

If you are already receiving the Senior Exemption and have not moved to a new home, your exemption will automatically renew for the 2025 tax year unless you notify our office that you have exceeded the income threshold for the current year.

#### BCPA's Tax Estimator - An Online Tool to Help You Plan for Your New Home

While the Property Appraiser's Office does not set or collect taxes, we know the importance of understanding what the property taxes will be on a new home. Before purchasing your new home, you can use our online Tax Estimator to estimate what the property taxes will be using your purchase price and the current tax rates available. It is important to understand that this tool is simply an estimate and does not include any non-ad valorem (city) fees associated with the property. The non-ad valorem fees are shown on the property's previous tax bill or TRIM Notice also available online.

If you currently own a home with Homestead Exemption, our Portability Estimator will help you estimate the taxes on a new home using any portability you may have on your current home.

# HISTORIC MOMENTS

# 250th Anniversary Battles of Lexington and Concord

April 19th, 2025 marks the 250th anniversary of the start of the American Revolutionary War, at Lexington, Massachusetts, when the British fired upon the colonial militia standing on Lexington green, killing seven, and mortally wounding another.

Mark your calendar! Two years earlier, in 1773, the British, hoping to get the colonists to accept taxation, shipped huge amounts of tea to the American colonial ports, setting the price low, but including the hated tax. Never unloaded in any of the ports, most of the tea was returned to England. However, when Massachusetts Governor Hutchinson refused to let the tea ships depart for England, the Sons of Liberty took other measures. On December 16, 1773, disguised as Native Americans, they boarded the tea ships and dumped the hundreds of tea chests overboard, into Boston Harbor. Britain responded in 1774 with the Intolerable Acts, which ended local self-government in Massachusetts and closed the port of Boston to commerce. Boston was treated like a captured enemy city, with General Thomas Gage and his 3,000 troops, the army of occupation. In London, it was said by some advocates of reconciliation, that in the end, a small island nation could not hope to control a vast continent. In November, Gage, realizing the poor tactical situation of his small force, asked his superiors for an additional 20,000 troops. At that time, the total number of troops in all of Britain was 12,000.

In April 1775, hoping to prevent violence, Gage orders the seizure of weapons and gun powder stored at Concord, 20 miles northwest of Boston. The patriots, learning of Gage's plan, raise the alarm throughout the countryside. "The British are coming." Church bells peal, guns are fired, cymbals crash. Paul Revere and William Dawes ride through the nearby towns on the way to Lexington, warning the militias. Two lanterns glow from the old North Church steeple. "One if by land, two if by sea" was the prearranged signal, warning that the British would row across Boston Harbor to Cambridge instead of marching across the Neck to Charlestown, on the way to Lexington. The Minute Men and militias pick up their weapons and head for the town greens.

Captured by a British patrol on the way to Concord from Lexington, Paul Revere informs the British they have been found out. "I know what you are after, and have alarmed the country all the way up."

Marching into Lexington around 5:00 a.m., the British find a militia company of more than 70 men, led by Captain John Parker, at the town green. Seeing the British, Parker famously said: "Stand your ground. Don't fire unless fired upon. But if they want to have a war let it begin here." The two forces confront each other. Someone fires a shot. It is unknown who. The nervous British troops fire a volley into the colonial militia formation, killing seven and mortally wounding another. The militia scatter; the British march on to Concord, leaving death in their wake.

In Concord, around 8:00 a.m., the British secure the north Bridge over the

Concord River, and then proceed another mile to the Barrett farm, where the weapons were supposedly stored. However, Minutemen, arriving in numbers from the nearby towns now outnumber the British about two to one. The British fire a volley; the Minutemen fire back, "The shot heard round the world," killing three British soldiers and wounding nine. As more and more colonial militia arrive, the British have no choice but to begin a twelve-hour, disastrous retreat to Boston. The British force must travel for twenty miles over a stoney, hilly terrain, dotted with trees and stone hedges which the colonial militias use for cover, while firing on them with deadly accuracy. Afterwards, British Brigadier General Hugh Percy said: "Whoever looks upon them as an irregular mob, will find himself very much mistaken. They have men amongst them who know very well what they are about". General Heath, and other New England militia leaders were experienced in this type of warfare. They form a ring of skirmishers around Percy's retreating forces and inflict heavy losses upon them, all the way back to Charlestown, where British warships can come to their aid.

The British losses were heavy. The British lost seventy-three killed, one hundred and seventy-four wounded and twenty-six missing. Of these eighteen were officers, ten sergeants, two drummers and two hundred and forty were rank and file.

On the Continental side the losses were far fewer: Total number killed, 49; wounded; 42, missing, 5; total loss, 96.


In twenty-four hours, from all over the northeast, some 15,000 militia arrive. They gather into a military force dwarfing Gage's 3,000 British troops. The colonials remain at Cambridge, beginning a long siege of Boston. The American Revolutionary War has begun.

Welcoming the stranger is a profound and pervasive theme within both Jewish and Christian traditions. This obligation is deeply rooted in the sacred texts, teachings, and historical experiences of these faiths. It transcends mere hospitality, encompassing a broader ethical and spiritual mandate to recognize the dignity and humanity of all individuals, regardless of their origins.

The Jewish obligation to welcome the stranger, or "ger," is firmly established in the Torah. One of the most frequently cited commandments is found in Leviticus 19:34: "The stranger who resides with you shall be to you as one of your citizens; you shall love him as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt." This verse underscores a collective memory of oppression and liberation, urging the Jewish people to extend compassion and justice to others.

Another significant passage is Deuteronomy 10:19: "You shall love the stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt." These commandments are not isolated directives but are reiterated multiple times throughout the Torah, highlighting their importance in Jewish ethical life.

The Talmud and other rabbinic writings expand on these biblical teachings, offering practical guidance on how to treat strangers. For instance, the Talmudic tractate Bava Metzia 59b emphasizes the importance of not oppressing or wronging the stranger, linking this ethical mandate to the broader principle of justice and righteousness.

Maimonides, a medieval Jewish philosopher and legal scholar, further elaborates on the treatment of strangers in his legal compendium, Mishneh Torah. He underscores the need for compassion and kindness, drawing on the biblical commandments to argue that Jewish law obligates the community to support and protect the vulnerable.

The Jewish historical experience of exile, diaspora, and persecution has profoundly shaped the communal ethos of welcoming the stranger. From the Babylonian exile to the expulsions from Spain and other European countries,

Jews have often found themselves as strangers in foreign lands. These experiences have reinforced the importance of empathy, solidarity, and the moral duty to aid those in similar situations.

The Christian obligation to welcome the stranger is rooted in the teachings of Jesus and the early Church. In the Gospel of Matthew 25:35-40, Jesus identifies himself with the stranger, the hungry, and the imprisoned, stating, "I was a stranger and you welcomed me." This passage is a cornerstone of Christian social ethics, emphasizing that acts of kindness and hospitality towards the marginalized are tantamount to serving Christ himself.

Another key text is Hebrews 13:2: "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares." This verse recalls the story of Abraham and Sarah in Genesis 18, who unknowingly hosted divine visitors, underscoring the spiritual significance of welcoming the stranger.

The early Christian community took these teachings to heart, developing a robust practice of hospitality. Acts 2:44-47 describes the early believers as sharing their possessions and providing for those in need, creating a model of communal support and care. This practice extended to welcoming travelers, refugees, and the poor, reflecting the inclusive ethos of the early Church.

Church fathers such as Augustine and Chrysostom wrote extensively on the importance of hospitality and care for the stranger, linking these practices to broader theological concepts of charity and love.

Throughout history, Christian communities have established institutions such as monasteries, hospitals, and shelters to provide refuge and support to strangers. The monastic tradition, in particular, emphasized the virtue of hospitality, with many monasteries offering sanctuary to travelers, pilgrims, and those in need.

In contemporary times, various Christian organizations and denominations continue to advocate for and support refugees, migrants, and other marginalized groups. Initiatives such as World Vision, Catholic Relief Services, and numerous local church programs exemplify the ongoing commitment to welcoming the stranger as a central tenet of Christian faith.

While the Jewish and Christian obligations to welcome the stranger are rooted in different religious texts and traditions, there are significant commonalities. Both faiths emphasize empathy, compassion, and the recognition of shared humanity. The historical experiences of displacement and persecution have further reinforced these ethical imperatives, creating a strong foundation for interfaith solidarity and cooperation.

However, there are also differences in interpretation and practice. Jewish teachings often link the obligation to welcome the stranger to the collective memory of the Exodus and the covenantal relationship with God. In contrast, Christian teachings focus on the example and teachings of Jesus, with an emphasis on charity and love as central theological virtues.

The obligation to welcome the stranger is a powerful and enduring theme in both Jewish and Christian traditions. It calls on adherents to extend compassion, justice, and hospitality to all individuals, reflecting the core values of these faiths. In a world marked by increasing displacement and marginalization, these teachings offer a vital ethical framework for addressing contemporary social challenges and fostering a more inclusive and compassionate society.




# Resident Car Wash Has A New Look






